



The nüvi case is constructed of high quality materials and does not require user maintenance except cleaning.

Cleaning the Case

Clean the nüvi's outer casing (except for the screen) using a cloth dampened with a mild detergent solution and then wipe dry. Avoid chemical cleaners and solvents that may damage plastic components.

Cleaning the Screen

The nuvi screen should be cleaned using a soft, clean, lint-free cloth. Water, isopropyl alcohol, or eyeglass cleaner can be used if needed. If these are used, apply the liquid to the cloth and then gently wipe the screen with the moistened cloth.

Storage

Do not store the nüvi where prolonged exposure to temperature extremes may occur (such as in the trunk of a car) as permanent damage may result.













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Failure to avoid the following potentially hazardous situations may result in injury or property damage.

The nüvi is designed to provide you with route suggestions. It does not reflect road closures or road conditions, traffic congestion, weather conditions, or other factors that may affect safety or timing while driving.

Use the nüvi only as a navigational aid. Do not attempt to use the nüvi for any purpose requiring precise measurement of direction, distance, location, or topography. This product should not be used to determine ground proximity for aircraft navigation.

The Global Positioning System (GPS) is operated by the United States government, which is solely responsible for its accuracy and maintenance. The government's system is subject to changes which could affect the accuracy and performance of all GPS equipment, including the nüvi. Although the nüvi is a precision navigation device, any navigation device can be misused or misinterpreted and, therefore, become unsafe.



To turn your nüvi on or off, press and hold the **Power** button **(b)** on the top of the unit. The first time you turn on your nüvi, follow the on-screen, set-up instructions.

Charging Your nüvi

To charge the nüvi:

Connect your nuvi to the suction mount and the 12/24-volt car adapter.

OR


Connect your nuvi to the USB cable and your computer.

Resetting Your nüvi

If your unit locks up (freezes up), press the **Power** button to turn off the unit, then press again to turn the unit back on. If this does not help, reset your nüvi.

To reset the nüvi:

- 1. Raise the antenna.
- 2. Press the Reset button.









Hold your finger on the upper right corner of the nüvi's screen while turning on the nüvi. Keep your finger pressed until the pop-up window appears. Touch **Yes** to clear all user data.

All original settings are restored. Your Recent Selections and audible bookmarks are also deleted.

Adjusting the Volume and Brightness

Press and quickly release the **Power** button or touch on the Menu page to access the Quick Settings. Move the sliders to adjust the volume and brightness. Touch **Mute** to turn the volume off.



Locking the Screen

To prevent accidental screen taps, touch **Lock**. To unlock the screen, press the **Power** button.

nüvi Tips and Shortcuts

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
- To quickly return to the Menu page, press and hold **Back**.
- To learn more about the nüvi's Bluetooth or Travel Kit features, touch the **Help** button on the appropriate screen.
- To jump from any page back to the player page when you are listening to music or an audible book, quickly press the **Power** button twice. Press **Back** to return to the previous page you were viewing (such as the map).
- To extend the battery life, close the antenna when you do not need to receive GPS signals. If the antenna is closed, the GPS receiver is turned off.
- To access the Quick Settings, quickly press and release the **Power** button.
 - To adjust the volume and brightness, move the sliders . You can also touch on the Menu page to adjust the levels.



 To prevent accidental screen taps, touch Lock. To unlock the screen, press the Power button and touch Unlock.







For a tight grip, clean and dry your windshield and the suction cup with a lint-free cloth before mounting the suction cup.

To mount the suction cup mount:

- 1. Place the suction cup on the windshield.
- 2. Flip the lever back, toward the windshield.
- 3. Open the antenna. Fit the bottom of your nüvi into the cradle.
- 4. Tilt your nüvi back until it snaps in place. If necessary, rotate the cradle.
- 5. Plug the small end of the cable into the back of the mount; plug the other end into a 12/24-Volt receptacle in your vehicle.









If you are using the external microphone (optional), plug the microphone into the right side of the nüvi cradle.

To remove your nüvi from the cradle, press the small tab on the bottom of the cradle up, and tilt the nüvi forward.

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

Finding Your Destination

Flip up the antenna on the nüvi to get satellite signals. Then, use the Garmin nüvi to find your destination and go to it.

Enjoy the route!






Follow the route to your destination using the Map page. As you travel, the nüvi guides you to your destination with voice prompts, arrows on the map, and directions at the top of the Map page. If you depart from the original route, the nüvi recalculates the route and provides new route instructions.



Your route is marked with a magenta line.



Follow the arrows as you take turns.



A checkered flag marks your destination.

NOTE: You can add only one via point to your route.





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From the Menu page, touch **View Map** to open the Map page. The position icon **A** shows your location. Touch and drag the map to view different areas.



GPS Satellite Signals

The bars in the upper left corner represent the satellite signals being received by your nüvi. When you see green bars, you have a strong signal. See page xx for more information







Adding Stops to Your Route

You can add a stop (via point) to your route. The nüvi gives you directions to the via point and then to your final destination. With a route active, touch **Menu** > **Q Where to?**





With a route active, touch








Search for the extra stop.





Touch Go!





Touch **Yes** to add this stop before your destination.

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Setting a Home Location

You can set a Home location for the place you return to most often. After you have set your Home, you can easily **Go Home**.







Touch Where to? > My Locations.

Touch Set Home.

Select an option.

Going Home

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Once your Home location is set, you can route to it at any time by touching **My**Locations and then Go Home.

Changing Your Home Location

Change your Home location by repeating the steps above.







Editing Saved Places

After you save a place, you can change the name of the place and its symbol on the map. From the Menu page, touch Where to? > My Locations.





Touch Favorites.




Select the place you want to edit.





Touch the **Edit** button. The Edit window opens.





Touch a button to change the name or the map symbol, or to delete the item.

Changing the Name

To change the name, touch **Change Name**. Enter the new name using the on-screen keyboard. Touch **Done**.

Changing the Map Symbol

To change the symbol used on the map, touch **Change Map Symbol** and select a symbol from the list.

Deleting Saved Places

To delete this saved place, touch **Delete**. Then touch **Yes**.









Tips for Browsing the Map

- Touch the map and drag to view different parts of the map.
- Use the + and icons to zoom in and out.
- Touch any object on the map. An arrow appears pointing at the object you selected.
- Touch **Go** to navigate to the selected location.
- Touch Save to save this location to your Favorites.
- If the GPS if turned off, touch Set Loc. to set your location to the selected location.
- Touch **Back** to return to the previous screen.

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Viewing Places on the Map

You can view a place you have found on the Map page.





Touch Show Map.





Drag the map and zoom in or out as necessary. Touch **Back** when you are done.











From the Menu page, touch Where to?
Then touch Near.





Select an option. Touch **OK**.



Where I Am Now—searches for places near your current location.

A Different City—searches for places near the city you enter.

My Current Route—searches for places along the route you are currently navigating.

My Destination—searches for places near your route destination.

NOTE: Your nüvi automatically searches for places near your current location.



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Saving Places You Find



After you have found a place you want to save, touch



Touch **OK** in the pop-up window. The place is saved in **My Locations** > **Favorites**.

From the Menu page, touch Where to? > My Locations > Favorites.





Select a place.





Touch Go!

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To learn how to perform a simple search using the Where To menu, see page x.

Finding a Place by Spelling the Name



Using the on-screen keyboard, enter letters contained in the name. Then touch **Done**.





Select the place you want to visit.

Touch Go!

Touch 123 to enter numbers. Touch 1 to delete the last character entered; touch and hold 1 to delete the entire entry.

Tip: In any search results list, if you do not see the place you want visit or you want to narrow your search results list, touch *Spell* and enter the name or part of the name.







Go! Page Options



Touch Go! to create a turn-by-turn route to this location.

Touch **Show Map** to view this location on the map.

Touch **Save** to save this location as one of your Favorites. See pages 9 through 12 for more information.

Saving Your Current Location

Touch anywhere on the Map. An arrow points to your current location. Touch **Save**. Your current location is saved in your Favorites.







Trip Information Page

The Trip Information page displays your current speed and provides helpful statistics about your trip. To view the Trip Information page, select **Speed** or **Arrival** on the Map page.



Trip Information Page

Resetting Trip Information

If you want accurate trip information, reset the trip information before beginning a trip. If you make frequent stops, leave the nüvi turned on so it can accurately measure elapsed time during the trip.

Select **Reset Trip** to reset the information on the Trip Information page. Select **Reset Max** to reset the Maximum Speed.












Current Route Page

The Current Route page displays turn-by-turn instructions for your entire route. Touch the green text bar on the top of the Map page to open the Current Route page. This page displays all turns in the route and the distance between turns. Select a turn on the list to view the Next Turn page for that turn. Touch **Map** to view the entire route on the map.









Next Turn Page

The Next Turn page shows the turn on the map and the distance and time left before you reach the turn. To view an upcoming turn on the map, select **Turn In** on the Map page, or select any turn from the Current Route page.

Use the up and down arrows to view other turns in the route. When you are finished viewing the Next Turn page, select **Back**.







Adding a Detour to a Route

If you need to take a detour from your current route, select **Detour** from the Menu page of the nüvi. The unit calculates a new route and provides you with new instructions. The nüvi attempts to get you back on your original route as soon as possible.





Select **Menu** to return to the Menu page.





Select **Stop** to end navigation. Select **Detour** and your unit creates a new route if possible.

On some routes, the route you are currently taking might be the only reasonable option. In this case, you cannot take a detour.

Stopping Your Route

If you want to stop your current route, return to the Menu page and select **Stop**.



Finding an Address

From the Menu page, touch Where to? > Address.





Select a state. Then select **Search All**.





Type the address number and touch **Done**.





Type the street name until a list of streets appears, or touch **Done**.





Select the street.





Select a city, if necessary.





Select the address, if necessary. Touch Go!







NOTE: Finding an intersection is very similar to finding an address. Touch **Intersection** and enter the two street names.








Using BlueTooth® Technology

To use the Bluetooth technology of the nüvi, you must confirm that your Bluetooth phone is supported by the nüvi. (See www.garmin.com/bluetooth/.) Then you must follow these steps to pair your phone with this nüvi.





On the Menu page, touch 3 Settings





Select your phone and touch OK, or touch Add Device and OK.






Touch . and then touch Bluetooth.













If adding, set your phone to Find Me/Discoverable mode, and touch OK. Enter passkey 1234 on your phone, when prompted. The - Phone and Bluetooth icons appear on the Menu page if the pairing is successful.

Dial the number, and touch Dial. To end the call, touch (?), and then touch End Call .







If you are calling a number that requires that you enter information using a keypad during the call (for example, entering a password for your voicemail), do the following.













Placing a POI Call

Ensure that your phone is paired with your nüvi. You can call a phone number for any POI (Point of Interest) that is listed on the nuvi.







Touch POI Dial.



Select a category.




Select a POI from the list.



Touch the POI function that you want to use.











Receiving a Call

Ensure that your phone is paired with your nuvi. When you receive a call, an "Incoming Call" message appears on the nuvi. Touch **Answer**. To end the call, touch and then touch end call.







Connect the mini-USB connector to the side of the nüvi. Connect the larger end of the cable to an available USB port on your computer.

Double-click the My Computer icon on your computer's desktop. Two new Removable Disk drives appear in your list of drives: "nuvi" and "nuvi sd." "nuvi" is the available storage in the nüvi's internal memory. "nuvi sd" is the SD card inserted in your nüvi. If you do not have an SD card inserted in your nüvi, the "nuvi sd" drive does not appear in the list.

Double-click one of the nüvi drives to open it. Copy and paste files into the drive.

To disconnect, double-click the **Unplug or Eject Hardware** icon from your Windows® system tray. Click **Stop** and then **OK**.









Using a Garmin GTM 10 or GTM 11 FM TMC Traffic Receiver, the nüvi can receive and use traffic information broadcast over the FM Radio Data System. For more information about these Garmin FM TMC Traffic Receivers, visit http://www.garmin.com/.

Connecting the FM TMC Traffic Receiver to Your nüvi

Place your nüvi into the mount, and plug it into the 12/24-volt adapter. Plug the USB cable from the GTM 10 or GTM 11 into the USB cable connector on the side of the nüvi

Viewing Traffic Events

From the Menu page, touch **1** to display a list of traffic events. The traffic symbols appear on the Map as well.

You must have Adobe Reader installed on your computer to view this manual.








Your nüvi is able to store files, such as JPEG images and MP3 music files. You can store files in the nüvi's internal memory or on an optional SD Card.

After you connect your nüvi to your computer, you can copy and paste files to the memory or an optional SD Card. Follow the four steps described below and on the next page.

Step 1: Insert an SD Card (Optional)

The SD card slot is located on the side of the nüvi. To insert or remove the card, press it in until it clicks





Step 2: Connect the USB Cable

- 1. Plug the small end of the USB cable into the connector located on the side of your nüvi.
- 2. Connect the larger end of the USB cable to an available USB port on your computer.








Step 3: Transfer Files to Your nüvi

- 1. Connect the nüvi to your computer as described on the previous page.
- Double-click the My Computer icon on your computer's desktop.
- 3. Browse your computer for the file you want to copy.
- 4. Highlight the file and select **Edit** > **Copy**.
- 5. Open the "nuvi" or "nuvi sd" drive (see the next page for information).
- Select Edit > Paste. The file then appears in the list of files on the nüvi memory or SD card.



Step 4: Eject and Unplug the USB Cable

When you are finished transferring files, double-click the **Unplug or Eject** icon in your system tray. Select "USB Mass Storage Device" and click **Stop**. Select the nüvi drives and click **OK**. You can disconnect your nüvi from your computer now.








Information about Your nüvi Drives

After you connect your nüvi to your computer, one or two additional drives appear in your computer's list of drives: "nuvi" and possibly "nuvi sd."

"nuvi" is the available storage in the nüvi's internal memory. "nuvi sd" is the SD card inserted in your nüvi. If you do not have an SD card inserted in your nüvi, the "nuvi sd" drive does not appear in the list.



NOTE: On some Windows Operating Systems, the nüvi drives may not be named automatically. See your Windows help file or page 56 of this manual to learn how to rename the drives

Deleting Files from Your nüvi

You can delete files from your nüvi just as you would delete files from your computer.

With the nüvi connected to your computer, open My Computer. Open your "nuvi" or "nuvi sd" drive. Highlight the file that you want to delete from your nüvi and press the **Delete** key on your computer's keyboard.

Supported File Types

- MP3 music files
- JPG image files
- AA audible book files
- GPI custom POI files from Garmin's POI Loader (see page 51)
- GPX waypoint files from MapSource (see page 54)
- Maps from MapSource
- **(i) NOTE:** The nüvi does not support iTunes M4A/M4P files.
- (i) CAUTION: If you are not sure about a file's purpose, do *NOT* delete it. Your nüvi memory contains important map data files that should *NOT* be deleted. Be especially cautious of files located in folders entitled "Garmin."





Using the Travel Kit

The travel kit provides many features that are helpful when you are traveling across town or across the globe. Touch **Help** to learn more about the nüvi Travel Kit.



From the Menu page, touch **Travel Kit**.



Touch the arrows to view all items in the Travel Kit. Touch the item you want to open.







Using the Language Guide 📔

The Garmin Language Guide puts data from Oxford's multilingual resources and five bilingual dictionaries in the palm of your hand. A sample version of the Garmin Language Guide is provided. To purchase the Garmin Language Guide accessory, go to the Garmin Web site at http://www.garmin.com/products/nuvi/ and click the Accessories link. You can also contact your Garmin dealer to purchase nüvi accessories





From the Menu page, touch **Travel Kit**.





Touch the arrows to view all items in the Travel Kit. Touch the item you want to open.

NOTE: Only nüvi 360 models can verbally translate words and phrases in the Language Guide.

Loading the Language Guide

After you have received your Garmin Language Guide SD Card, you must load the

data on your nüvi. Follow the directions on the package or in the nüvi help file to learn how to load the data into your unit.

TIP: After you load the Garmin Language Guide onto your nüvi, you can use the SD card for other data, such as MP3s or Audible Books.

Words and Phrases Tips

- Use Keywords in Phrases to find all of the phrases that contain a specific word
- Touch Search to spell the word.
- Touch an underlined word to replace the word.
- Touch More Variations to change words in the phrase or get a different translation
- If you cannot find what you are looking for in **Words and Phrases**, look in the **Bilingual Dictionaries**.

SaversGuide® (Optional)

With the SaversGuide preprogrammed SD data card and membership card, your nüvi becomes a digital coupon book that notifies you of merchants near your current location where you are eligible for a discount such as restaurants, hotels, stores, dry cleaners, movie theatres, and auto repair shops. To purchase the SaversGuide accessory, go to the Garmin Web site at http://www.garmin.com/products/nuvi/ and click the **Accessories** link. You can also contact your Garmin dealer to purchase nüvi accessories.





Using the Bilingual Dictionaries

The Garmin Language Guide provides five bilingual dictionaries. You can easily translate words and hear their pronunciation using the Bilingual Dictionaries.

- 1. On the Menu page, touch Travel Kit > Language Guide.
- 2. On the Oxford page, touch Bilingual Dictionaries.
- 3. On the Select a dictionary page, touch a translation option. If necessary, touch **To English**.
- 4. On the Select Word page, search for the word and touch it.
- 5. On the Translation page, touch (1) to hear the word spoken.

Bilingual Tips

- Touch **Search** to spell the word or the beginning of the word.
- Touch Legend to view the legend for the selected language. The Legend contains information on abbreviations, labels, and pronunciation symbols used in each dictionary.





Using the Travel Guide 🍱



Much like a paper travel guide, the Garmin Travel Guide provides detailed information about places, such as restaurants and hotels. Your nüvi comes with a few sample travel guide points; to purchase the Travel Guide accessory, go to the Garmin Web site at http://www.garmin.com/products/nuvi/ and click the Accessories link. You can also contact your Garmin dealer to purchase nüvi accessories.

- 1. From the Menu page, touch Travel Kit > Touch Travel Guide.
- On the Marco Polo page, touch Browse.
- On the Select Sample Location page, touch a location.
- 4. On the Category List page, touch a category. Touch a sub-category, if necessary.
- On the List page, touch an entry.
- 6. On the Information page, touch the arrows to view more information about the location. Touch Go to go to the location. Touch Map to display this item on a map.







Listening to MP3 Files



From the Menu page, touch **Travel Kit**.





Select a category.





Touch DMP3 Player.





To play the entire category, touch **Play All**. To play one song, touch the title.





Touch Browse.






Touch **Back** to exit the MP3 page to view other pages, such as the map.

Touch **1** to adjust the volume.

Tap to go to the beginning of the song; touch and hold to skip back.



Touch to pause the song.

Touch to repeat. Touch to shuffle.

When you are listening to music or an audible book, quickly press the **Power** button twice to jump from any page back to the player page. Press **Back** to return to the previous page you were viewing (such as the map).

NOTE: The nüvi plays MP3 files only: it does not support iTunes M4A/M4P files.

Playing Audible Books

Your nüvi provides sample Audible books, which are only portions of the book. Purchase full books from Audible.com at http://garmin.audible.com.

- 1. On the Menu page, touch Travel Kit > Audible Book Player.
- Touch Browse.
- Touch a book title.
- 4. Touch 🕟

Touch (6) to adjust the volume.

Tap 🕶 to jump back. Tap 🕟 to skip ahead. Press and hold to move more quickly.

Touch to pause the book.

Touch the book cover art to view book information.



Using Bookmarks

To create a bookmark, touch and **Bookmark**. To view your bookmarks, touch and then touch a bookmark. Touch to listen to the book from the bookmark.

Moving around the Book



Press and hold and to move forward or backward through the book.

Touch the book cover art to view information about the book.

Loading Audible Books to Your nüvi

To purchase a book, go to http://garmin.audible.com and create an Audible.com account. After you create an account, download AudibleManager to your personal computer. Then you can purchase a book and download it to your nüvi.

Before you can listen to an audible book, you must activate your nüvi. The first time you open AudibleManager, you are led through the activation process. See page 29 for more information

After activating your nüvi, follow these three steps to load an audible book to your nüvi: connect your nüvi to your computer, download the book to your computer, and





transfer the book to your nüvi.

Step 1: Connect your nüvi to the computer

- 1. Connect the mini-USB connector to the side of the nüvi.
- 2. Connect the larger end of the cable to an available USB port on your computer.
- 3. If you want to load the book on your SD card, insert the SD card in the slot in your nüvi.

- 1. From your computer's desktop, double-click the AudibleManager icon to open AudibleManager.

- 3. Click Get it Now to download the book to your computer.
- 4. Select a format and click **Download**.

Units—change units of measure to kilometers (Metric) or miles (Statute).

Safe Mode—disable or enable the Safe Mode feature to improve driver safety. When your vehicle is moving, Safe Mode disables all unit functions that require significant





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operator attention and could become a distraction while driving.

Touch Tones—disable or enable the tone that sounds each time you touch the screen.

Proximity Alarms—disable or enable the alerts when you approach Custom POIs. This option is only visible if you have loaded Custom POIs. See page 51 for more information about Custom POIs.

About—display your nüvi's software version number, unit ID number, and audio version number. This information is needed when you update the system software (see page 53) or purchase additional map data (see page 54).

Restore—restore the original system settings.

Changing the Time Settings

Time Format—choose a 12-hour, 24-hour, or UTC time format.

Time Zone—select a time zone or nearby city from the list.

Daylight Saving—set to On, Off, or Auto if it is available.

Restore Settings—restore the original time settings.

Changing the Display Settings

Color Mode—select Daytime for a light background, Nighttime for a black background, or Auto to automatically switch between the two.

Backlight Timeout—select the length of time the backlight stays on after external





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power is removed. Reducing the time the backlight stays on increases your battery life

Touch Screen—recalibrates (or realigns) the touch screen to respond properly. Touch **Recalibrate** and then follow the directions

PictureIt—enables you to take a screen shot when you quickly press and release the **Power** button. The screen shots are saved in the "PictureIt" folder on your "nuvi" drive

NOTE: When PictureIt is On, the Quick Settings screen does not open when you press the *Power* button.

Changing the Navigation Settings

Route Preference—select a preference for calculating your route. Select Faster Time to calculate routes that are faster to drive but can be longer in distance. Select Shorter Distance to calculate routes that are shorter in distance but can take more time to drive.

Vehicle—specify your vehicle type to optimize routes.

Avoidances—touch the Enabled button to access the road types. Select the road types you want to avoid on your routes. The nüvi uses these road types only if alternative routes take you too far out of your way or if no other roads are available. If you have an FM TMC Traffic Receiver, you can also avoid traffic incidents.

Attention Tone—turn on or off the attention tone.

Voice Prompts—select when you want to nüvi to announce route navigation and system status.

Restore Settings—restore the original navigation settings.

Changing the Language Settings

Text Language—change all on-screen text to the selected language. Changing the Text Language does not change the language of map data, such as street names and places or user-entered data.

Voice Language—change the language for all voice prompts and messages.

If you have a nüvi 310, your nüvi contains pre-recorded voices that have a limited vocabulary and do not speak names of locations or streets.

If you have a nüvi 360, your nüvi contains text-to-speech (TTS) voices: for example, American English-Jill is a text-to-speech voice. The text-to-speech voices "read" and "speak" the same words that are displayed on the nüvi. The voices have an extensive vocabulary, and they pronounce the street names as you approach turns.

Restore Settings—restore the original language settings.







Using an optional Garmin FM TMC Traffic Receiver, your nuvi can receive and use traffic information broadcast over the FM Radio Data System (RDS). When a traffic message is received, your unit displays the event on the map and can change your route to avoid the traffic incident. For more information about the FM TMC Traffic Receiver, visit the Garmin Web site (www.garmin.com). For participating subscription providers, refer to the Garmin Web site at http://www.garmin.com/fmtraffic.

Connecting the FM TMC Traffic Receiver to Your nüvi

Place your nüvi in the auto mount and plug into the 12-volt adapter. Plug the Traffic Receiver's mini-USB cable into the mini-USB connector located on the side of the nüvi.

NOTE: You can only access the traffic information and settings if the nüvi is connected to external power and an FM TMC Traffic Receiver, such as a GTM 10.

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APPENDIX

Mounting the nüvi on Your Dashboard

Use the enclosed mounting disk to mount your unit to the dashboard. California drivers, use the enclosed disk to comply with California regulations: see the *nüvi Product Information Sheet* that came in the box for more information.

Important: The **permanent** mounting adhesive is extremely difficult to remove after it is installed.

To install the mounting disk:

- 1. Clean and dry the dashboard where you will place the disk.
- 2. Remove the backing from the permanent mounting adhesive on the bottom of the disk and place the disk on the dashboard.
- 3. Place the suction cup mount on top of the disk
- 4. Flip the suction lever down to secure the suction cup mount to the disk.









Removing the Unit and the Mount

- 1. To remove the unit from the mount, press the tab on the bottom of the cradle up.
- 2. Lift the unit off of the mount.
- 3. To remove the suction cup from the windshield, flip the lever toward you.
- 4. Pull the tab on the suction cup toward you.

Removing the Cradle from the Mount

To remove the cradle from the mount arm, turn the cradle to one side. The cradle will snap off the ball socket.

To replace the cradle, snap the cradle on the ball socket.



Your nüvi accepts custom points of interest (POI) databases, available from various companies on the Internet. Some custom POI databases contain alert information for points such as safety cameras and school zones. Your nüvi can notify you with a proximity alarm when you approach one of these points.

After downloading your POI database, use the Garmin POI Loader to install the POIs into your unit. The POI Loader is available at http://www.garmin.com/products/nuvi. Select **Updates and Downloads**.

Using the POI Loader program, you can store the Custom POIs on your "nuvi" drive or your SD card. You can also customize the proximity alert settings for each POI using the POI Loader. Refer to the POI Loader Help File for more information; press F1 to open the Help File.

To view your Custom POIs, touch My Locations > Custom POIs.

To delete the Custom POIs from your nüvi, touch **Where To?** from the Menu page. Touch **My Locations** > **Delete All**. Touch **Yes** to delete all of your Favorites and your Custom POIs.

Adjusting the Proximity Alarms

To turn on or off the proximity alarms, from the Menu page, touch > **System** > **Proximity Alarms**.









When the Proximity Alarms are on, your nüvi chimes when you approach a Custom POI.

(i) CAUTION: Garmin is not responsible for the consequences of using a custom POI database or the accuracy of the safety camera or other custom POI database.

Caring for Your nüvi

Your nüvi contains sensitive electronic components that can be permanently damaged if exposed to excessive shock or vibration. To minimize the risk of damage to your nüvi, avoid dropping your unit and operating it in high shock/vibration environments.

Cleaning the Unit

The nüvi is constructed of high quality materials and does not require user maintenance other than cleaning. Clean the unit's outer casing (not the touch screen) using a cloth dampened with a mild detergent solution and then wipe dry. Avoid chemical cleaners and solvents that can damage plastic components.







Clean the touch screen with a soft, clean, lint-free cloth. Use water, isopropyl alcohol, or eyeglass cleaner, if needed. Apply the liquid to the cloth and then gently wipe the touch screen.

Protecting Your nüvi

Follow the cautions below to protect your nüvi from damage:

- Do not store the nüvi where prolonged exposure to extreme temperatures can occur (such as in the trunk of a car), as permanent damage may result.
- Do not expose the nüvi to water. Contact with water can cause this unit to malfunction.
- Do not leave your nüvi in plain sight when you leave your vehicle. Take your unit with you or remove it from view to avoid theft.
- Though a PDA stylus can also be used to operate the touch screen, never attempt this while operating a vehicle. Never use a hard or sharp object to operate the touch screen or damage may result.

Using the nüvi Indoors

Close the antenna to turn off GPS and use your nuvi indoors. Use this setting when you are practicing using the unit or using the Travel Kit features, such as using the MP3 player.

Using a Remote Antenna

You can use an optional external remote antenna (Garmin GA 27C). This is very helpful when operating the unit in a vehicle with a coated windshield or an in-screen





(in the window) heating system, which can block GPS signals. Connect the antenna to the connector located on the back of the nüvi. To purchase, go to the Garmin Web site at http://www.garmin.com/products/nuvi and select the **Accessories** link.

Changing the Fuse

An AGC/3AG 2 Amp, high-breaking capacity, 1500 A-rated fuse is located at the tip of the vehicle adapter. Periodically, you may need to change the fuse. Unscrew the black, round end piece and replace the fuse.



Charging the nüvi

You can charge the nüvi using the USB cable (see page 17) or the 12/24-Volt car adapter connected to the suction mount.

Updating the nüvi Software

Garmin periodically updates its software and map data. If you register your unit, you will receive notification of software and map updates. To see if an update to the nüvi's system software is available, go to http://www.garmin.com/products/nuvi and



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select **Software Updates**. To see if an update for your map software is available, go to http://www.garmin.com/unlock/update.jsp.

Purchasing Additional MapSource Maps

You can purchase additional MapSource map data from Garmin and load the maps on your nüvi's internal memory or on an optional SD card. Follow the instructions that came with the new map data to properly install the maps to your computer and nüvi. In order to enable additional maps, you need your unit ID (see page 38) and serial number (see page i). To load maps to your nüvi memory or SD card, select the name for your "nuvi" drive or SD card drive. Refer to the MapSource help file for more information about using MapSource and loading maps on your Garmin GPS.

Loading MapSource Waypoints on Your nüvi

Using MapSource, you can save locations (also called waypoints) and transfer them to your nüvi. For more information about creating waypoints in MapSource, see the help file (press F1 to open the help file).

After you have created the waypoints, select File > Save. Select GPS eXchange Format (*.gpx) for the Save as Type. Click the Save button.

With your nüvi connected to your computer, copy the *.gpx file into in the **Garmin\ Waypoints** folder in the "nuvi" drive. The waypoints you created in MapSource are now in **My Locations** > **Favorites**.







Viewing Your Saved Locations in MapSource

You can also view the locations you have saved in your nüvi using the MapSource program.

In MapSource, select File > Open. Select GPS eXchange Format (*.gpx) for Files of Type. Browse to find the Garmin\Waypoints folder on your "nuvi" drive. Select Waypoints.gpx and click Open.

Battery Information

Your unit contains an internal (non-removable) lithium-ion battery. Contact your local waste disposal department for information on properly disposing of the unit.

Battery Tips

- Your nüvi's battery should last 4 to 8 hours depending on usage. The battery gauge indicates the status of the battery.
- To extend the battery life, reduce the time the backlight stays on. From the Menu page, select **Settings** > **Display** > **Backlight Timeout** to change the setting. See page 40.
- To extend the battery life, close the antenna when you do not need to receive GPS signals.
- To increase the accuracy of the battery gauge, fully discharge the battery and then fully charge it. You should not need to do this very often. See "Battery Gauge" in the side bar for more information.
- To maximize the life of the lithium-ion battery, do not leave your nüvi direct sunlight and avoid prolonged exposure to excessive heat.



The battery icon in the upper right corner of the Menu page indicates the status of the internal battery.










Periodically, you might notice that the battery gauge is not completely accurate. To increase the accuracy of the battery gauge, fully discharge the battery and then fully charge it without interrupting the charging. For best results, do not unplug the nüvi until it is totally charged.

About Satellite Signals

Your nüvi must acquire satellite signals to operate. If you are indoors, near tall buildings or trees, or in a parking garage, the nüvi cannot acquire satellites. Go outside to an area free from tall obstructions to use your nüvi, or close the antenna to








turn off GPS and use it indoors.

When the nüvi has acquired satellite signals, the signal strength bars on the Menu page are green When it loses satellite signals, the bars turn red or disappear

Touch the signals strength bars in the upper left corner of the Menu page to view GPS information. Touch any where on the screen to return to the Menu page.



The sky view shows the satellites you are receiving. The satellite signal strength bars indicate the strength of each satellite you are receiving.


