

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System Description

The GMN-01589 is a solid-state, mobile mounted, Airborne Aviation radar transponder operating in the 9300-9500 MHz frequency band. The design provides digital weather radar or ground mapping information operation to aid pilots in identifying weather, wind shear, and ground mapping. The modes are user selectable and the resulting information is sent to a display for use and interpretation by the pilot. The unit operates across within the 9300-9500 MHz frequency band on defined channels. Digitally modulated signals are transmitted out and doppler returns are processed in software and sent to the display to aid the pilot. The device is marketed as Aircraft Remote Mounted Avionics Unit. This report documents operation for this application as authorized in 47CFR 87 Subparts D, F and Q.

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
Transmitter Power Output

Measurements Required

Measurements shall be made to establish the radio frequency power delivered by the transmitter into the standard output termination. The power output shall be monitored and recorded and no adjustment shall be made to the transmitter after the test has begun, except as noted below:

If the power output is adjustable, measurements shall be made for the highest and lowest power levels.

Test Arrangement

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


Figure 1 Power Output Across Frequency Band 9300-9500 MHz (Wind Shear)

The radio frequency power output was measured at the antenna terminal by placing 30-dB attenuation in the antenna line and observing the emission with the spectrum analyzer. The spectrum analyzer and attenuation offered an impedance of 50Ω to match the impedance of the standard antenna. A Rohde & Schwarz ESU40 Spectrum Analyzer was used to measure the radio frequency power at the antenna port. Data was taken in dBm and converted to watts as shown in the following Table. Refer to Figures 1 through 3 showing plots of output power of the transmitter across the frequency band in each operational mode Wind Shear, Ground Map, and Weather. Data was taken per CFR47 Paragraph 2.1046(a) and applicable paragraphs of Part 87.




Figure 2 Power Output Across Frequency Band 9300-9500 MHz (Ground Map)

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


Figure 3 Power Output Across Frequency Band 9300-9500 MHz (Weather)

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


Occupied Bandwidth

Measurements Required

The occupied bandwidth, that is the frequency bandwidth such that below its lower and above its upper frequency limits, the mean powers radiated are equal to 0.5 percent of the total mean power radiated by a given emission.

Test Arrangement

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


Figure 4 Occupied Band Width (Wind Shear)

A Rohde & Schwarz ESU 40 spectrum analyzer was used to observe the radio frequency spectrum with the transmitter operating in normal modes. The power ratio in dB representing 99% of the total mean power was recorded from the spectrum analyzer measurements. Refer to figures 4 through 6 for plots of 99% power occupied bandwidth measurements.




Figure 5 Occupied Band Width (Ground Map)

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


Figure 6 Occupied Band Width (Weather)

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
Spurious Emissions at Antenna Terminals

Measurements Required

The radio frequency voltage or power generated within the equipment and appearing on a spurious frequency shall be checked at the equipment output terminals when properly loaded with a suitable artificial antenna. All spurious emissions must be attenuated at least 43 +10log (Po) below the fundamental emission power level. The following equations represent the calculated attenuation level for the equipment operating with rated average output power of 4.8 Watts.

Limit (dBc) = 43 + 10 Log (Po)= 43 + 10 Log (4.8)= 49.8 dBc

Test Arrangement



The radio frequency output was coupled to a Rohde & Schwarz ESU40 Spectrum Analyzer during antenna port conducted emissions measurements. The spectrum analyzer was used to observe the radio frequency spectrum with the transmitter operated in all normal modes. The frequency spectrum from 30 MHz to 40,000 MHz was observed and plots produced of the frequency spectrum displayed on the test equipment. Refer to figures seven through ten for plots of the spurious emissions at antenna port. Data was taken per CFR47 2.1051, 2.1057, and applicable paragraphs of Part 87.139. There are no deviations to the specifications.

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


Figure 7 Spurious Emissions at Antenna Terminal




Figure 8 Spurious Emissions at Antenna Terminal

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


Figure 9 Spurious Emissions at Antenna Terminal




Figure 10 Spurious Emissions at Antenna Terminal

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


Field Strength of Spurious Radiation (Unwanted Emissions)

Measurements Required

Measurements shall be made to detect spurious emissions that may be radiated directly from the cabinet, control circuits, power leads, or intermediate circuit elements under normal conditions of installation and operation. This equipment is typically remote mounted with interface cabling connecting the display control unit to the transmitter. The sample offered for testing required interfacing with laptop computer providing operational control with all functions of the transmitter.

Test Arrangement



The test setup was assembled in a screen room for preliminary screening. The transmitter was placed on a supporting platform 0.8 meters above the ground plane and at a distance of 1 meter from the receive antenna, plots were taken of the general radiated emissions. A final radiated emission testing was performed with the transmitter placed on a supporting turntable platform 0.8 meters above the ground plane and at a distance of 3 meters from the Field Strength Measuring (FSM) antenna. The EUT was operational and radiating into a 50 Ω load during testing. The receiving antenna was raised and lowered from 1m to 4m in height to obtain the maximum reading of spurious radiation from the EUT, cabinet, and interface cabling. The

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turntable was rotated though 360 degrees to locate the position registering the highest amplitude of emission. The frequency spectrum was then searched for spurious emissions generated from the transmitter, interface cabling, and test setup. The amplitude of each spurious emission was maximized by raising and lowering the FSM antenna, and rotating the turntable before final data was recorded. The frequency spectrum from 30 MHz to 95,000 MHz was investigated during radiated emissions testing. A loop antenna was used for measuring frequencies from 9 kHz to 30 MHz, a Biconilog antenna was used for frequency measurements of 30 to 1000 MHz. Double-ridge horns and external mixers were used for measuring frequencies from 1000 MHz to 95,000 MHz. Emission levels were measured and recorded from the spectrum analyzer in $dB\mu V$. Data was taken at the Rogers Labs, Inc. 3 meters open area test site (OATS). The transmitter was then removed and replaced with a substitution antenna, amplification as required, and signal generator. The signal from the generator was then adjusted such that the amplitude received was the same as that previously recorded for each frequency. This step was repeated for both horizontal and vertical polarizations. The power in dBm required to produce the desired signal level was then recorded from the signal generator. The power in dBm was then calculated by reducing the previous readings by the gain in the substitution antenna. A description of the test facility is on file with the accrediting body, FCC and Industry Canada (refer to annex for site registration letters).

All spurious emissions must be attenuated at least 43 +10log (Po) below the fundamental emission power level. The following equation represents the calculated attenuation levels for the equipment.

Limit (dBc) = 43 + 10 Log (Po)= 43 + 10 Log (4.8)= 49.8 dBc

Other emissions present had amplitudes at least 20 dB below the limit. Peak and Quasi-Peak amplitude emissions are recorded above for frequencies below 1000 MHz. Peak and Average amplitude emissions are recorded above for frequencies above 1000 MHz.

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
Frequency Stability

Measurements Required

The frequency stability shall be measured with variations of ambient temperature from -30° to $+50^{\circ}$ centigrade. Measurements shall be made at the extremes of the temperature range and at intervals of not more than 10° centigrade through the range. A period sufficient to stabilize all of the components of the oscillator circuit at each temperature level shall be allowed prior to frequency measurement. In addition to temperature stability, the frequency stability shall be measured with variation of primary supply voltage as follows:

- (1) Vary primary supply voltage from 85 to 115 percent of the nominal value.
- (2) The supply voltage shall be measured at the input to the cable normally provided with the equipment, or at the power supply terminals if cables are not normally provided.

Test Arrangement



The measurement procedure outlined below shall be followed.

<u>Step 1:</u> The transmitter shall be installed in an environmental test chamber whose temperature is controllable. Provision shall be made to measure the frequency of the transmitter.

<u>Step 2:</u> With the transmitter inoperative (power switched "OFF"), the temperature of the test chamber shall be adjusted to +25°C. After a temperature stabilization period of one hour at +25°C, the transmitter shall be switched "ON" with standard test voltage applied.

<u>Step 3:</u> The carrier shall be keyed "ON", and the transmitter shall be operated at full radio frequency power output at the duty cycle, for which it is rated, for duration of at least 5 minutes. The radio frequency carrier frequency shall be monitored and measurements shall be recorded.

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<u>Step 4:</u> The test procedures outlined in Steps 2 and 3, shall be repeated after stabilizing the transmitter at the environmental temperatures specified, -30° C to $+50^{\circ}$ C in 10-degree increments.

The frequency stability was measured with variations in the power supply voltage from 85 to 115 percent of the nominal value. The frequency was measured and the variation in parts per million calculated. Data was taken per CFR47 Paragraphs 2.1055 and applicable paragraphs of part 87.133.
