Note1. Occupational/controlled limits apply in situations in which persons are exposed as a consequence of their employment provided those persons are fully aware of the potential for exposure and can exercise control over their exposure. cm from all persons and must not be co-located or operating in conjunction with any other antenna or transmitter. No change to the antenna or the device is permitted. Any change to the antenna or the device could result in the device exceeding the RF exposure requirements and void user's authority to operate the device.

RF Exposure Calculations:

The following information provides the minimum separation distance for the highest gain antenna provided. This calculation is based on the conducted power, considering maximum power and antenna gain. The formula shown in KDB 447498 D01 is used in the calculation.

Equation from KDB 447498 D01 General RF Exposure Guidance v06 (10/23/2015) is:

$$S = PG / 4\pi R^2$$

Where: S = power density (in appropriate units, e.g. mW/cm²)

P = Time-average maximum tune up procedure (in appropriate units, e.g., mW)

G = the numeric gain of the antenna

R = distance to the center of radiation of the antenna (20 cm = limit for MPE)

So the simultaneous transmitting antenna pairs as below:

$$\Sigma \text{of MPE ratios} = \text{WiFi 2.4G} + \text{WiFi 5G} = 0.071 + 0.050 = 0.121 < 1$$

Note: For transmitters, minimum separation distance is 20cm, even if calculations indicate MPE distance is less.
