





3. Setting Up the Product

3-1. Display



Button	Name	function	
FEED	Paper Feed/ Down button	Advances the supply. Clears error message. Moves down through menu options.	
	Enter button	Selects the highlighted menu option.	
\triangle	Up button	Moves up through menu options.	
d	Power button	Turns the printer on and off. Press to turn power on. Press for three seconds to turn power off. Wakes the printer from sleep mode.	

▼ NOTE

- The battery status LEDs indicate amount of power remaining. Actual run-time remaining depends on factors such as the contents of output, distance to computer, etc.
- 2. When the battery level is very low, high density printing can result in the printer switching off during printing resulting in possible loss of data.

3-2. Installing the Battery



Remove the battery door. Insert the battery as shown.




Replace the battery door.

V NOTE

You must fully charge the battery when you receive the printer.


Batteries can be charged in the printer or in an optional external cradle

3-3. Removing the Battery



Remove the battery door. Lift out the battery.

3-4. Charging the Battery



- 1. Turn off the printer.
- 2. Be sure that the AC plug is correct.

 If AC plug is wrong, change the plug to the correct one.
- 3. Open the DC jack by pulling on the rubber cover and insert DC jack into the printer.
- 4. Plug the AC plug into an electrical outlet.
- 5. The charge indicator LED (located on the AC charger as shown) shows red or green according to the status.

3-4-1 The status of lamp in charging

Status	charging	charging complete
Charging Lamp	Red	Green

V NOTE

If there is trouble while charging the battery, the charge indicator LED blinks green. Try unplugging and reconnecting charger, charging should resume. Charging is complete when the LED changes to solid green.

3-5. Stock Installation



Open the Paper cover by pressing the Open button and set the width of paper guide by turning the knob with finger.



Put the stock in so it unrolls from the bottom. Remove the stock core when it is empty. Pull a short length of stock out of the printer.



Close the cover.




Press the Feed Key once to arrange the paper.

3-6. Peel Mode

Peel Mode




With a roll of stock installed, slide the peeler body towards the back of the printer.



Press the feed button.

Non-Peel Mode



Lift the peeler wing and slide the peeler body towards the front of the printer.




Press the feed button.




While Peeler mode is "On", perhaps engraved lines of the label paper are cut too deep, peeling error might occur.


Badness Paper




Normal paper



3-7. Diagnostic Test



Turn off the printer.



Press and hold the feed button and power button.

V NOTE

- 1. For Hex Dump mode, do steps 1-2 then press the feed button.
- 2. After printing ASCII pattern, the diagnostic test is complete.
- 3. If the feed button is not pressed to go to Hex Dump mode, the printer exits diagnostics after three seconds.

Upon initial installation or for troubleshooting, you can run the diagnostic test to get information about:

Firmware version, emulation, codepage, sensor settings, interface settings, etc. If no issues are found with diagnostic test, examine other devices and software. The diagnostic test is working independent of devices and software.


Do not overheat the motor

To prevent the motor from overheating, stop the printer for at least 30 seconds after continuously printing 1.5 meters.

4. Peripherals Connection

This printeThis product can communicate with other devices via Wifi(802.11b/g) communication and cable.

4-1 Wifi(802.11b/g) Connection




- 1. The Printer can be connected to devices equipped with wifi(802.11b/g) communication capacity (PDAs, PCs, etc.)
- 2. Use the wifi(802.11b/g) connection function supported by the device to connect to the printer.

4-2. Interface Cable Connection



1. Connect the USB or Serial cable to the cable connector on the printer.

V NOTE

Use only the cables offered by the printer manufacturer.


2. Connect the interface cable into the USB or Serial port of the device (PDA, PC, etc.)

5. Printer cleaning

If the interior of the printer is dusty, printing quality can be lowered. In this case, follow the instructions below to clean the printer.

5-1. PrintHead Cleaning

- Use an applicator swab moistened with an isopropyl alcohol to clean the print head and remove any dust.
- Once cleaning is complete, allow the printer to dry then install the stock and close the cover.




▼ NOTE

- 1. Make sure to turn the printer power off prior to cleaning
- 2. The printhead can become very hot during printing; allow the printer approximately 10 minutes to cool before cleaning.
- 3. Do not touch the printhead, it can be damaged by static electricity.
- 4. Take care not to allow the print head to become scratched and /or damaged in any way.

5-2. Platen Roller Cleaning

- 1.Clean the platen roller with a clean soft cloth moistened with isopropyl alcohol or a cleaning pen.
- 2. Turn the platen roller with your finger to clean the entire surface.
