Safety and Care

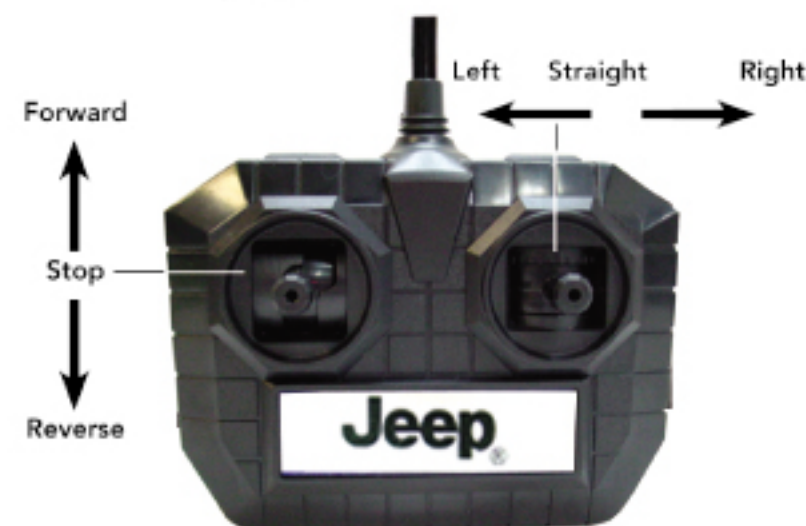

Driving Your Jeep

1. Thread the Jeep's antenna wire through the supplied antenna tube. Then, insert the tube into the antenna tube holder on the Jeep's body.
2. Make sure the transmitter and the Jeep are on the same band. Turn on the Jeep and transmitter.
3. Use the transmitter's control levers to steer your Jeep.
4. Turn off the Jeep when you finish driving.



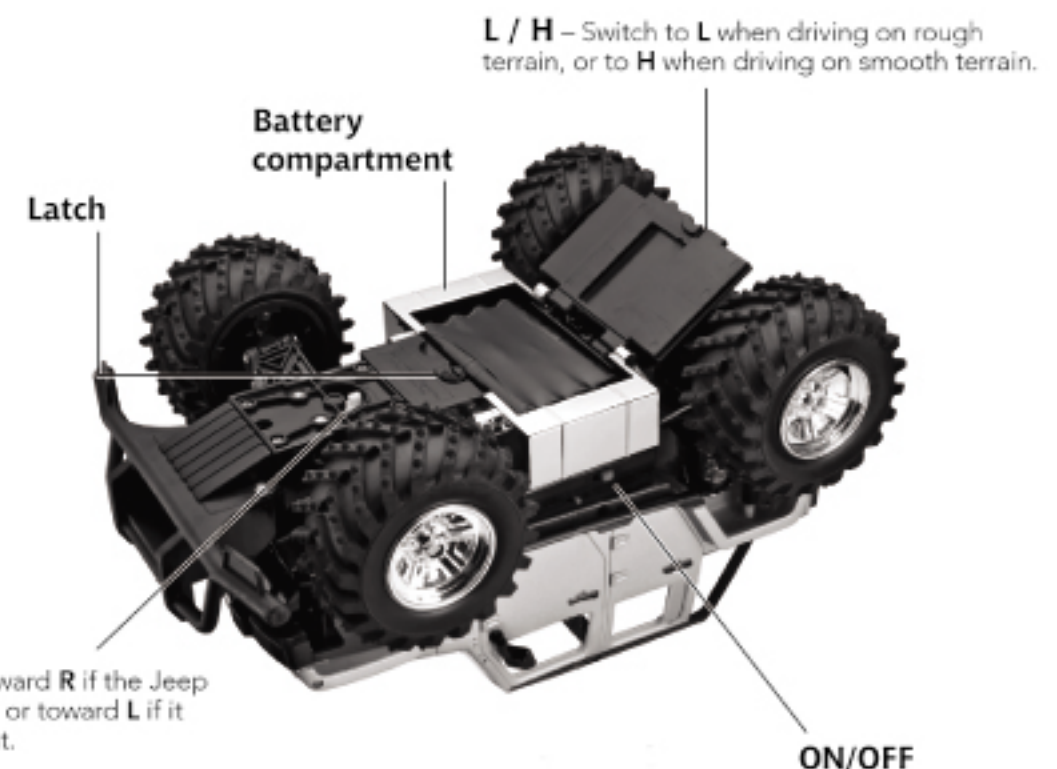
Installing Batteries

Charge a 9.6 V battery pack (not supplied) before installing.

1. Turn off your Jeep and transmitter.
2. Insert one 9V battery (not supplied) in the transmitter battery compartment matching the polarity symbols (+ and -) marked inside.
3. Load and connect a fully-charged 9.6V battery pack or battery tray with 6 AA batteries (neither supplied). The connector fits only one way. Do not force it.
4. Replace the battery door and secure the latch.

Battery Notes:

- Use only fresh batteries of the required size and recommended type. Use batteries of the same types, capacities and chemistries.
- Do not burn or bury batteries.
- To keep motor heat levels down, let the Jeep cool at least ten minutes between battery exchanges.
- If you do not plan to use the Jeep for a week or longer, remove the batteries from both the Jeep and transmitter.
- Position the battery connectors and wires so they do not touch any moving parts.
