Set Up Parent's Unit

 Plug one of the two AC adapters provided into the Parent's Unit charging stand, place Parent Unit in stand, and charge for 12 hours.

Note: You may use the Monitor while it is being charged. Once batteries are charged, unit can be used in portable mode (without the AC adapter).

Set Up Child's Unit

- Place the Child Unit near your child (within 6 feet, but well beyond child's reach).
- Plug in the second AC adapter provided, and turn the Child Unit on.


Use the Monitor

- Set both units to the same channel (both on "A" or both on "B").
- Turn the Parent Unit on and adjust the volume level.
- · Keep the Parent Unit with you as you go about your day.


To Use the Monitor in the Shower


- Wipe shower wall clean.



To Set Up



Child's Unit

Position the Child's Unit within approximately 6 feet of your child, yet out
of the child's reach.

To prevent heat build-up, place on an open surface away from heat sources; do not place in an enclosed space.

WARNING:

Do not place Child's Unit in crib or attach to crib.

2. Insert the AC adapter plug into the jack or the unit, then plug the adapter into an electrical outlet.

Parent's Unit

Charge the batteries:

Batteries must be fully charged for optimum performance.

- 1. Insert the AC adapter plug into the charging stand, then plug the adapter into an electrical outlet.
- 2. Place Parent's Unit in charging stand. The red charging light will come on indicating that the Parent's Unit has been correctly placed in the stand and is now charging.
- 3. Allow the batteries to charge for about 12 hours. The red charging light will shut off when the battery is fully charged.

Note: You can use the monitor while the Parer t Unit is being charged, or it can be charged with the unit off.

IMPORTANT: Parent unit may not charge if charging contacts are not clean (see "Troubleshooting").

CAUTION:

Always use the AC adapter(s) supplied with this product. Do not use any other adapter. Monitor could be damaged, and warranty could become void.


To Use Parent Unit in the Shower

- 1. Wipe shower wall clean.
- 2. Then apply suction cup to shower wall, out of the direct flow of water.
- 3. Hang Parent's Unit from its antenna on the shower hook.
- 4. Adjust volume to highest level.



Never charge parent unit in bathroom or other damp environment.

DO NOT USE AC ADAPTER IN SHOWER.


To Clean Both Units

Wipe exterior surfaces with a clean, dry cloth.

Note: If you frequently use the Parent Unit in the shower, we suggest wiping surface with a damp cloth or sponge using mild liquid soap. Wipe thoroughly with clear water. Air dry.

This unit is a water-resistant design and is not intended to be submerged. **DO NOT IMMERSE IN WATER.**

To Use Monitor



- 1. Turn Child Unit on.
- 2. Select channel "A" or "B" on the Child's Unit by sliding the channel switch.
- Then turn the Parent's Unit on. Set the Parent's Unit to the same channel as the Child's Unit by pressing either the "A" or "B" channel button. For the monitor to work properly, both units must be set to the same channel.
- Adjust the volume on the Parent's Unit to the desired level. Press "+" to increase the volume; press "-" to lower the volume. Sound lights will indicate volume level.
- Keep the Parent's Unit with you. You will be able to hear the sounds your child is making and see the foundness level of the sounds in your child's room.

Range: The range of the monitor will vary with the surroundings. You may want to test its workable range by walking through your house and yard and listening for the volume and clarity of the sounds being transmitted. If you travel too far with the monitor, you will hear a warning beep indicating you are out of range.


Changing Channels: Always keep both units set to the same channel (both on "A" or both on "B"). If you experience interference or static with one channel, switch to the other.



Here's how to interpret the sound lights:

No Lights • Baby is quiet (no sound from Child's Unit)

- 1 Green Light Quiet sounds (baby may be whimpering or talking)
- 2 Yellow Lights Moderate sounds
- 1 or 2 Red Lights Loud sounds (baby may be crying or talking loudly)

To Use Monitor (continued)

Recharging Batteries:

When the low battery/charging indicator light FLASHES, the batteries are getting low. It's best to begin recharging the unit immediately. To recharge, follow the steps in "To Set Up" Parent's Unit.

Replacing Batteries:

The rechargeable batteries need to be replaced when the battery unit will not hold a charge (low battery/charging indicator continues to flash after an extended period of time), or will hold a charge for only a brief period of time (less than one hour).

- 1. Open the battery door by unscrewing the three screws on the back of the Parent's Unit.
- 2. Use the pull-tab to release the old battery pack. Place the new battery pack in the compartment as shown.
- 3. Then place the battery leads inside the groove, otherwise the leads may be damaged when closing the cover.
- 4. Close the cover making sure it clicks into place. Replace the screws.



Keep all batteries away from children. DO NOT dispose of batteries in fire; they may explode.

To avoid battery leakage:

Always remove exhausted batteries from the product.

Never use a screwdriver or any other tool to pry batteries from compartment, as doing so may short circuit supply terminals.

IP CODES

IP codes signify the extent to which a product is protected against water or solid objects or dust getting through the exterior of the product and impact resistance affecting its performance. The IP ("Ingress Protection") codes are defined in IEC standard IEC 60529, which is identical to EN 60529 and BS EN 60529. The code is usually given in the form IPXXX. The first digit gives the protection provided against solid objects or dust and the second digit gives the protection against water and the third gives protection against mechanical impacts. There are six levels of protection against penetration by solid objects or dust, eight levels of protection a test is specified.

The monitor is designed to meet IP54X.

- 5 Protection against harmful dust deposits. Ingress: of dust is not totally prevented, but dust does not enter in sufficient quantity to interfere with operation of the equipment (dust protected). Full contact protection.
- 4 Water splashed against the enclosure from any direction shall have no harmful effect (spraying water).
