
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Equipment Function

The EUT is a Mode A and Mode S Avionics transponder. The design is provided in two versions, panel mount and remote mounted designs for installation in an aircraft. The transponder operates on aviation-defined frequencies, receiving radar interrogations at 1030 MHz and transmitting a coded response of pulses back at 1090 MHz. The transponder design provides a coded response when an interrogation signal is received from outside the craft. The coded response provides others the ability to identify the aircraft. The design also incorporates a low power transmitter providing additional wireless connectivity inside the aircraft. The low power transmitter operates in the 2402-2480 MHz unlicensed services band and provides wireless communications with compatible equipment. The panel and remote mounted designs utilize an internal chip antenna. The remote mounted design can be configured to disconnect from the internal chip antenna and connect to an external stub antenna provided by the manufacturer. The End user of the transponder Antenna configuration is determined by the installer during the installation process, with the end user of the transponder not having access to make modifications. The low power communications provide connectivity with compatible Bluetooth® modes including Basic Rate (GFSK), 2EDR (PI/4 DQPSK), 3EDR (8DPSK), and BLE (GMSK). Test results in this report relate only to the products described in this report. This report documents compliance of the low power license-exempt 2402-2480 MHz transmitter operations.

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Applicable Standards & Test Procedures

In accordance with the e-CFR Code of Federal Regulations Title 47, dated November 13, 2018: Part 2, Subpart J, Paragraphs 2.907, 2.911, 2.913, 2.925, 2.926, 2.1031 through 2.1057, and applicable parts of paragraph 15, Part 15C Paragraph 15.249 operation in the 2400 – 2483.5 MHz Frequency band. Test procedures used are the established Methods of Measurement of Radio-Noise Emissions as described in ANSI C63.10-2013.

Testing Procedures

AC Line Conducted Emission Test Procedure

The EUT operates on direct current power only provided by the aircraft installation. Therefore, no AC line conducted emission testing was required or performed.

Radiated Emission Test Procedure


Radiated emissions testing was performed as required in 47 CFR 15C and specified in ANSI C63.10-2013. The EUT was placed on a rotating 0.9 x 1.2-meter platform, elevated as required above the ground plane at a distance of 3 meters from the FSM antenna. EMI energy was maximized by equipment placement permitting orientation in three orthogonal axes, raising and lowering the FSM antenna, changing the antenna polarization, and by rotating the turntable. Each emission was maximized before data was taken and recorded. The frequency spectrum from 9 kHz to 25,000 MHz was searched for emissions during preliminary investigation. Refer to diagrams one and two showing typical test setup. Refer to photographs in the test setup exhibits for specific EUT placement during testing.

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- 1—A LISN is optional for radiated measurements between 30 MHz and 1000 MHz but not allowed for measurements below 30 MHz and above 1000 MHz (see 6.3.1). If used, then connect EUT to one LISN. Unused LISN measuring port connectors shall be terminated in 50 Ω loads. The LISN may be placed on top of, or immediately beneath, the reference ground plane (see 6.2.2 and 6.2.3.2).
- 1.1—LISN spaced at least 80 cm from the nearest part of the EUT chassis.
- 2—Antenna can be integral or detachable, depending on the EUT (see 6.3.1).
- 3—Interconnecting cables that hang closer than 40 cm to the ground plane shall be folded back and forth in the center forming a bundle 30 cm to 40 cm long (see 6.3.1).
- 4—For emission measurements at or below 1 GHz, the table height shall be 80 cm. For emission measurements above 1 GHz, the table height shall be 1.5 m for measurements, except as otherwise specified (see 6.3.1 and 6.6.3.1).


Diagram 1 Test arrangement for radiated emissions of tabletop equipment

Statement of Modifications and Deviations

No modifications to the EUT were required for the equipment to demonstrate compliance with the 47 CFR Part 15C, 15.249 emission requirements. There were no deviations to the specifications.

Intentional Radiators

The following information is submitted supporting compliance with the requirements of 47 CFR, Subpart C, paragraph 15.249.

Antenna Requirements

The design utilizes an internal chip antenna. The remote mounted design can be configured to disconnect from the internal chip antenna and connect to an external stub antenna provided by the manufacturer. The End user of the transponder Antenna configuration is determined by the installer during the installation process, with the end user of the transponder not having access to make modifications. The antenna connection point complies with the unique antenna connection requirements. There are no deviations or exceptions to the specification.

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Restricted Bands of Operation

Spurious emissions falling in the restricted frequency bands of operation were measured at the OATS. The EUT utilizes frequency, determining circuitry, which generates harmonics falling in the restricted bands. Emissions were investigated at the OATS, using appropriate antennas or pyramidal horns, amplification stages, and a spectrum analyzer. Peak and average amplitudes of frequencies above 1000 MHz were compared to the required limits with worst-case data presented below. Test procedures of ANSI C63.10-2013 were used during testing. No other significant emission was observed which fell into the restricted bands of operation. Computed emission values take into account the received radiated field strength, receive antenna correction factor, amplifier gain stage, and test system cable losses.

Summary of Results for Radiated Emissions in Restricted Bands

The EUT demonstrated compliance with the radiated emissions requirements of 47 CFR Part 15C Intentional Radiator requirements. The EUT #1 demonstrated a worst-case minimum margin of -10.7 dB below the emissions requirements in restricted frequency bands. The EUT #2 demonstrated a worst-case minimum margin of -13.6 dB below the emissions requirements in restricted frequency bands. Peak, Quasi-peak, and average amplitudes were checked for compliance with the regulations. Worst-case emissions are reported with other emissions found in the restricted frequency bands at least 20 dB below the requirements.

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General Radiated Emissions Procedure

The EUT was arranged in typical equipment configurations and operated through available modes during testing. Preliminary testing was performed in a screen room with the EUT positioned 1 meter from the FSM. Radiated emissions measurements were performed to identify the frequencies, which produced the highest emissions. Each radiated emission was then maximized at the OATS location before final radiated measurements were performed. Final data was taken with the EUT located at the OATS at a distance of 3 meters between the EUT and the receiving antenna. The frequency spectrum from 9 kHz to 25,000 MHz was searched for general radiated emissions. Measured emission levels were maximized by EUT placement on the table, rotating the turntable through 360 degrees, varying the antenna height between 1 and 4 meters above the ground plane and changing antenna position between horizontal and vertical polarization. Antennas used were Loop from 9 kHz to 30 MHz, Broadband Biconical from 30 to 200 MHz, Biconilog from 30 to 1000 MHz, Log Periodic from 200 MHz to 1 GHz and or double Ridge or pyramidal horns and mixers above 1 GHz, notch filters and appropriate amplifiers and external mixers were utilized.

Summary of Results for General Radiated Emissions

The EUT demonstrated compliance with the radiated emissions requirements of 47 CFR Part 15C Intentional Radiators. The EUT demonstrated a minimum margin of -3.1 dB below the requirements. Other emissions were present with amplitudes at least 10 dB below the Limits.

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Operation in the Band 2400 - 2483.5 MHz

The transmitter output power; harmonic and general emissions were measured on an open area test site @ 3 meters. The EUT was placed on a turntable elevated as required above the ground plane and at a distance of 3 meters from the FSM antenna. The peak and quasi-peak amplitude of frequencies below 1000 MHz were measured using a spectrum analyzer. The peak and average amplitude of frequencies above 1000 MHz were measured using a spectrum analyzer. The amplitude of each emission was then recorded from the analyzer display. Emissions radiated outside of the specified bands, except for harmonics, shall be attenuated by at least 50 dB below the level of the fundamental or to the general radiated emission limits, whichever is the lesser attenuation. Antenna port emission plots were taken of transmitter performance for reference in this and other documentation using test sample #2. The amplitude of each radiated emission was measured on the OATS at a distance of 3 meters from the FSM antenna testing was performed on sample representative of production with integral antenna (sample #1) with worst-case data provided. The amplitude of each radiated emission was maximized by equipment orientation and placement on the turn table, raising and lowering the FSM (Field Strength Measuring) antenna, changing the FSM antenna polarization, and by rotating the turntable. A Loop antenna was used for measuring emissions from 0.009 to 30 MHz, Biconilog Antenna for 30 to 1000 MHz, Double-Ridge, and/or Pyramidal Horn Antennas from 1 GHz to 25 GHz. Emissions were measured in dBµV/m @ 3 meters.

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


Figure 1 Plot of Transmitter Emissions Operation in 2402-2480 MHz (BR (GFSK))




Figure 2 Plot of Transmitter Emissions Operation in 2402-2480 MHz (2EDR (PI/4 DQPSK))

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


Figure 3 Plot of Transmitter Emissions Operation in 2402-2480 MHz (3EDR (8DPSK))




Figure 4 Plot of Transmitter Emissions Operation in 2402-2480 MHz (BLE (GMSK))

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


Figure 5 Plot of Transmitter Emissions 99% Occupied Bandwidth (BR (GFSK))




Figure 6 Plot of Transmitter Emissions 99% Occupied Bandwidth (2EDR (PI/4 DQPSK))

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


Figure 7 Plot of Transmitter Emissions 99% Occupied Bandwidth (3EDR (8DPSK))




Figure 8 Plot of Transmitter Emissions 99% Occupied Bandwidth (BLE (GMSK))

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


Figure 9 Plot of Transmitter Emissions Low Band Edge (BR (GFSK))




Figure 10 Plot of Transmitter Emissions Low Band Edge (2EDR (PI/4 DQPSK))

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


Figure 11 Plot of Transmitter Emissions Low Band Edge (3EDR (8DPSK))




Figure 12 Plot of Transmitter Emissions Low Band Edge (BLE (GMSK))

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


Figure 13 Plot of Transmitter Emissions High Band Edge (BR (GFSK))




Figure 14 Plot of Transmitter Emissions High Band Edge (2EDR (PI/4 DQPSK))

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


Figure 15 Plot of Transmitter Emissions High Band Edge (3EDR (8DPSK))




Figure 16 Plot of Transmitter Emissions High Band Edge (BLE (GMSK))

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Summary of Results for Transmitter Radiated Emissions of Intentional Radiator

The EUT demonstrated compliance with the radiated emissions requirements of FCC 47 CFR Part 15.249 Intentional Radiator regulations. The EUT #1 worst-case test sample configuration demonstrated minimum average margin of -0.1 dB below the average emission limit for the fundamental. The EUT #1 worst-case configuration demonstrated minimum radiated harmonic emission margin of -9.4 dB below the limit. The EUT #2 worst-case test sample configuration demonstrated minimum average margin of -0.1 dB below the average emission limit for the fundamental. The EUT #2 worst-case configuration demonstrated minimum radiated harmonic emission margin of -8.8 dB below the limit. No other radiated emissions were found in the restricted bands less than 20 dB below limits than those recorded in this report. Other emissions were present with amplitudes at least 20 dB below the limits.
