I have a few comments on this Application.

- 1 PC2 changes are for devices that are not only functionally identical but electrically identical as well as identical in layout and design within the constraints of the definitions of permissive changes. Along with the request for permissive change the manufacturer and/or lab must provide complete information and the results of tests of the characteristics affected by such change. The only information in the report is a request stating the changed device is functionally the same. Please be aware that functionality is not sufficient justification for a PC2, especially when and if major changes to layout and design have taken place. You must provide sufficient justification as to why a PC2 is appropriate rather than a complete submission for a new ID. This information must consist of the following: a) what are the changes in the equipment, b) what are the results of testing (test report) performed on the unit after the change, and c) you must provide pictures of the changes. (i.e. pictures of any board lay outs or component placement changes, etc.). Please provide these minimum required items.

Once this critical information is provided, I can begin the review of the PC2.
