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
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

1.1 Your device

1.3 Installing SIM Card and Memory Card

A SIM card & memory card

SIM card contains your phone number and network service details. You will need a microSD[®] card to store photos, music, videos and other data.

To install the SIM card/microSD card

- 1. Open the card cover.
- 2. Insert SIM card/micro SD card as shown. Make sure the gold contacts are facing up.
- 3. Close the card cover.

To remove the SIM card

- 1. Open the card cover.
- 2. Push to eject the SIM card from the slot.
- 3. Close the card cover.

To remove the memory card

- 1. For safe removal, tap Application Drawer > Settings > SD card, USB Mass storage & phone storage > Unmount SD card.
- 2. Open the card cover.
- 3. Push to eject the micro SD card to eject it from the slot.
- **NOTE:** Do not remove the memory while the device is turned on. Sudden removal of the memory card may cause data loss or unpredictable system hang up.

1.4 Charging the Battery

From new the battery is only partically charged. To fully charge the battery, charge it for 2 hours.

To charge the battery

- 1. Connect one end of the AC adaptor to the mini USB connector of the device as shown.
- 2. Plug the other end of the AC adaptor to the wall outlet to start charging.

When the battery is charging, the red LED is activated; the **G** icon is also displayed in the status bar. When battery is fully charged, the red LED disappears and the green LED is activated; if



the device is turned on, the \bigcirc icon is also displayed in the status bar.



NOTE:

- The battery can also be charged when device connects to computer through USB cable. (Although charging time may significatly increase)
- The battery life may vary depending on user usage.

1.5 Using Headphones

For hands-free conversation or listening to music, plug in headphones to the headphone connector.

NOTE:

- When using headphones, your ability to hear outside sounds may be limited. Do not use headphones if it will endanger you.
- Do not set the volume to its maximum when using headphones as it may damage your hearing.

1.6 Turning the Device On or Off


After installing the SIM card and charging the battery, device is ready to turn on.

1.7 Unlocking the Screen





Setting Alarms

You can set up three alarms on this device.

To set the alarm

- 1. Tap **Application Drawer > Clock**.
- 2. Under the Alarm clock tab, tap to select from the existing alarm clock settings or tap **Menu > Add alarm** to set up a new alarm.

Display Settings

The display settings of this ViewPad affect the battery and external power level.

To turn off backlight when the device is idle

- 1. Tap **Application Drawer > Settings > Sound & display** to enter the submenu.
- 2. In **Display settings** submenu, tap **Screen Timeout**.
- 3. Select from the screen timeout list. Your setting is automatically saved.

To adjust brightness

- 1. Tap **Application Drawer > Settings > Sound & display** to enter the submenu.
- 2. In **Display settings** submenu, tap **Brightness** slider.
- 3. Drag the **Brightness** slider to adjust brightness settings.

To change the screen orientation

Ring Settings

- 4. Tap **OK** when finished.

9.3 Using Wireless & networks

Wireless & networks allows you to manage Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, airplane mode, and mobile networks.

- 1. Tap Application Drawer > Settings > Wireless & networks.
- 2. To turn on or off **Wi-Fi**, **Bluetooth** or **Airplane mode**, simply tap their corresponding bars.
- 3. To change connection settings, tap the corresponding function settings, then select the setting to change.

9.4 Protecting Your ViewPad

You can protect this ViewPad from unauthorized users by requiring the PIN code or entering a password.

Enable or Disable SIM card PIN

When PIN code is enabled, you are required to enter the PIN code before making a call.

- 1. Tap Application Drawer > Settings > Location & Security.
- 2. In SIM card lock submenu, tap Set up SIM card lock.
- 3. Tap **Lock SIM card** to use PIN to use the device. Check to enable, uncheck to disable.
- 4. Enter the current PIN code.
- 5. To change the PIN code, tap Change PIN.
- 6. Enter the old PIN code.
- 7. Enter the new PIN code and confirm.

Enabling Screen Lock Protection

When Screen lock is enabled, you are required to draw the pattern to unlock the screen.

- 1. Tap **Application Drawer > Settings > Location & Security**.
- 2. In Screen unlock pattern submenu, tap Set unlock pattern.
- 3. Follow on-screen instructions to draw your own personal unlock pattern and tap **Continue**.
- 4. Redraw your unlock pattern again and tap Confirm.

9.5 Resetting the ViewPad

You can reset your ViewPad to its factory defaults.

- 1. Tap Application Drawer > Settings > Privacy settings.
- 2. In Personal data submenu, tap Factory data reset.
- 3. Tap Reset ViewPad to erase all data on your ViewPad.

Chapter 10: Using the PC Tools Application

PC Tools application is software that enables you to change USB modes when your ViewPad is connected to a computer. Available modes are as follows:


- **USB Mass Storage**: Allows computer to recognize your ViewPad as a USB mass storage device.
- Phone as modem: Allows you to use your ViewPad as a modem.
- Synchronization Tool: Allows you to sync your ViewPad with a computer.



10.1 Using the PC Tools Application

Installing the driver

- 1. Turn on your ViewPad, and connect it to your computer using the USB cable.
- 2. From the Windows desktop, double click on **My Computer** and locate the **CD drive**.
- 3. Browse and double click Setup.exe.



4. Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the driver installation.

Using your ViewPad as a storage device

To browse and transfer video and still images into a computer, do the following:

- 1. In PC Tools application, select **USB Mass Storage**.
- 2. The Removable Disk window appears on the screen.



3. Locate the **DCIM** folder and double click on **DCIM** folder to open it to find more folders.

Your recorded images and video clips will be inside these folders.

4. Copy and paste the image and video files to a folder on your computer.

Using your ViewPad as a modem

This feature allows you to use your ViewPad as a modem to access internet.

- 1. Be sure that the Wi-Fi function on your device is set to *disable* mode.
 - Tap Application Drawer > Settings > Wireless controls. Turn off Wi-Fi mode (uncheck Wi-Fi).
- 2. In PC Tools application, select Phone as modem.

3. Select **APN**.

You can edit the correct APN of your operator. Contact your network provider for more information.



4. Wait until Connecting to 3G_Modem process is completed.

A "3G_Modem is now connected" message appears on the screen.

5. From the Windows desktop, double click on **Internet Explorer** or launch a web browser.

This feature allows you to sync your ViewPad with a computer.
