




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## Impedance Measurement Plot for Head TSL




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## Impedance Measurement Plot for Head TSL

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



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




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## Impedance Measurement Plot for Head TSL





(TEM-Cell:ifi110 EXX, Waveguide:R22)




Uncertainty of Frequency Response of E-field: ±6.3% (k=2)




# Receiving Pattern ( $\phi$ ), $\vartheta = 0^{\circ}$
