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# Safety precautions

### Information for parents

Please read the operating instructions and safety precautions carefully before use. Explain the content to your children and the hazards associated with using the phone.



Remember to comply with legal requirements and local restrictions when using the phone. For example, in aeroplanes, petrol stations, hospitals or while driving.



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Mobile phones can interfere with the functioning of medical devices such as hearing aids or pacemakers. Keep at least 20cm/9 inches between phone and pacemaker. When using the mobile phone hold it to the ear which is furthest away from the pacemaker. For more information consult your doctor.



Always keep the phone and accessories out of reach of small children.

Small parts such as the SIM card, dust cap, lens ring and lens cap can be dismantled and swallowed by small children.



Do not place the phone near to electromagnetic data carriers such as credit cards and floppy disks. Information stored on them could be lost.



- Only use original batteries and charging devices. Otherwise you risk serious damage to health and property. The battery could explode, for instance.
- All batteries can cause property damage, injury or burns if a conductive material such as jewelry, keys or beaded chains touch exposed terminals. The material may complete an electrical circuit and become quite hot. Exercise care in handling any charged battery, particularly when placing it inside your pocket, purse or other container with metal objects. Your batteries are supplied with a protective cover. Please attach this cover to your batteries when detached from the phone and not in use.
- Do not dispose of batteries in fire as they may explode.

Ringtones, info tones and handsfree talking are reproduced through the loudspeaker. Do not hold the phone to the ear when it rings or when you have switched on the handsfree function. Otherwise you risk serious permanent damage to your hearing.



The mains voltage (V) specified on the power supply unit must not be exceeded. Otherwise the charging device may be damaged.

The power supply must be plugged into an easily accessible AC mains power socket when charging the battery. The only way to turn off the charging device after charging the battery is to unplug it.



You may only open the phone to replace the battery and SIM card. You must not open the battery under any circumstances. All other changes to this device are strictly prohibited and will invalidate the guarantee.



The phone may cause interference in the vicinity of TV sets, radios and PCs.



Use only original accessories. This will avoid potential risks to health or property and ensure compliance with all relevant regulations.



Dispose of unwanted batteries and phones as permitted by the laws in your countries.

Improper use will invalidate the guarantee! These safety instructions also apply to original accessories.

As mobile devices offer a range of functions, they can be used in positions other than the head, such as on the body. In this case, a separation distance of **1.5 cm** is required.



# **Getting started**

# Removing the back cover

- 1. Use a thin object such as a finger nail to press in at the groove just below the cover on the center top edge of the phone as illustrated.
- 2. Lift the cover off the phone.



# Inserting the SIM card

Slide the entire SIM card into the slot in the direction of the arrow shown on the compartment, with the metal contacts of the SIM card facing down and the cut corner at the top left as illustrated. A SIM card can be easily damaged if its metal contacts become scratched. Therefore, take special care when holding or inserting it.

# Inserting the battery

- 1. Slide the top end of the battery down into the end of the battery bay.
- 2. Press the bottom end of the battery down so that it locks in place.



Switch off your phone before removing the battery.

# Installing the back cover

- 1. Insert the tabs on the inside bottom edge of the back cover into the slots on the bottom of the phone
- 2. Swing the cover down onto the phone to lock in place.



# Charging the battery

The battery is not fully charged when first unpacked.

- 1. Plug the charger connector into the charger socket on the bottom of your phone, with the arrow showing upwards.
- 2. Plug the charger into a power outlet and charge for at least 4 hours.
- 3. Once the phone is fully charged, remove the charger from both the power outlet and the phone.

- Do not remove the battery while charging.
- It takes approximately 4 hours to fully charge a battery.
- When the battery is discharged, the charging may not start immediately when you plug in the connector. Wait 10 to 15 minutes for the phone to begin charging.
- Charging is only possible within a temperature range of 0 °C (+32 °F) to +45 °C (+113 °F).

When the battery is low, you will be warned with an alert sound.

# Switching phone on/off

# Switching phone on

- 1. Press and hold for to switch the phone on. The phone will display the welcome animation (page 22).
- 2. When being asked, enter your PIN code and confirm with **OK**.

The PIN (Personal Identification Number) is the password provided by your network operator. You need this password in order to use the SIM card.

When the PIN code entered has been accepted, the phone will automatically search for the designated network. This search process may take a few seconds.

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If you enter the PIN incorrectly three times in a row, the SIM card will be locked. You must now enter the PUK (Personal Unblocking Key) for that SIM card in order to unlock it. Please contact your service provider to obtain a PUK. To activate/deactivate PIN, see page 10.

### Idle mode

The phone is in idle mode and is ready for use when the name of the service provider is displayed on the idle screen.

Press for to return to idle mode from any situation.

### Signal strength

The signal strength is indicated in the top left corner of the display. More bars indicate a stronger signal.

Strong signal.

If the phone is not able to detect the designated network, or links to a network that you are not authorized to use, the signal strength meter will show no bars. You will only be able to make emergency calls.

### **Emergency Call (SOS)**

You can make an emergency call even if your phone is locked or cannot access your network, or if there is no SIM card inserted, as long as you are within range of a network of the type supported by your phone.

1. Enter 112 (the international emergency number).

2. Press 🕥 .

No call is allowed to make if the keypad is locked.

# Navigating the menus

The phone features various functions and settings organized in menus and sub-menus.

To select a function from menus:

- 1. Press **OK** in idle mode to open the main menu.
- Use →>, , , and ⊠ to scroll up, down, right or left through the main menu. For example, scroll to Settings.
- 3. Press **ok** to enter the menu.
- Press → and to scroll to a submenu, for example Profiles.
- 5. Press **OK** to confirm selection.
- Press 
   and 
   im to scroll to the desired option, for example, Normal.
- 7. Press **OK** to confirm selection.

- You can also access a function by pressing the corresponding menu number: e.g. open the main menu and press to access Settings.
- In this user manual, the steps needed to reach a menu are shown in a condensed form, for example: Settings > Profiles > Normal.

# Security

Settings > Security.

The phone and SIM card are protected against misuse by several security codes.

Keep these confidential numbers in a safe place where you can access them again if required.

- If you enter the PIN incorrectly three times in a row, the SIM card will be locked. You have to enter the PUK for that SIM card in order to unlock it. Please contact your network operator to obtain a PUK.
- If the PUK has been lost, please contact your network operator.

### Security codes

PIN1	(Personal Identification Number) Protects your SIM card from unauthorized use.
PIN2	Needed for some settings and to change the PIN2.

PUK PUK2	(Personal Unblocking Key) Used to unlock SIM cards after the wrong PIN1 has been entered incorrectly three consecutive times.	
Phone lock	Protects your phone from unauthorized use. If activated you have to enter the phone code when the phone is switched on (default: 1234).	
SIM lock	If activated, you have to enter SIM code to use the phone with another SIM card (default: 1234).	

# PIN Code

The PIN is the password provided by your network operator and is usually requested each time the phone is switched on. You can deactivate this feature but you risk unauthorised use of the phone. Some network operators do not permit deactivating the control.

### PIN1 Code

### **Changing PIN status**

- 1. Select Set Status.
- 2. Select **On/Off** to activate/deactivate PIN control.
- 3. Enter PIN and confirm with **ok**.

### Changing PIN

You can change the PIN to any 4 to 8digit number.

- 1. Enter current PIN code and confirm with  $\mathbf{OK}$ .
- 2. Enter new PIN code and confirm with **OK**.
- 3. Re-enter new PIN code and confirm with  $\overline{\mathbf{OK}}$ .

# PIN2 Code

Proceed as with PIN1 code.

# Phone lock

You can define the phone code (4 to 8digits). If activated, the phone code is requested when the phone is switched on.

To activate the phone lock or change the phone code, proceed as with PIN1 code.

When the phone is locked, only emergency calls can be made.

# SIM lock

You can define the SIM code (4 to 8digits). When activating the SIM lock, you have to enter the previously set SIM code (Default: 1234). If the SIM code is activated, you have to enter the SIM code to use another SIM card on the phone.

# Text entry

# Input methods

When an editing screen is displayed, the current text input method is indicated

in the upper right corner of the display. Following are some of the input methods. To have more options to enter texts, go to Settings > Input to select the desired input methods.

- **EN** iTap text input including the input language, e.g. english.
- ABC Text input without iTap
- 123 Numeric input

### Changing the Input Method

Press repeatedly to select an input method.

iTap supports several input languages. The dictionary depends on the current input language. When selecting iTap please take note of the correct input language.

### Shifting between Upper and Lower Case Letters

Press **\*\*** and hold to switch between lower and upper case letters.

# Using iTap text input

- Press each key associated with the letter you want to enter only once. The letters you have entered appear on the display. The candidate words change with each key you press.
- 3. Press **OK** to enter the highlighted word. A space will automatically be inserted after the word.

### 12 Calling

- 4. Press → / 📰 / 🗗 / 🖾 to move the cursor.
- Press i to delete the letter left of the cursor or marked text. Press and hold to delete all entered text.

# Using text input without iTap

- 1. Press a number key repeatedly until the required letter appears. After a brief interval the cursor will advance. Example:
- 2. Press **2**abc once to enter the letter "a", twice to enter "b" etc.
- Press it to delete the letter left of the cursor.
   Press and hold to delete text quickly.
- 4. Press 🖾 / 🗊 to move the cursor (forwards/back).
- 5. Press <u>o</u> to insert a space. Press and hold to insert a line feed.

# Entering symbols and special characters

- Press ★<sub>@+</sub> to open the symbol table.
- 2. Press → / □ / □ / ☑ to navigate to character.
- 3. Press  $\textcircled{*}_{@+}$  to switch to next page.
- 4. Press **OK** to insert character.

# Text templates

Messages > SMS > Templates

You can preset texts into your SMS message.

### Defining new SMS templates

- 1. Select (Option) and select Add.
- 2. Enter text.
- 3. Press **OK** to save the new SMS template.

# Dialling with number keys

- 1. Enter a phone number in idle mode.
- 2. Press 1.

### Entering international dialling codes:

• Press and hold Then enter country and area code.

### Dialling with number extension:

• Enter the number, then press and hold until "P" is displayed. Enter the extension number.

You can also use the phone book (page 14) or speed dial keys (page 20) to dial a number.

# **Dialling previous numbers**

- 1. Press **\)** to open call records.
- 2. Press  $\rightarrow$  /  $\blacksquare$  to select a number.

# Listening to voicemail

Press and hold 🗔 .

If the voicemail number is not stored on your SIM card, you cannot access your voicemail by pressing and holding

. In this case you will need to manually set the number at Messages > Voicemail > Set Number (page 18).

# Ending a call

Press for . The last call time is displayed.

# Accepting a call

Press to accept a call.

• If Settings > Call Settings > Answer Mode > Any Key is activated (page 23), you can accept the call by pressing any key.

• Press 💽 to mute during a call.

# Rejecting a call

Press for to reject an incoming call.

# Adjusting the volume

Press  $\rightarrow$  / **F** to adjust the volume when making or during a call.

# Swapping between calls

\* Network support dependent.

### Putting the active call on hold

Press (Hold) to hold a call.

You can dial a number to make another call.

### Activating held call

Press (Unhold) to activate a call.

### Swapping between two calls

You have one active call and a call on hold.

Press (Swap) to swap between the held and the active call.

### Ending a call

Press for to show a list of actions you can do to the calls: End Active, End Hold, and End Waiting.

# Making a second call

You can also select a number from the call record list.

The currently active call is placed on hold automatically.

# Call Waiting

# Activating Silent profile

To avoid the disturbance caused by a ringing phone, you can activate the Silent profile. Incoming calls are signalled by vibrating without ringing.

Press and hold in idle mode to activate/deactivate the silent profile.

When the Silent profile is activated, the phone vibrates for a second and 🔌 is displayed in the status of the idle display.

# Your Phone Book

The capacity of a phone book on your SIM card depends on the type of SIM card provided by your network operator.

# Adding new contacts

1. Enter the number in idle mode.

You can also select **Phone Book** > **Add** to add a new contact.

- 2. Press (Save) to save the number as a contact.
- Select a save location: To SIM/To Phone.
- Scroll to the desired data field and press or to edit the field.

# **Cell Broadcast**

Messages > Cell Broadcast

Cell broadcast messages are messages that your network operator broadcasts to all phones within a particular area. These messages are broadcast in numbered channels, e.g. channel 30 might be for local weather, 60 for traffic reports. You can receive cell broadcast messages that your network operator broadcasts, and select your preferred topics and languages.

For more information about available channels and a list of the information they provide, contact your network operator.

### Receive

Switch the function on/off.

### Topics

Set the desired channel numbers which represent the broadcast information you wish to receive from your network operator.

### Language

Set languages for broadcast information. Only information in the set language is received.

You can enter events in the calendar. Time and date must be set for the calendar to work correctly. You may set the alarm to ring when a date occurs.

# Profiles

Settings > Profiles

A profile is a group of settings that determine, for example, whether the phone will alert you to incoming calls through a ring tone or a vibrating alert, and how ring tones in general are used on the phone. These settings allow the phone's operations to best suit the environment you are in.

### Selecting profile

Press  $\rightarrow$  /  $\blacksquare$  to select a profile and confirm with  $\bigcirc K$  to activate it.

5 standard profiles are provided with default settings:

- Normal: This is the default profile.
- Meeting: Settings in this profile have been predefined to suit a meeting environment.
- Silent: All ring tones are deactivated and incoming calls are signalled by vibrating without ringing.

You can also press and hold in idle mode to activate/deactivate the Silent profile.

- Outdoors: Settings in this profile have been predefined to suit an outdoor activity.
- Personal: You can use this profile for a group of custom settings.

1. Press 🎝 / 📰 to select a profile.

As SAR is measured utilizing the device's highest transmitting power, the actual SAR of this device while operating is typically below that indicated above. This is due to automatic changes to the power level of the

device to ensure it only uses the minimum level required to reach the network.

The World Health Organization has stated that present scientific information does not indicate the need for any special precautions for the use of mobile devices. They note that if you nevertheless want to reduce your exposure then you can do so by limiting the length of calls or using a 'hands-free' device to keep the mobile phone away from the head and body.

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
