

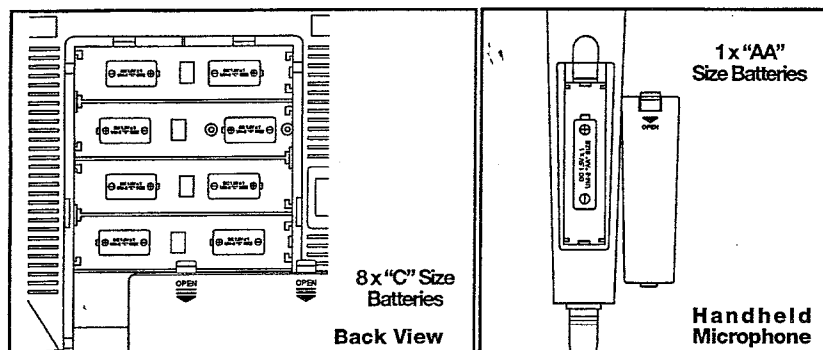
## Unpacking and Setup

1. Remove the product and all packing materials from the carton.
2. Save packing materials in case the unit needs to be returned for service. If you do dispose of the packing materials, please do so properly.
3. Remove any feature labels, fact tags, or clear protective films from the front or top of the unit, if applicable. Do not remove any warning labels from the back or bottom of the unit.
4. Place the unit on a level surface, away from direct sunlight and sources of excess dust, dirt, heat, water, moisture, vibrations, and strong magnetic fields.
5. Protect your furniture when placing the unit on natural wood or wood with a lacquered or coated finish. A cloth or other protective material should be placed between the unit and the furniture.

**This unit operates on either AC or battery power. When AC cord is plugged in, battery power will not be used. During battery-powered use, detach AC cord from back of Boombox.**

**Note: Power source installation should always be performed by an adult.**

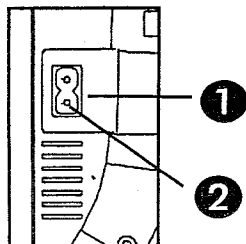

- The supply terminals are not to be short-circuited.

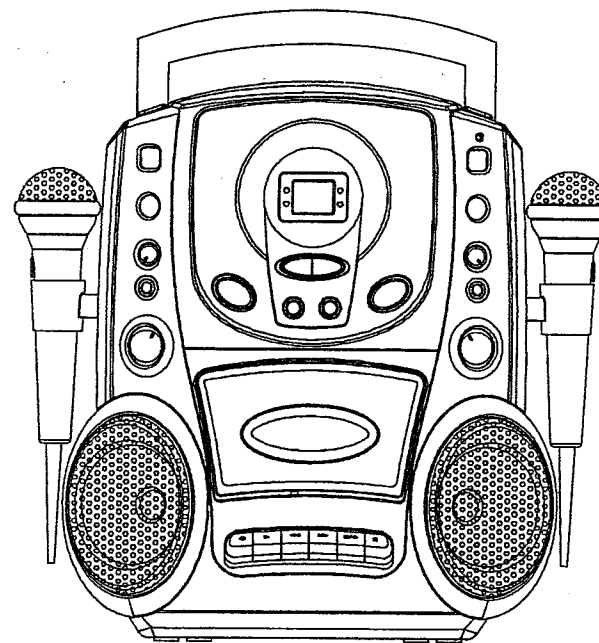

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## Consumer Safety Guide

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### IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

When used in the directed manner, this unit has been designed and manufactured to ensure your personal safety. However, improper use can result in potential electrical shock or fire hazards. Please read all safety and operating instructions carefully before installation and use, and keep these instructions handy for future reference. Take note of all warnings listed in these instructions and on the unit.

1. **Water and Moisture** – The unit should not be set up or used near water. For example: near a bathtub, washbowl, sink, laundry tub, swimming pool, or in a wet basement.
2. **Ventilation** – The unit should be situated so that its location or position does not interfere with its proper ventilation. For example, it should not be situated on a bed, sofa, rug or similar surface that may block ventilation openings. Also, it should not be placed in a built-in installation, such as a bookcase or cabinet, that may impede the flow of air through the ventilation openings.

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## 90-Day Limited Warranty

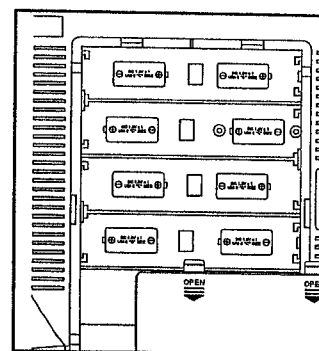

## Maintenance

- It is important to keep the CDG Karaoke Tape Recorder as dry and clean as possible. Clean the unit with a soft cloth moistened only with mild soap and water. Stronger cleaning agents, such as thinner or similar materials are not recommended, as they may damage the surface of the case.
- Do not allow particles or liquids to enter the casing. Be especially careful when the CD door is open. Never touch the optical lens, or look at it when it is in use. Periodically use a commercially available CD lens cleaner.
- If cassette sound "drops out" (works intermittently) or excessive noise occurs, clean the tape player heads with a cotton swab moistened with isopropyl alcohol, or use a commercially available tape head cleaner.

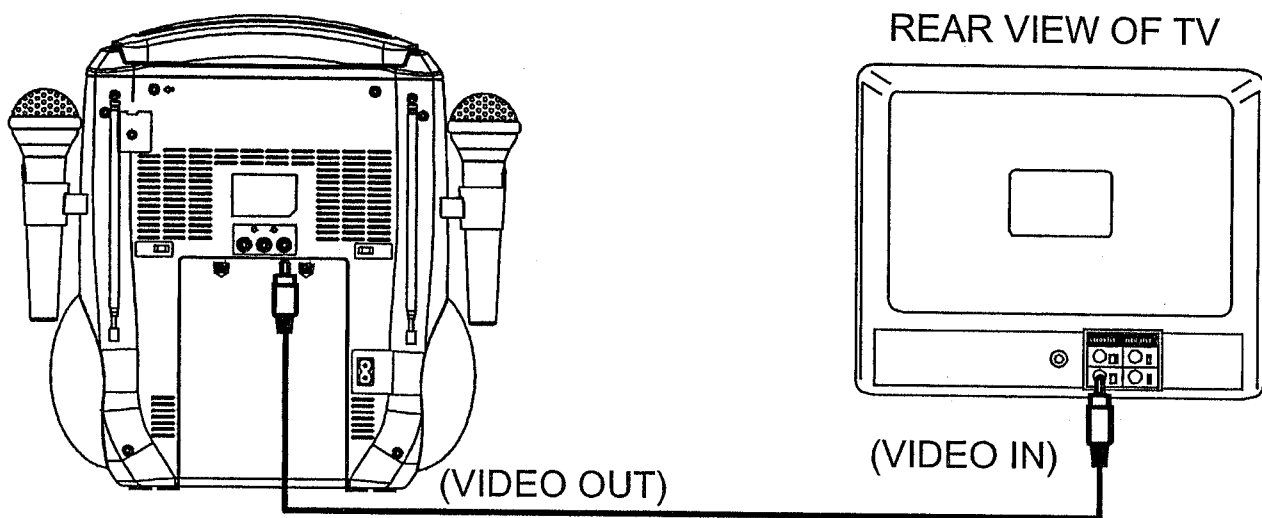

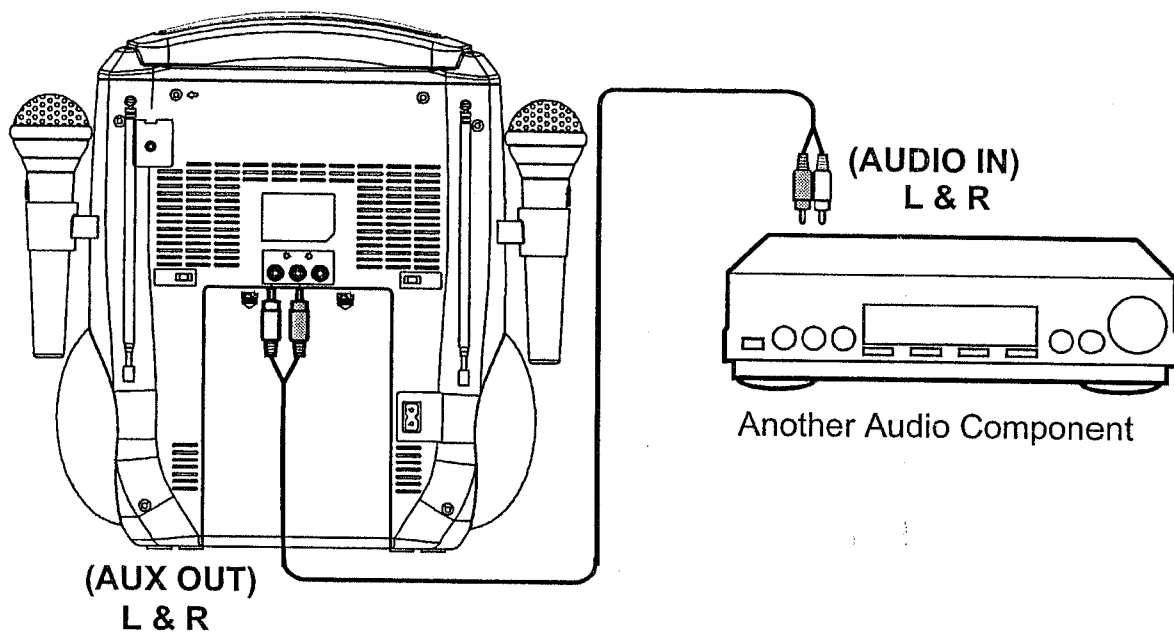

- If the TV does not feature a "Video In" jack, an RF Modulator (not included) may be used.
- The TV's audio modes may need to be adjusted for best broadcast.

Connecting the unit to a stereo and TV will allow the audio to be broadcast through the stereo while displaying CDG features on the TV screen.

- If the TV features only one audio input, a "Y" connector (not included) may be needed for connection.
- If the TV does not feature a "Video In" jack, an RF Modulator (not included) may be used.
- The stereo's audio modes may need to be adjusted for best broadcast.

# Playing Compact Discs and Cassettes

**CD Door Button**  
Press to open door and insert/remove CD. Press again to close.

**Echo Button**  
Press and lock for echo sound effects.

**CD Reverse Button**  
Press to go to previous track. While CD is playing, press and hold for high-speed scan. (High-speed scan will not work for CDG discs.)

**CD Stop Button**  
Press to turn off CD.

**Repeat One/All Functions**  
While CD plays, press **Repeat Button**:

- Once to activate Repeat One Song (Repeat LED on display will blink).
- Again to activate Repeat Entire CD (Repeat LED will stay lit).
- Again to turn off all Repeat functions (Repeat LED will shut off).

**Random Button**  
To play CD tracks in random order, start playing CD by pressing the Random Button. Random LED will light

**Tape Record Button**  
When CD Power is on, insert CD and blank tape to record CD onto tape. Press button to start CD play from Track 1 and recording. See next page for mic recording info.

**Tape Play Button**  
Press to play prerecorded tapes.

**LCD Display with LED Indicators**

- Two-digit CD track listing.
- LED Indicators outside display: CDG; Random; Repeat; Play.

**Power LED**  
Lights when power is on.

**CD/Tape Power Button**  
Press and lock to turn CD player power on. Release to turn power off, and to use tape player.

**Bass Boost Button**  
Press and lock in for added bass sound for CD's and tapes.

**CD Forward Button**  
Press to advance to next track. While CD is playing, press and hold for high-speed scan. (High-speed scan will not work for CDG discs.)

**CD Play/Pause Button**  
Press to:

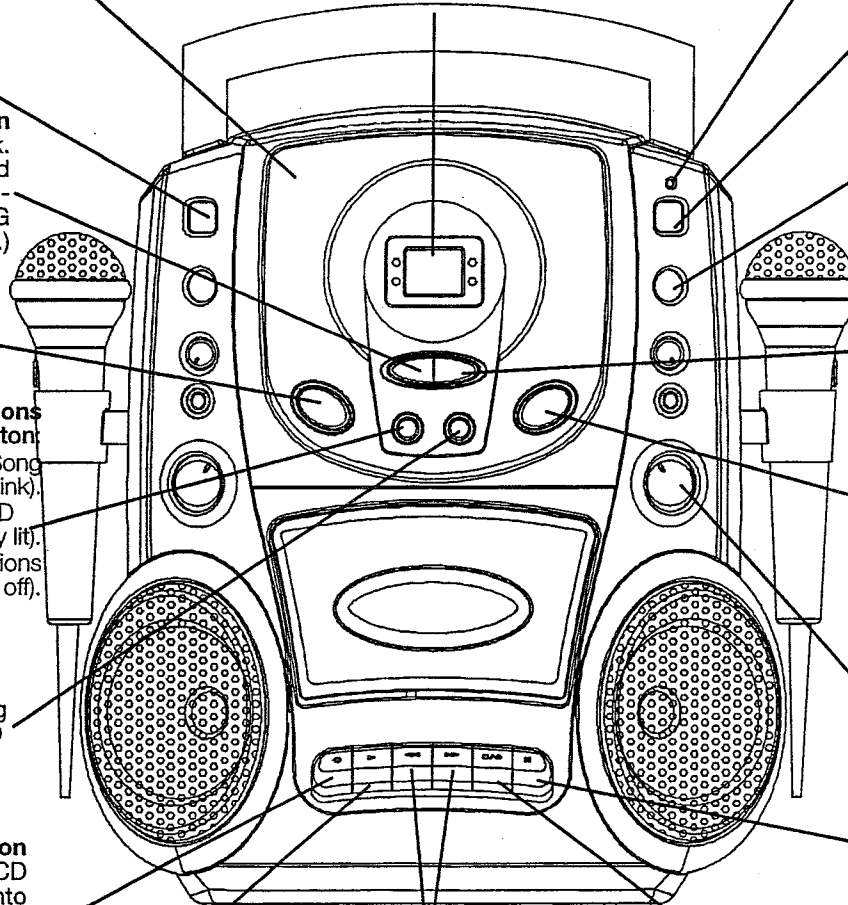
- Start playing CD
- Pause CD while playing
- Restart CD while paused

**Volume Thumbwheel**  
Rotate to raise or lower volume.

**Tape Pause Button**  
Press to pause tape playing. Press again to resume playing.

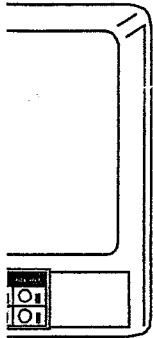
**Tape Stop/Eject Button**  
Press to stop tape playing. Press to open compartment.

**Tape Rewind/Fast Forward Buttons**  
Press buttons to rewind or fast-forward tapes. Press the Stop Button when fully rewound/advanced.



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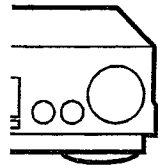
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# Using the Karaoke and Microphone Functions

**Microphone Antennas**  
(Located on back of unit.)  
Extend antennas fully for best reception and broadcast.

**Microphone 1 Level**  
Rotate thumbwheel to adjust volume reception level for Microphone 1.

**Microphone Jack**  
An optional, corded microphone may be plugged into Mic Jack.

**Microphone 1**  
Slide On/Off Switch to "On" to use. Slide to "Off" when finished.

For best results, do not hold mic too close to mouth or speaker.

Note: Both "Mic 1" and "Mic 2" are labeled above On/Off switch.

**Music/Vocal Balance**  
Rotate thumbwheel to adjust music and vocal output levels when playing Karaoke CD's.

## Sing-Along Karaoke and PA

- Play a CD or cassette as instructed.
- For "Public Address" mic use, turn on CD Power but do not load/play CD.
- Slide Mic Switch to "On" and sing or speak into mic.
- Rotate Mic Level and Music/Vocal Balance thumbwheels for best results.

**Playing Karaoke CD's and CDG Discs**  
To play Karaoke CD's, follow the instructions in the Playing Compact Discs section. See the Connecting Unit to a TV/Stereo section for instructions on connecting this unit to a TV for CDG features.

**CD/Tape Power Button**  
Press and lock to turn CD player power on. Release to turn power off, and to use tape player.

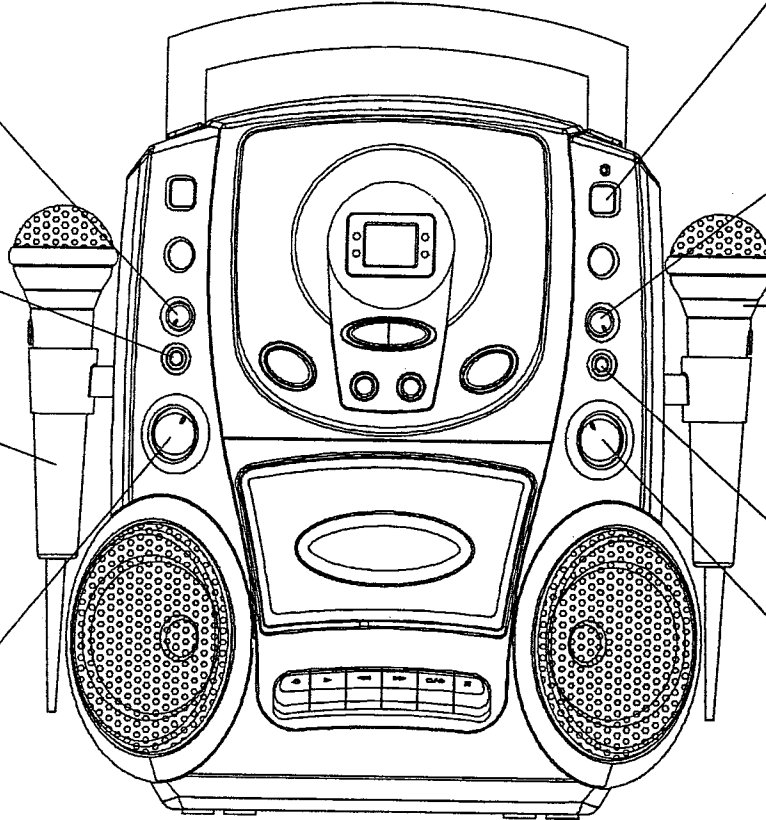
**Microphone 2 Level**  
Rotate thumbwheel to adjust volume reception level for Microphone 2.

**Microphone 2**  
Slide On/Off Switch to "On" to use. Slide to "Off" when finished.

For best results, do not hold mic too close to mouth or speaker.

**Microphone Jack**  
An optional, corded microphone may be plugged into Mic Jack.

**Volume Thumbwheel**  
Rotate to raise or lower volume.



## Recording from Handheld Mic

- Set Power Button to unlocked position.
- Insert the blank tape included in the package (or any blank tape) into player.
- Press Tape Record Button (Tape Play will also engage) to begin recording.
- Slide Mic Switch to "On" and sing or speak into the microphone.
- Press the Tape Stop/Eject Button to stop taping. Press and release the Power Button to turn off unit power.

## Recording from CD and Mic

- Press and lock the Power Button.
- Insert a CD into CD player and a blank tape into cassette player.
- Press Tape Record Button (Tape Play will also engage) to begin recording.
- Slide Mic Switch to "On" and sing along with the music.
- Press the Tape Stop/Eject Button to stop taping. Press and release the Power Button to turn off unit power.
