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### 2 Test Configuration of Equipment Under Test

### 2.1 Test Mode

Antenna port conducted and radiated test items were performed according to KDB 971168 D01 Power Meas. License Digital Systems v03r01 with maximum output power.

Radiated measurements were performed with rotating EUT in different three orthogonal test planes to find the maximum emission.

Radiated emissions were investigated as following frequency range:

- 1. 30 MHz to 9000 MHz for GSM850 and WCDMA Band V.
- 2. 30 MHz to 18000 MHz for WCDMA Band IV.
- 3. 30 MHz to 19100 MHz for GSM1900 and WCDMA Band II.

All modes and data rates and positions were investigated.

Test modes are chosen to be reported as the worst case configuration below:



### 2.4 Measurement Results Explanation Example

#### For all conducted test items:

The offset level is set in the spectrum analyzer to compensate the RF cable loss and attenuator factor between RF conducted output port and spectrum analyzer. With the offset compensation, the spectrum analyzer reading level will be exactly the RF output level.

The spectrum analyzer offset is derived from RF cable loss and attenuator factor.

Offset = RF cable loss + attenuator factor.

The following shows an offset computation example with RF cable loss 5.3 dB and a 10dB attenuator.

#### Example:

Offset(dB) = RF cable loss(dB) + attenuator factor(dB). = 5.3 + 10 = 15.3 (dB)

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

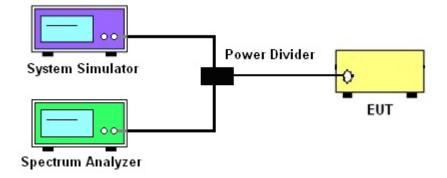

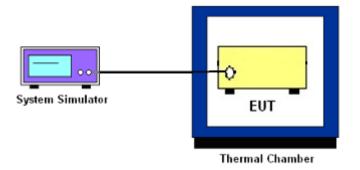

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### 3.4 Conducted Output Power and ERP/EIRP

#### 3.4.1 Description of the Conducted Output Power and ERP/EIRP

A system simulator was used to establish communication with the EUT. Its parameters were set to enforce EUT transmitting at the maximum power. The measured power in the radio frequency on the transmitter output terminals shall be reported.

The ERP of mobile transmitters must not exceed 7 Watts for GSM850 and WCDMA Band V.

The EIRP of mobile transmitters must not exceed 2 Watts for GSM1900 and WCDMA Band II.

The EIRP of mobile transmitters must not exceed 1 Watts for WCDMA Band IV.

According to KDB 412172 D01 Power Approach,

 $EIRP = P_T + G_T - L_C$ , ERP = EIRP - 2.15, where

 $P_T$  = transmitter output power in dBm

 $G_T$  = gain of the transmitting antenna in dBi

L<sub>C</sub> = signal attenuation in the connecting cable between the transmitter and antenna in dB

#### 3.4.2 Test Procedures

- 1. The testing follows ANSI C63.26 Section 5.2
- 2. The transmitter output port was connected to the system simulator.
- 3. Set EUT at maximum power through the system simulator.
- 4. Select lowest, middle, and highest channels for each band and different modulation.
- 5. Measure and record the power level from the system simulator.

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### 3.5 Peak-to-Average Ratio

### 3.5.1 Description of the PAR Measurement

The peak-to-average ratio (PAR) of the transmission may not exceed 13 dB.

#### 3.5.2 Test Procedures

- 1. The testing follows ANSI C63.26 Section 5.2.3.4 (CCDF).
- 2. The EUT was connected to spectrum and system simulator via a power divider.
- 3. Set the CCDF (Complementary Cumulative Distribution Function) option in spectrum analyzer.
- 4. The highest RF powers were measured and recorded the maximum PAPR level associated with a probability of 0.1 %.
- 5. Record the deviation as Peak to Average Ratio.

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3.6 99% Occupied Bandwidth and 26dB Bandwidth Measurement

3.6.1 Description of 99% Occupied Bandwidth and 26dB Bandwidth Measurement

The occupied bandwidth is the width of a frequency band such that, below the lower and above the upper frequency limits, the mean powers emitted are each equal to a specified percentage 0.5% of

the total mean transmitted power.

The 26 dB emission bandwidth is defined as the frequency range between two points, one above and

one below the carrier frequency, at which the spectral density of the emission is attenuated 26 dB

below the maximum in-band spectral density of the modulated signal. Spectral density (power per unit

bandwidth) is to be measured with a detector of resolution bandwidth equal to approximately 1.0% of

the emission bandwidth.

3.6.2 Test Procedures

1. The testing follows ANSI C63.26 Section 5.4

2. The EUT was connected to spectrum analyzer and system simulator via a power divider.

3. The spectrum analyzer center frequency is set to the nominal EUT channel center frequency.

The span range for the spectrum analyzer shall be between two and five times the anticipated

OBW.

4. The nominal resolution bandwidth (RBW) shall be in the range of 1 to 5 % of the anticipated

OBW, and the VBW shall be at least 3 times the RBW.

5. Set the detection mode to peak, and the trace mode to max hold.

6. Determine the reference value: Set the EUT to transmit a modulated signal. Allow the trace to

stabilize. Set the spectrum analyzer marker to the highest level of the displayed trace.

(this is the reference value)

7. Determine the "-26 dB down amplitude" as equal to (Reference Value - X).

8. Place two markers, one at the lowest and the other at the highest frequency of the envelope of

the spectral display such that each marker is at or slightly below the "-X dB down amplitude"

determined in step 6. If a marker is below this "-X dB down amplitude" value it shall be placed

as close as possible to this value. The OBW is the positive frequency difference between the

two markers.

9. Use the 99 % power bandwidth function of the spectrum analyzer and report the measured

bandwidth.

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### 3.7 Conducted Band Edge

#### 3.7.1 Description of Conducted Band Edge Measurement

The power of any emission outside of the authorized operating frequency ranges must be lower than the transmitter power (P) by a factor of at least 43 + 10 log (P) dB.

#### 3.7.2 Test Procedures

- 1. The testing follows ANSI C63.26 section 5.7
- 2. The EUT was connected to the spectrum analyzer and system simulator via a power divider.
- The RF output of EUT was connected to the spectrum analyzer by an RF cable and attenuator.The path loss was compensated to the results for each measurement.
- 4. The band edges of low and high channels for the highest RF powers were measured.
- 5. The RF fundamental frequency should be excluded against the limit line in the operating frequency band.
- 6. The limit line is derived from 43 + 10log(P) dB below the transmitter power P(Watts)

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### 3.8 Conducted Spurious Emission

#### 3.8.1 Description of Conducted Spurious Emission Measurement

The power of any emission outside of the authorized operating frequency ranges must be lower than the transmitter power (P) by a factor of at least 43 + 10 log (P) dB.

It is measured by means of a calibrated spectrum analyzer and scanned from 30 MHz up to a frequency including its 10<sup>th</sup> harmonic.

#### 3.8.2 Test Procedures

- 1. The testing follows ANSI C63.26 section 5.7
- 2. The EUT was connected to the spectrum analyzer and system simulator via a power divider.
- 3. The RF output of EUT was connected to the spectrum analyzer by an RF cable and attenuator. The path loss was compensated to the results for each measurement.
- 4. The middle channel for the highest RF power within the transmitting frequency was measured.
- 5. The conducted spurious emission for the whole frequency range was taken.
- 6. The RF fundamental frequency should be excluded against the limit line in the operating frequency band.
- 7. The limit line is derived from 43 + 10log(P) dB below the transmitter power P(Watts)

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#### 3.9 Frequency Stability

#### 3.9.1 **Description of Frequency Stability Measurement**

The frequency stability shall be measured by variation of ambient temperature and variation of primary supply voltage to ensure that the fundamental emission stays within the authorized frequency block. The frequency stability of the transmitter shall be maintained within ±0.00025% (±2.5ppm) of the center frequency.

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#### 3.9.2 **Test Procedures for Temperature Variation**

- 1. The testing follows ANSI C63.26 section 5.6.4
- 2. The EUT was set up in the thermal chamber and connected with the system simulator.
- With power OFF, the temperature was decreased to -30°C and the EUT was stabilized before testing. Power was applied and the maximum change in frequency was recorded within one minute.
- 4. With power OFF, the temperature was raised in 10°C step up to 50°C. The EUT was stabilized at each step for at least half an hour. Power was applied and the maximum frequency change was recorded within one minute.

#### **Test Procedures for Voltage Variation** 3.9.3

- 1. The testing follows ANSI C63.26 section 5.6.5
- 2. The EUT was placed in a temperature chamber at 20±5°C and connected with the system
- 3. The power supply voltage to the EUT was varied from 85% to 115% of the nominal value for other than hand carried battery equipment.
- 4. For hand carried, battery powered equipment, reduce the primary ac or dc supply voltage to the battery operating end point, which shall be specified by the manufacturer.
- The variation in frequency was measured for the worst case. 5.

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



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### 4.4 Field Strength of Spurious Radiation Measurement

#### 4.4.1 Description of Field Strength of Spurious Radiated Measurement

The power of any emission outside of the authorized operating frequency ranges must be attenuated below the transmitter power (P) by a factor of at least 43 + 10 log (P) dB. The spectrum is scanned from 30 MHz up to a frequency including its 10th harmonic.

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#### 4.4.2 Test Procedures

- 1. The testing follows ANSI C63.26 Section 5.5
- 2. The EUT was placed on a rotatable wooden table 0.8 meters for frequency below 1GHz and 1.5 meter for frequency above 1GHz above the ground.
- 3. The EUT was set 3 meters from the receiving antenna, which was mounted on the antenna tower.
- 4. The table was rotated 360 degrees to determine the position of the highest spurious emission.
- 5. The height of the receiving antenna is varied between one meter and four meters to search for the maximum spurious emission for both horizontal and vertical polarizations.
- 6. Make the measurement with the spectrum analyzer's RBW = 1MHz, VBW = 3MHz, taking record of maximum spurious emission.
- 7. A horn antenna was substituted in place of the EUT and was driven by a signal generator.
- 8. Tune the output power of signal generator to the same emission level with EUT maximum spurious emission.
- 9. Taking the record of output power at antenna port.
- 10. Repeat step 7 to step 8 for another polarization.
- 11. EIRP (dBm) = S.G. Power Tx Cable Loss + Tx Antenna Gain
- 12.ERP (dBm) = EIRP 2.15
- 13. The RF fundamental frequency should be excluded against the limit line in the operating frequency band.
- 14. The limit line is derived from 43 + 10log(P) dB below the transmitter power P(Watts)
