# **Users Manual**

# Unlocking the doors

Press this control to unlock the driver's door. The interior lamps will illuminate.

Press the control a second time within three seconds to unlock all doors.



#### Locking the doors

Press this control to lock all doors.

To confirm doors are closed and locked, press this control a second time within three seconds. The door(s) will lock again, the horn will chirp once and the lamps will flash.

If any of the doors are open or ajar, the horn will make two quick chirps, reminding you to properly close the doors.



#### Sounding a panic alarm ■

Press this control to activate the

To deactivate the alarm, press the control again or turn the ignition to ACC or ON.

#### Replacing the battery


The remote entry transmitter uses one coin type three-volt lithium battery  ${\it CR2032}$  or equivalent.

To replace the battery:

1. Twist a thin coin between the two halves of the remote entry transmitter near the key ring. DO NOT TAKE THE RUBBER COVER AND CIRCUIT BOARD OFF THE FRONT HOUSING OF THE REMOTE ENTRY TRANSMITTER.



Do not wipe off any grease on the battery terminals on the back surface of the circuit board.



- Remove the old battery. Note: Please refer to local regulations when disposing of transmitter batteries.
- 4. Insert the new battery. Refer to the diagram inside the remote entry transmitter for the correct orientation of the battery. Press the battery down to ensure that the battery is fully seated in the battery housing cavity.
- 5. Snap the two halves back together.

**Note:** Replacement of the battery will **not** cause the remote transmitter to become deprogrammed from your vehicle. The remote transmitter should operate normally after battery replacement.
