



## PRODUCT INTRODUCTION

JRC-570 is a multi-function model, which incorporated following features.

- wireless indoor / outdoor temperature reader. It operates in the 433MHz frequency. The outdoor transmitter measures outdoor temperature and transmits data to the indoor main unit for temperature reading display. A temperature sensor also built in the main unit for the indoor temperature measurement.
- It is also a time piece unit featuring Clock, Dual alarm timer.
- It is an AM/FM radio allows you to listen all local broadcast radio stations in your area.

In accordance with FCC requirements, changes or modifications to this unit not expressly approved by the party responsible for compliance could void the user's authority to operate the equipment.


**NOTE:**



### OUTDOOR TRANSMITTER




1. **Transmit indicator**

## INSTALLATION

### Outdoor Transmitter

The Outdoor Transmitter is supplied with a **Wall Mount Bracket** that may be attached to a wall by screw or double sided adhesive tape. The Outdoor Transmitter can be clicked in & out the **Wall Mount Bracket** easily.



## POWER SOURCE

### Battery Operation

*For Clock section of the main unit:*

1. Open the **Clock battery compartment** cover.
2. Follow the polarity diagram shown inside the battery compartment; insert 4 x AAA size batteries (not included).
3. Close the **battery compartment** cover.

*For Radio section of the main unit:*

1. Open the **Radio battery compartment** cover.
2. Follow the polarity diagram shown inside the battery compartment; insert 4 x AA size batteries (not included).
3. Close the **battery compartment** cover.

**Note:** Without installing battery in the Radio battery compartment, where the Alarm timer function cannot be operated (wake to Radio/Alarm sound).

*For Outdoor Transmitter unit:*

1. Release the **Locking knob** of the Outdoor Transmitter.
2. Remove **Battery Cover**.
3. Follow the polarity diagram shown inside the battery compartment; insert 3 x AAA size batteries (not included).
