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TEST CONDITIONS

Power supply (V):

Type of power supply = DC voltage supplied by lithium battery

Type of antenna = Integral antenna

TEST FREQUENCIES:

Transmitter channel: 2471 MHz

Receiver channel: 2474 MHz

The test set-up was made in accordance to the general provisions of ANSI C63.4: 2003.

CONDUCTED MEASUREMENTS

The equipment under test was set up in a shielded room and it is connected to the spectrum analyser.

RADIATED MEASUREMENTS

All radiated tests were performed in a semi-anechoic chamber. The measurement antenna is situated at a distance of 3 m for the frequency range 30 MHz-1000 MHz (30 MHz-1000 MHz Bilog antenna) and at a distance of 1m for the frequency range 1 GHz-25 GHz (1 GHz-18 GHz Double ridge horn antenna and 18 GHz-40 GHz horn antenna).

For radiated emissions in the range 1 GHz-25 GHz that is performed at a distance closer than the specified distance, an inverse proportionality factor of 20 dB per decade is used to normalize the measured data for determining compliance.

The equipment under test was set up on a non-conductive (wooden) platform one meter above the ground plane and the situation and orientation was varied to find the maximum radiated emission. It was also rotated 360° and the antenna height was varied from 1 to 4 meters to find the maximum radiated emission.














FREQUENCY RANGE 30 MHz-1000 MHz.






FREQUENCY RANGE 1 GHz to 3 GHz.



Note: The peak shown in the plot is the carrier frequency.




FREQUENCY RANGE 3 GHz to 12.75 GHz.







FREQUENCY RANGE 12.75 GHz to 18 GHz.



FREQUENCY RANGE 18 GHz to 25 GHz.








FREQUENCY RANGE 2.31 GHz to 2.39 GHz. (RESTRICTED BAND)






FREQUENCY RANGE 30 MHz-1000 MHz.






FREQUENCY RANGE 1 GHz-12.75 GHz.







FREQUENCY RANGE 12.75 GHz-18 GHz.



FREQUENCY RANGE 18 GHz-25 GHz.








FREQUENCY RANGE 2.31 GHz to 2.39 GHz. (RESTRICTED BAND)




