· Audio Settings: System Sound

System Sound refers to the sounds (such as chimes and melodies) heard as you navigate the menus or lists. You can choose to play or mute these sounds.



. Audio Settings: Set Volume

While the microphone test confirms that you will be heard, the volume check verifies that you'll be able to hear your contact. Follow the steps to set your volume.



Helpful Hints to Set Volume

- If you can't hear anything, make sure your TV sound is not muted.
- If you're using an audio receiver, disconnect the SPDIF (Optical Digital Audio) cable from your set-top box, plug it into the Audio port and try again.

• General Settings: Set Time Zone


Select your time zone by choosing from the options shown. Selecting your time zone will help provide the most accurate call time records, which you'll find in your **Recent** conversations.

Onscreen directions will guide you through these simple steps. They'll indicate how long they'll take, any actions required or any issues that may occur.






. General Settings: System Timeout

If you don't use Skype on TV while you're signed in, the system will automatically return to your TV program. You can decide how much inactive time should pass before Skype on TV switches to TV, or opt for no timeouts at all.

- The default setting for a system timeout is 7 days
- The default setting for a call or chat timeout is 4 hours
- ▲ If you choose **Never** as your timeout option, be aware that screen burn may occur on your TV (particularly on plasma TVs). Screen burn, a permanent mark on your TV screen that degrades image quality, occurs when the same image remains on your screen for an extended period of time.

Avatar
