Installation

DO NOT INSTALL IN HOT AREAS. This apparatus can be damaged by heat in excess of 131°F (55°C)

Personal Safety

MAKE SURE MACHINERY AND SURROUNDING AREA IS CLEAR BEFORE OPERATING. Do not activate the remote system unless it is safe to do so.

TURN OFF THE BASE STATION POWER BEFORE WORKING ON MACHINERY. Always disconnect the remote system before doing any maintenance to prevent accidental operation of the machine

Care

KEEP DRY. Do not clean the RCU nor the Base Station under high pressure.

CLEAN THE UNIT AFTER OPERATION. Remove any mud, dirt, concrete, etc. from the unit to prevent clogging of buttons, etc. by using a damp cloth.



CAUTION: Only use a soft cloth moistened with water when cleaning a button or the TS110.

DO NOT clean the TS110 or its buttons using any implement or object that is capable of cutting or damaging the button membrane or housing. DO NOT pour any liquids directly on the TS110. In the increasingly interconnected world, it is recommended that this mobile wireless application be installed in a manner to prevent any unauthorized access or use. Though the possibility of intentional wireless interference or hijacking is low, the potential for physical tampering with a system poses the greater threat.

The following steps are suggested to ensure the most secure installation possible.

- 1. Mount the Base Station within a metal box with a securable door or hatch.
- 2. Secure the box using a key, preferably of a type that is not widely circulated nor easily duplicated.
- 3. Run all cabling through industry standard conduit. Ensure that fittings make a secure and difficult to breach connection between the metal box and the conduit.
- 4. Whenever possible, operate the RCU as close to the vehicle as possible. This results in a stronger signal that is harder to override or jam.
- 5. When not in use, store the RCU in such a way as to limit access.
- 6. All system operators should be made aware that individuals with questionable intentions do exist, and to always check their system prior to operation.

System Overview

Eaton's **OMNEX Trusted Wireless**[™] remote control system is portable, long range, programmable and designed as a compact and easy-to-use product. This **Trusted Wireless**[™] system puts complete control of your equipment where it's needed most, with the operator. It's robust, easy to install and has complete self-diagnostics. The system can be a simple cable replacement or add intelligence to make it a total control package.

The **OMNEX Trusted Wireless™ TS110** one-way RCU uses Frequency Hopping Spread Spectrum (FHSS) technology. FHSS devices concentrate their full power into a very narrow signal that randomly hops from frequency to frequency within a designated band. This transmission pattern, along with sophisticated error-checking techniques, enables our industrially hardened **FHSS** signals to overcome interference that commonly affects licensed radios.

The 12 button **TS110** provides the user flexibility to control the functions they need, and is available in both the 900MHz and 2.4GHz frequency bands. The RCU has a built in Lithium battery pack which is recharged using the uniquely designed contactless charger. Each **TS110** one-way RCU is assigned a unique ID code to ensure that no two systems will conflict on any job site.

Power the RCU

Before using an RCU, make sure that it has been fully charged



NOTE: The batteries can only be charged if the TS110 is between 0°C and 45°C. The unit will operate below 0°C but battery capacity is reduced at low temperatures. Exposing TS110 to temperatures below -20°C or above 55°C could permanently damage the batteries.

1. Turn on the RCU

Press Power [ON] **①**. Refer to the **Light Legend** below for LED states. When in the vicinity of a powered and paired Base Station the COMM LED will blink YELLOW**③**.

2. Turn off the RCU

Press the Power [OFF] 4 button.



Turn ON RCU



Test the RCU / Base Station Link

Follow these steps to ensure that there is a radio link between the RCU and Base Station. Refer to the Light Legend below for LED states on the Base Station.

1. Base Station

Apply power to the Base Station and confirm that it is active. The (E-stop) light should be a solid RED and the (STATUS) light a solid GREEN.

If the Base Station does not power up, confirm that it has been wired correctly. Refer to the **Wiring Diagram** in the *Installing the Base Station* section of the appropriate Base Station product manual.

2. Power TS110

Press Power ON **1** button and the COMM LED **2** will turn on

The RCU can take from 2-7 seconds to link with the Base Station. The COMM LED ② will flash when the RCU is linked.

If the RCU does not power up refer to the previous section *Power the RCU*.





The System is now ready for use.

If the Base Station's (E-STOP) light flashes GREEN the system is ready to use.

Follow Pair a RCU in the Service Mode section if

- 1. The Base Station (E-STOP) light is solid RED
- 2. The COMM LED **2** stays solid YELLOW



NOTE: As a battery saving feature the RCU may shut itself off (and the Base Station will transition all outputs to a safe state) after the configured RCU timeout inactivity period. The *RCU Timeout* feature is configurable within the RCUs *Service Mode* section.

Momentarily operating any button on the RCU, including the [Power] button will reset the timeout monitoring.

Service Mode

Service Mode is available on the TS110 one-way RCU and allows the operator to pair to a Base Station, adjust the RCU's timeout, run diagnostics, and optionally configure the Base Station outputs in the field.

Once the RCU has entered into Service Mode, navigation and option selection/modification is controlled by four buttons as described by the *Enter Service Mode* and *Navigation* sections below.

NOTE: Only properly equipped R160 Base Stations may be configured in the field.

Enter Service Mode

- A. Press and Hold Power OFF **1** [RED]
- B. Press and Hold Power ON ② [GREEN] Wait for the COMM LED to be turned ON, then immediately proceed to next step.
- C. Release Power OFF ④ [RED]
- D. Release Power ON **6** [GREEN]

The COMM LED will blink YELLOW when unit enters Service Mode.

Once in Service Mode, the RCU will automatically turn OFF when left idle (no buttons pressed) for 5 minutes.



Navigation

Once you have entered Service Mode you can select the Service Mode options listed below

The Power ON **⑤** [GREEN] will allow you to execute or modify an option. Power OFF **④** [RED] will allow you to move up from an entry and power off the unit. Only one option is allowed at a time in Service Mode. Service Mode options are as listed below

- A. Button **⑤** [GREEN] Start pairing TS110
- B. Button **1** Modify RCU timeout
- C. Button 2 Run Diagnostics
- D. Button **3** Software build version

Service Mode: Pairing

Pairing

This function allows you to pair the TS110 with a Base Station.

Pairing is required to teach a RCU's unique configuration to a Base Station. Once complete, the Base Station is capable of establishing a one-way radio link with the paired RCU.

Pairing is a three step process

- 1. Prepare the TS110
- 2. Prepare the Base Station
- 3. Start Pairing

The following sections describes the three step process to pair the TS110 with an Base Station. Refer to Troubleshooting Chart #3 for Tips and Considerations.



NOTE: It is necessary to associate the RCU to Base Station when replacing either the RCU or Base Station.

1. Prepare the TS110

Make sure TS110 is in Service Mode. Do not yet press the Power ON [GREEN] button.



2. Prepare the Base Station

There are two methods to prepare the Base Station

- A. Using the TS110's rear-mounted magnet or using a wand (sold separately).
- B. Opening the Base Station housing and manually initiating the pairing state.

The following section deals with method A only. If using method B above, refer to the appropriated Base Station product guide, then proceed below to step 3 Start Pairing.

2.1. Power Base Station

Supply power to the Base Station. The Base Station is ready when the **Base Station lights**

Status: solid GREEN E-Stop: solid RED

Service Mode: Pairing (continued)

2.2. Initiate Base Station Setup Mode

A. Maneuver the rear of the TS110 so that its magnet **1** is placed over the top left corner **2** of the Base Station.

B. Adjust the TS110 position until the Base Station E-Stop light slowly flashes GREEN.

Status: solid GREEN E-Stop: slow flashing GREEN

C. Remove the TS110 when the Base Station E-Stop light quickly flashes GREEN.

E-Stop: slow flashing GREEN



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NOTE: If the Base Station is left idle in Setup Mode for over 30 seconds, the Base Station will time out. The Status light stays solid GREEN and E-Stop light will slowly flash RED after Setup Mode has timed out. To return to Setup Mode repeat step 2.2.

Service Mode: Start Pairing

3. Start Pairing

A. Press the TS110 Power ON [GREEN] button**0** to start the pairing process.

The pairing will start and the COMM LED **②**. on TS110 will turn on YELLOW



- B. Pairing is complete when
 - 1. TS110 STATUS LED 2 turns GREEN
 - Base Station E-Stop light will change from GREEN to RED **4**.

E-Stop: solid RED



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NOTE: If the pairing fails, the TS110 STATUS LED will turn ON RED. Correct any errors, cycle power to both the RCU and Base Station, then repeat the pairing process.

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If repeated attempts at pairing fails, contact your service representative for assistance as there may be a setup or hardware failure.

Service Mode: Modify RCU Timeout

RCU Timeout

As a battery saving feature the RCU has the ability to turn it self off after a defined period of inactivity.

The RCU timeout is configurable from 1 to 998 minutes in 1 minute increments. A value of 0, the default value, disables the RCU timeout.

To adjust the RCU timeout press button **①**.

10 user buttons represent numeric values from 1-9 as shown on the picture left. LEDs on the 10 user buttons will flash RED to display the current user settings.

First RED flash represent the 100's figure of RCU timeout. The second RED flash represent the 10's figure of RCU timeout. The third RED flash represent the 1's figure of RCU timeout.

For example, a time out of 138 minutes is displayed as below.





Press three buttons in sequence to set the timeout. First button represent 100's, second button represent 10's, and third button represent 1's figure of RCU timeout. When each button is pressed, corresponding button LED will turn on GREEN momentarily. LEDs will display the new value once the button sequence is complete.

Press and release Power ON [GREEN] to save your changes. Press and release Power OFF [RED] to abort any changes and turn off unit.

CAUTION: When a RCU turns off due to inactivity it will cause the Base Station it is communicating with to go in to its safe state. The Base Station safe state, by default, is all functions OFF unless specified differently by your equipment supplier.

You must be aware of any behavior that may change due to adjusting the timeout and consider all safety aspects of operation. Consult with the supplier of your equipment if your are unsure of affected safety operation.

Failure to follow SAFETY PRECAUTIONS may result in equipment failure and/or serious personal injury.

Service Mode: Run Diagnostics

Test Buttons and Vibrator

- 1. On the TS110 press top right Button **0** to enter Diagnostic mode .
- 2. STATUS LED will blink RED and GREEN ②. All LEDs will turn on RED.
- 3. Press each button to test. On each button press, the associated button LED which was RED will change to GREEN while the button is pressed.
- 4. Press [GREEN] button **③** to test Vibrator. This will activate Vibrator for 1 second.

Press and release Power OFF [RED] to exit diagnostic mode and turn off the unit.





Service Mode: Software Build Version

RCU Software Build Version

On the TS110, press the second left Button from the top ③ to display the software build version. The RCU LEDs on the 10 user buttons will flash the RED software build version until the Power OFF [RED] button ④ is pressed.

LEDs on the10 user buttons represent numeric values from 1-9 as shown on the picture left.

The first RED flash represents the most significant digit of the software build version. The second RED flash represents the second digit from the left and so on.

For example, a SW build version of 41386 is displayed as below.





Press and release Power OFF [RED] to exit diagnostic mode and turn off the unit.



Configuring RCU / Base Station Outputs in the Field

A field configurable system maps the 16 sixteen function buttons to the first 16 R160 Base Station outputs. The configuration determines the function of each Base Station output and allows customization as Momentary, Latched or Maintained. Button pairs on the same row may also be interlocked, preventing the two functions from activating at the same time.

The 18-digit Configuration Code contains all the information necessary to customize the TS110 / R160 system. Each digit, indicated by a number or letter, represents a specific functional option available for each Base Station output.

Refer to the **Output Function Selection Table** below for help determining a Configuration Code. Choose one option for each digit and use the resulting 18-digit Configuration Code in step 3 of the **Changing the Configuration** procedure on the next page.



NOTE: Only properly equipped R160 Base Stations may be configured in the field.

Service Mode: Field Configuration (continued)

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Changing the Configuration

NOTE: An 18-digit Configuration Code is required to complete these steps. Refer to the Configuration Code section on the previous page for directions on how to determine this code.

1. Opening the R160 Case and Power R160

- A. The cap is held on by two plastic tabs at opposing sides, which can be unlatched as shown using a screwdriver. Once the cap is free, the R160 can slide open.
- B. Supply power to the receiver. The (E-STOP) light and the (LINK) light will come on RED and the (STATUS) light will come on GREEN.





2. Place TS110 into Configuration Mode

On the TS110, press the second right Button from the top **1** to enter the Base Station output Configuration Mode.

The TS110 will blink out the currently programmed sequence on the red LEDs of the 10 user buttons.

NOTE: While waiting for the user to enter the Configuration Code, the TS110 will use the red LEDs of the ten user buttons to blink out the currently programmed sequence.

3. Enter Configuration Mode Pass Code

- A. Enter the first 10 digits of the Configuration Code. (Refer to the Configuration Code chart on the bottom of the previous page to determine this code.)
- B. Press the green button once to accept.
- C. Enter the remaining 8 digits of the Configuration Code.
- NOTE: All systems come preconfigured with the default code of
- **NOTE**: Both the Configuration Code and configurator use letter codes to represent the values of 10 to 13.

Press button "0" to specify the letter "a". Press and hold down button "0" while pressing buttons "1", "2" or "3" to specify the letters "b", "c" and "d" respectively.

Service Mode: Field Configuration (continued)

4. Put R160 into Setup Mode

- A. Press & hold [Setup] button until (STATUS) light goes from slow flash to fast flash
- B. Release [Setup] button. (STATUS) light goes to solid GREEN, (LINK) light turns off



NOTE: If left idle in Setup Mode for over 30 seconds, the receiver will time out. The (Link) light and (Status) light will flash RED rapidly. To return to Setup Mode, repeat step 4.

5. Send Code

A. Press the green button on the TS110 once to accept.

Pairing with the Base Station will commence.

B. Once the Code has been downloaded, the (Link) light on the receiver will change from GREEN to RED.



NOTE: After the full Configuration Code sequence has been entered, the TS110 will blink out what was entered for confirmation. If there was a mistake, the Configuration Code may be re-entered. The code will only be accepted if the full sequence has been entered and the green button is pressed.

Considerations when Pairing

Potential downloading issues

If the testing of the RCU and the Base Station both show the system as working (Chart 1 & 2), then the RCU and Base Station will both go into Pairing/Configuration mode.

Possible issues could arise during Step 3, the teaching phase of pairing. In this case there are 2 symptoms to look for:

- 1. The Link light on the Base Station will not turn GREEN when the power switch is toggled on the RCU to download
- 2. The Base Station will "time out" indicating that it didn't receive a signal from the RCU within the 30 seconds from the time the Base Station was put into Setup Mode.

If all indications appear normal during the pairing phase, test the link by turning on the RCU (Note: the RCU remains in Service Mode after pairing in Step 3).

1. If the Link light on the Base Station doesn't turn GREEN, the Base Station didn't receive all of the information that was sent from the RCU.

Possible Solutions

- 1. Try the Downloading steps again
- 2. If this doesn't correct the problem, send both the RCU and Base Station in for service.



NOTE: If possible try to determine whether the fault lies with the RCU or Base Station by completing the Reprogramming procedure with a different RCU. If this step works, then the fault lies with the original RCU. If not, the fault may lie with the Base Station.

Reprogramming Tips:

- 1. Be patient and deliberate when pressing the Power and E-Stop buttons in the correct order during power up in Configuration mode
- 2. Follow each step as laid out in the procedure
