

Quick start guide

Telephone base and charger installation

Install the telephone base and charger as shown below.




note

- Use only the power adapter and battery supplied with this product. To order a replacement, visit our website at www.vtechphones.com or call 1 (800) 595-9511.
 In Canada, go to www.vtechcanada.com or call 1 (800) 267-7377.
- The power adapter is intended to be correctly oriented in a vertical or floor mount position. The prongs are not designed to hold the plug in place if it is plugged into a ceiling, under-the-table or cabinet outlet.

Battery installation

Install the battery as shown below.


1. Plug the battery connector securely into the socket.



Slide the battery compartment cover towards the center of the handset until it clicks into place.



Place the battery with the label THIS SIDE UP facing up and the wires inside the battery compartment.





note

If the handset will not be used for a long time, disconnect and remove the battery to prevent possible leakage.

Battery charging

Once you have installed the battery, the screen indicates the battery status (see the table below). For best performance, keep the handset in the telephone base or charger when not in use. The battery is fully charged after 10 hours of continuous charging. Refer to the online user's manual for battery operating times.

Battery indicators	Battery status	Action
The screen is blank, or shows PLACE IN CHARGER and [] flashes.	The battery has no charge or very little charge. The handset cannot be used.	Charge without interruption (at least 30 minutes).
The screen shows LOW BATTERY and [] flashes.	The battery has enough charge to be used for a short time.	Charge without interruption (at least 30 minutes).
The screen shows HANDSET X.	The battery is charged.	To keep the battery charged, place it in the telephone base or charger when not in use.



If you place the handset in the telephone base or charger without plugging in the battery, the screen displays **NO BATTERY**.

Tabletop to wall mount installation


The telephone comes ready for tabletop use. Follow the steps below to mount your telephone on a wall.

 Plug one end of the telephone line cord into the TEL LINE jack at the bottom of the telephone base and the base power adapter into the POWER jack.



 Route the telephone line cord through the hole on the wall mount bracket and plug it into the telephone wall jack. Route the power cord out of the telephone base and plug it into an electrical outlet not controlled by a wall switch.

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4. Align the holes on the bracket with the standard wall plate and slide the bracket down until it locks securely. Bundle the telephone line cord and power adapter cord neatly with twist ties.



Handset overview

CHARGE light

On when the handset is charging.

VOLUME/^/©

Review the directory when the phone is not in use.

Increase the listening volume during a call or message playback.

Scroll up while in a menu, or in the directory, caller ID log or redial list.

Move the cursor to the right when entering numbers or names.

(P)/CELL

Make or answer a cell call.

Answer an incoming call when you hear a call waiting alert.

Flashes quickly when there is an incoming cell call.

Flashes slowly when a cell call is on hold.

1 HOME/FLASH

Make or answer a call.

Answer another incoming call during a call.

<u>1/Y</u>

Press repeatedly to add or remove 1 in front of the caller ID log entry before dialing or saving it to the directory.

<u>Press and hold</u> for Voicemail speed dial.

Xtone

Switch to tone dialing temporarily during a call.

(speakerphone)

Make or answer a call using the handset speakerphone.

During a call, press to switch between the speakerphone and the handset.

VOLUME/~/CID

Review the caller ID log when the phone is not in use.

Decrease the listening volume during a call or message playback.

Scroll down while in a menu, or in the directory, caller ID log or redial list.

Move the cursor to the left when entering numbers or names.

MENU/SELECT

Show the menu.

While in a menu, press to select an item, or save an entry or setting.

OFF/CANCEL

Hang up a call.

Silence the ringer temporarily while the handset is ringing.

<u>Press and hold</u> to erase the missed call indicator while the phone is not in use.

Press to return to the previous menu, or <u>press and hold</u> to return to idle mode, without making changes.

Dialing keys

Enter numbers or characters.

(pound key)

Press repeatedly to show other dialing options when reviewing a caller ID log entry.

MUTE/DELETE

Mute the microphone during a call. Delete digits or characters while using the dialling keys.

Silence the ringer temporarily while the handset is ringing.

Delete the displayed entry while in the directory, caller ID log or redial list.

REDIAL/PAUSE

Press repeatedly to review the redial list. <u>Press and hold</u> to insert a dialing pause while entering numbers.






Using the handset menu

- Press MENU when the phone is not in use.
- Press ✓ or ˆ until the screen displays the desired feature menu.
- 3. Press SELECT to enter that menu.
- To return to the previous menu, press CANCEL.
- To return to idle mode, press and hold CANCEL.

Bluetooth

To use a Bluetooth enabled cell phone with your **DS6521**, you must first pair and connect your Bluetooth device(s) with the telephone base. All **DS6521** handsets can be used to make or answer calls on the cell phone line.

Bluetooth wireless technology operates within a short range (a maximum of approximately 30 feet). When you pair a Bluetooth cell phone or Bluetooth headset to the telephone base, make sure your Bluetooth device is close to the telephone base to maintain sufficient signal strength.



Pair and connect your first Bluetooth cell phone

- 1. Press and hold \$ 1/\$ 2 on the telephone base for four seconds. The \$ 1/\$ 2 light turns on.
- Turn on the Bluetooth feature of your cell phone. Once your cell phone finds your VTech phone, press the appropriate key on your cell phone to continue the pairing process.
- 3. Enter the PIN of the telephone base into your cell phone. The PIN number is 0000.

Download directory

- Press MENU when the phone is not in use.
- Scroll to ◆Bluetooth then press SELECT.
- 3. Scroll to **♦Download dir** then press **SELECT**.
- 4. Scroll to select the desired cell phone, then press SELECT.

The following are some of the telephone features you may wish to set. Refer to **Telephone settings** in the online user's manual for detailed instructions on setting all telephone features.

Ringer volume (handset)

You can adjust the ringer volume level, or turn the ringer off.

- 1. Press MENU when the handset is not in use.
- Scroll to \$Ringers then press SELECT.
- Scroll to choose the desire line, then press SELECT.
- Press ✓ or ˆ to adjust the volume, then press SELECT to save.



 If the handset ringer volume is set to off, that handset is silenced for all incoming calls except paging tone.

Silent mode

You can turn on the silent mode for a period of time. During the silent mode, the handset ringer tone is off and the answering system turns on automatically.

- 1. Press and hold # when the handset is not in use.
- 2. Use the dialing keys (1-9) to enter the hour of silent mode.

Set date and time

If you subscribe to caller ID service, the day, month and time are set automatically with each incoming call. You can also set the date and time manually.

- 1. Press MENU when the handset is not in use.
- Scroll to select \$Set date/time, then press SELECT.
- 3. Use the dialing keys (0-9) to enter the month, date and year, then press SELECT.
- 4. Use the dialing keys (0-9) to enter the hour and minute.
- Press ~ or ^ to choose AM or PM, or press 2 for AM or 7 for PM. Press SELECT to save.

Voicemail indicators

If you subscribe to voicemail service offered by your telephone service provider, **NEW VOICEMAIL** and appear on the handset when you have new voicemail messages. Contact your telephone service provider for more information and assistance about using your voicemail service. Refer to **Clear voicemail indicators** in the online user's manual on how to clear the voicemail indicators.

Telephone operation

Make a call

- Press A/HOME or ■, and then dial the telephone number.
- Press (*)/CELL, enter the telephone number and then press SELECT.

Answer a call

Press [♠]/HOME, [♠]/CELL, ■ or any dialing key.

End a call

Press OFF or put the handset to the telephone base or charger.

Speakerphone

During a call, press ■ to switch between speakerphone and normal handset use.

Volume

During a call, press **VOLUME** or **NOLUME** to adjust the listening volume.

note

The handset earpiece volume setting and speakerphone volume setting are independent.

Mute

The mute function allows you to hear the other party but the other party cannot hear you.

- During a call, press MUTE. The handset displays Muted.
- 2. Press MUTE again to resume the conversation.

Call waiting

When you subscribe to call waiting service from your telephone service provider, you hear an alert tone if there is an incoming call while you are on another call.

- Press FLASH to put the current call on hold and take the new call.
- Press FLASH at any time to switch back and forth between calls.

Temporary ringer silencing

When the telephone is ringing, you can temporarily silence the ringer of the handset without disconnecting the call. The next call rings normally at the preset volume.

 To silence the handset ringer, press OFF or MUTE on the handset. RINGER MUTED display.

Temporary tone dialing

If you have pulse (rotary) service only, you can switch from pulse to tone dialing temporarily during a call.

- During a call, press ★ tone .
- 2. Use the dialing keys to enter the relevant number. The telephone sends touchtone signals.
- 3. The telephone automatically returns to pulse dialing mode after you end the call.

Find handset

Use this feature to find all system handsets.

To start paging:

 Press #/FIND HANDSET on the telephone base once and then release. All idle handsets ring and their screens show
 ** PAGING **.

To end paging:

- Press I/FIND HANDSET again on the telephone base once and then release.
- Press [®]/HOME, ⁽ⁿ⁾/CELL, or any dialing key on the handset.
- Place the handset in the telephone base or charger.



Do not <u>press and hold</u> **I/FIND HANDSET** for more than four seconds. It may lead to handset deregistration.

Redial list

Each handset stores the last 10 telephone numbers dialed.

To review and dial a number from the redial list:

- 1. Press **REDIAL** when the handset is not in use.
- 2. Press ✓, ♠, or REDIAL repeatedly until the desired entry displays.
- 3. Press A/HOME or ()/CELL to dial.

To delete a redial entry:

When the desired redial entry displays, press DELETE.

Chain dialing

Use this feature to initiate a dialing sequence from numbers stored in the directory, caller ID log or redial list while you are on a call. Chain dialing can be useful if you wish to access other numbers (such as bank account numbers or access codes) from the directory, caller ID log or redial list.

To access a number in the directory, caller ID log or redial list while on a call:

 To enter the directory, press MENU, then scroll to ◆Directory, and then press SELECT.

-OR-

To enter the caller ID log, press **MENU**, then scroll to **\$Caller ID log**, and then press **SELECT**.

-OR-

To enter the redial list, press REDIAL.

- 2. Press vor to scroll to the desired entry.
- 3. Press **SELECT** to dial the displayed number.

Join a call in progress

You can use up to four system handsets at a time on an outside call. You can buy additional expansion handsets (**DS6501**) for this telephone base. You can register up to five handsets to the telephone base.

- When a handset is on a call, press AHOME, (♠)/CELL, or any dialing key on another handset to join the call.
- · Press OFF to exit the call. The call continues until all handsets hang up.

Intercom

Use the intercom features for conversations between two handsets.

- 1. Press MENU on your handset when not in use.
- 2. Press ✓ or ˆ to scroll to ♦Intercom, then press SELECT. When you have three or more handsets, use the dialing keys to enter a destination handset number.
- 3. To answer the intercom call, press **A/HOME** or on the destination handset.
- 4. To end an intercom call, press **OFF** or place the handset back in the telephone base or charger.

Answer an incoming call during an intercom call

If you receive an incoming home call during an intercom call, there is an alert tone.

- To answer the outside call, press A/HOME. The intercom call ends automatically.
- To end the intercom call without answering the outside call, press **OFF**. The intercom call ends and the telephone continues to ring.

Call transfer using intercom

Use the intercom feature to transfer an outside call to another system handset.

- 1. During a call, press MENU.
- Press

 or

 or

 to scroll to

 fintercom, then press SELECT. When you have three or more handsets, use the dialing keys to enter a destination handset number.
- 3. To answer the intercom call, press **A/HOME** or on the destination handset. The outside call is now on hold and both handsets show **INTERCOM**. You can have a private conversation with the destination handset.
- 4. From this intercom call, you have the following options:
 - You can let the destination handset join you on the incoming home call in a three-way conversation. Press A/HOME on the original handset.
 - You can transfer the call. Press OFF, or place your handset back in the telephone base or charger. The destination handset then automatically connects to the outside call.
 - The destination handset can end the intercom call by pressing OFF, or by
 placing the handset back in the telephone base or charger. The outside call
 continues with the original system handset.

Directory

The directory can store up to 200 entries and are shared by all system handsets.

To add a directory entry:

- 1. Press MENU when the handset is not in use.
- 2. Scroll to **Directory** then press **SELECT**.
- 3. Scroll to **♦Add contact** then press **SELECT**.
 - Use the dialing keys to enter the number (up to 30 digits).
 -OR-
 - Copy a number from the redial list by pressing REDIAL and then press
 or REDIAL repeatedly to select a number. Press SELECT.
- 3. Press **SELECT** to move to the name.
- 4. Use the dialing keys to enter the name (up to 15 characters). Additional key presses show other characters of that particular key.
- 5. Press **SELECT** to save.

While entering names and numbers, you can:

- · Press **DELETE** to backspace and erase a digit or character.
- Press and hold DELETE to erase the entire entry.
- Press and hold PAUSE to insert a dialing pause (for entering phone numbers only).
- Press
 or
 to move the cursor to the left or right.

To review and dial from the directory:

Entries are sorted alphabetically.

- Press when the handset is not in use.
- Scroll to browse through the directory, or use the dialing keys to start a name search.
- 3. When the desired entry appears, press A/HOME or ()/CELL to dial.

To edit a directory entry:

- When the desired entry displays, press SELECT.
- Use the dialing keys to edit the number, then press SELECT.
- Use the dialing keys to edit the name, then press SELECT to save.

To delete a directory entry:

- 1. When the desired entry displays, press **DELETE**.
- 2. When the screen displays **DELETE CONTACT?**, press **SELECT**.

Speed dial

You can copy up to 9 directory entries into the speed dial locations so that you can dial these numbers using fewer keys than usual.

To store a speed dial entry:

- 1. Press MENU when the handset is not in use.
- Scroll to Directory then press SELECT.
- 3. Scroll to **\$Speed dial**, then press **SELECT**.
- 4. Scroll to a desired speed dial location, then press SELECT.
- 5. Scroll to a desired directory entry, then press **SELECT** to save.

To dial a speed dial entry:

- Press and hold a dialing key (0-9, except 1) to display the desired speed dial entry when the handset is not in use.
- Press A/HOME, or P/CELL to dial the displayed phone number.

To delete a speed dial entry:

When the desired entry displays, press **DELETE**.

Caller ID

This product supports caller ID services provided by most telephone service providers. Depending on your service subscription, you may see the caller's name, number, date and time of calls that are sent by your telephone service provider after the first or second ring.

Caller ID log

The caller ID log stores up to 50 entries. If you answer a call before the caller information appears, it will not be saved in the caller ID log.

- The handset displays XX missed calls when there are calls that have not been reviewed in the caller ID log.
- If you want to erase the missed call indicator, <u>press and hold</u> CANCEL on the idle handset.

To review and dial a number in the caller ID log:

- 1. Press CID when the handset is not in use.
- 2. Scroll to browse through the caller ID log. When the desired entry appears:
 - Press # (pound key) repeatedly to show different dialing options.
 - Press 1 repeatedly if you need to add or remove 1 in front of the phone number.
- 3. Press **A/HOME**, **I** or **(•)/CELL** to dial the displayed number.

To save a caller ID log entry to the directory:

- 1. When the desired caller ID log entry displays, press SELECT.
- Use the dialing keys to modify the number, then press SELECT.
- 3. Use the dialing keys to modify the name, then press **SELECT** to save.

To delete one caller ID log entry:

When the desired caller ID log entry displays, press DELETE.

To delete all caller ID log entries:

Press MENU when the handset is not in use. Scroll to \$Caller ID log and then
press SELECT. Scroll to \$Del all calls and then press SELECT twice.

About the answering system

The answering system can record up to 99 messages, depending on the length of each message. The total recording time is approximately 14 minutes.

Answering system settings

Default settings are indicated by asterisks (*).

Screen display	Function	Options
Call screening	Set whether you hear the callers while they are leaving messages to you.	On* Off
# of rings	Set the number of times the telephone rings before the answering system answers.	6; 5; 4; 3*; 2; Toll Saver
Remote code	Set a two-digit security code to access the answering system remotely from any touch-tone telephone.	19*
Msg alert tone	Set to alert you when you have new messages.	On Off*
Recording time	Set the recording time for each incoming message.	3 Minutes* 2 Minutes 1 Minute

Number of rings

You can set the answering system to answer an incoming call after 2, 3, 4, 5 or 6 rings; or toll saver. If you choose toll saver, the answering system answers a call after 2 rings when you have new messages, or after 4 rings when you have no new messages.

- 1. Press MENU when the handset is not in use.
- 2. Scroll to \$Answering sys then press SELECT.
- 3. Scroll to **♦Ans sys setup** then press **SELECT**.
- 4. Scroll to **♦# OF RINGS** then press **SELECT**.
- 5. Press or to choose 6, 5, 4, 3, 2 or Toll Saver and then press SELECT.

Answering system operation

Turn the answering system on or off

The answering system must be turned on to answer and record messages.

 Press O/ANS ON/OFF on the telephone base to turn the built-in answering system on or off.

Record your own announcement with a handset

You can use the preset announcement to answer calls, or replace it with your own recorded announcement. It can be up to 90 seconds in length.

- 1. Press **MENU** when the handset is not in use.
- 2. Scroll to \$Answering Sys and then press SELECT twice.
- 3. The handset announces, "To play, press 2. To record, press 7." Press 7 to record.
- 4. The handset announces, "Record after the tone. Press 5 when you are done." After the tone, speak towards the handset microphone. Press 5 when done.
- The answering system automatically plays back the newly recorded announcement.
 Press 5 to stop the playback at any time; 2 to replay the recorded announcement;
 to delete the recorded announcement; or 7 to record again if desired.

Message playback at the telephone base

Press ▶/■/PLAY/stop when the phone is not in use.

Options during playback:

- Press VOL+ or VOL- to adjust the speaker volume.
- Press ►/SKIP to skip to the next message.
- Press */REPEAT to repeat the message currently playing. Press */REPEAT twice to listen to the previous message.
- Press X/DELETE to delete the playing message. The system advances to the next message.
- Press ►/■/PLAY/STOP to stop.

Delete all messages at the telephone base

Press X/DELETE twice when the phone is not in use.

Call screening at the telephone base

If the answering system and call screening are on, the announcement and the incoming message broadcast at the telephone base when a call is answered by the answering system.

Options while recording a message:

- Press ▲/VOL and ▼/VOL on the telephone base to adjust the call screening volume.
- Press ▶/■/PLAY/STOP to temporarily turn on or off call screening.
- Press **AVOL** to temporarily turn on call screening when it is set to off.

Call intercept

If you want to talk to the person whose message is being recorded, press ★/HOME, ■ or ♠/CELL on the handset.

Access the answering system remotely

- Dial your telephone number from any touch-tone telephone.
- When the system plays your announcement, enter the two-digit remote code. The preset code is 19.
- You can enter one of the following remote commands.

Command	Function
1	Play all messages.
2	Play new messages.
3	Delete a message (during playback).
33	Delete all old messages.
4	Repeat the current message (during playback).
5	Stop.
*5	Hear a list of remote commands.
6	Skip to the next message (during playback).
*7	Record an announcement.
8	End the call.
0	Turn the answering system on or off.

Add and register a handset

The handsets provided with your telephone system are already registered. Each handset is assigned a number that displays on the handset. Additional handsets registered to the telephone system are assigned numbers in the sequential order. This telephone system accommodates up to 2 handsets.

You can add new handsets (**DS6501**, purchased separately) to your telephone system. Each handset must be registered with the telephone base before use. When first purchased and properly charged, each expansion handset shows **To register HS...** and **...see manual** alternately. Charge the handset before registering it to the telephone base.

To register a handset:

- 1. Place the non-registered handset in the telephone base.
- On the telephone base, <u>press and hold</u> /FIND HANDSET for about four seconds until the IN USE light turns on.
- 3. On the handset, press # (pound key) then the handset shows **Registering...**Then the handset shows **Registered** and you hear a beep when the registration process completes. The registration process takes about 60 seconds to complete.

Replace a handset

If you want to replace a handset or reassign the designated handset number of a registered handset, you must deregister all handsets and then individually register each handset.

To deregister all handsets:

- 1. Press and hold I/FIND HANDSET on the telephone base for about 10 seconds until the IN USE light on the telephone base turns on and starts flashing.
- All handsets show To register HS... and ...see manual alternately when the deregistration process completes. The deregistration process takes about 10 seconds to complete.

I cannot add my cell phone to the telephone base.

- Make sure you have cellular coverage.
- Make sure your cell phone is compatible with your DS6521. Check the Bluetooth compatibility list at www.vtechphones.com.
- Make sure the Bluetooth function of your cell phone is turned on. See the user's manual of your cell phone for more information.
- Remove VTech DS6521 from your cell phone's handsfree device history list (see the user's manual of your cell phone for more information).
- Carefully follow the pairing instructions on page 17 and make sure that your cell phone is not connected to any other Bluetooth device.
- · Turn off your cell phone, then turn it on again.
- Reset the telephone base. Unplug the unit's electrical power. Wait for approximately 15 seconds, then plug it back in. Repeat the above suggestions.

I cannot connect my cell phone with the telephone base.

- Make sure that the Bluetooth function of your cell phone is turned on. See the user's manual
 of your cell phone for more information.
- Make sure that your Bluetooth cell phone is not connected to any other Bluetooth device.
- Turn off your cell phone, then turn it on again.
- · Make sure that your cell phone is connected and active on the device list.
- For some cell phones, you must authorize VTech DS6521 device in your cell phone's Bluetooth feature. See the user's manual of your cell phone for more information.
- Manually connect your cell phone to VTech DS6521. Refer to the user's manual of your cell phone for more information.

I cannot find VTech DS6521 on my cell phone.

- Make sure that the telephone base is in discoverable mode. Carefully follow the setup instructions on page 4.
- · Make sure that you manually set your cell phone to search for devices.
- Remove VTech DS6521 from your cell phone's handsfree device history list (see the user's manual of your cell phone).
- Turn off your cell phone, then turn it on again.
- Reset the telephone base. Unplug the unit's electrical power. Wait for approximately 15 seconds, then plug it back in. Repeat the above suggestions.

I don't know how to search for or add new devices on my cell phone.

- Most cell phones have the Bluetooth feature in the connection or setup menus. Please refer
 to the user's manual of your cell phone.
- In general, press the menu key on your cell phone, then look for the Bluetooth menu in the settings or connection menu. In the Bluetooth menu, select the option to search for or add new devices.

My cell phone disconnects with the telephone base.

- · Turn off your cell phone, then turn it on again.
- · Make sure that you are not using your cell phone when on a cell call.

My cell phone is connected to the telephone base, but I cannot make a cell call.

- Make sure that your cell phone is not in use when you are trying to make a cell call.
- For some smartphones, make sure that the cellular function is turned on.

Bluetooth system busy appears on the display.

- · Make sure that your cell phone is not in use when connected and active on the device list.
- · Make sure that your cell phone or headset is not connected to any other Bluetooth device.
- DS6521 can only use one Bluetooth device at a time.

The PIN on the telephone base does not work.

- The default PIN is 0000.
- If you have changed the PIN, it will appear on the handset in the pairing process.

I cannot hear any audio on my telephone system when on a cell call.

- Reset the telephone base. Unplug the unit's electrical power. Wait for approximately 15 seconds, then plug it back in.
- Turn off your cell phone, then turn it on again.

I cannot download contacts from my cell phone to the DS6521.

- Make sure that your cell phone is paired and connected to the base.
- Make sure you place your cell phone next to the base while downloading.
- If your cell phone does not support the download, you can send the directory from your cell
 phone. The system can receive the directory automatically.

I see duplicate entries in my downloaded directory

 If you see duplicate directory entries, you can delete them manually. Another option is to download again either your SIM card or phone memory, but not both.

Some of my cell phone contacts were not imported to the DS6521.

 Make sure to try transferring the contacts from your SIM card to your phone memory first, then download from your phone memory. If that doesn't work, try transferring the contacts from your phone memory to your SIM card, then download from your SIM card. For more information on how to transfer contacts between your SIM card and your phone memory, refer to the user's manual of your cell phone.

Can the DS6521 help the poor cell phone reception in my house?

If your cell phone has poor reception in your home, the DS6521 cannot improve the
reception. However, if there is a location in your house with better reception, you can leave
your cell phone at that location while you use DS6521 cell line. In order for this to work, the
telephone base must be within 30 feet of the cell phone.

The listening volume of my cell call is too loud or quiet.

 During a cell call, if the listening volume is to too loud or quiet, try changing the volume on your cell phone. On some cell phones, changing the volume on the cell phone effects your cell call volume on the DS6521 handset.

My telephone does not work at all.

- Make sure the battery is installed and charged correctly. For optimum daily performance, return the handset to the telephone base or charger after use.
- Make sure the power adapter is securely plugged into an outlet not controlled by a wall switch.
- Make sure the telephone line cord is plugged firmly into the telephone base and the wall jack.
- Unplug the electrical power to the telephone base. Wait for approximately 15 seconds, then plug it back in. Allow up to one minute for the cordless handset and telephone base to synchronize.
- Charge the battery in the handset for up to 12 hours.

There is no dial tone.

The battery does not charge in the handset or the handset battery does not accept charge.

The messages on the answering system are incomplete.

- If the caller's voice is very soft, the answering system may stop recording and disconnect the call

I accidentally changed the LCD language to Français/Español.

Enter *3645474# to reset the LCD language to English at any part of the menu.

Common cure for electronic equipment.

Taking care of your telephone

Avoid water

Your telephone can be damaged if it gets wet. Do not use the handset outdoors in the rain, or handle it with wet hands. Do not install the telephone base near a sink, bathtub or shower.

Electrical storms
