





Please follow the simple steps below to make your first call:

Install the battery

Place the bottom end of the battery on the phone.




Hold down the top side of the battery. You will hear a click when the battery is secured.





Charge the battery

Insert the battery charger connector into the battery charging socket.









It takes 24 hours for the charger to fully charge a new battery. Recharging takes about 160 minutes each time.

When charging, the battery strength bars in flashes until the battery is fully charged.



Turn the phone on

After the battery is fully charged, press and hold (0) key to turn on the phone power. The phone beeps and a welcome animation will be displayed on the screen. After you turn your phone on, it will start searching the network to use.




Make a call

Key in the phone number with the keys on the keypad. When finished, press \(\bar{\sigma} \) key.



End a call

Press (ii) key to end the call.



Chapter 1: Introduction to Your Phone







Battery level

The battery level is shown by the number of bars in the battery icon. The more bars displayed, the higher the battery strength. This icon will flash when the handset is running out of battery.

When you charge the battery, the bars will flash until the battery is full.



Keypad

There are two kinds of keys on the keypad: the **Function Keys** and **Alphanumeric Keys**. In each section below, "long press" a key means "press and hold a key for about 2 seconds", while "press" a key means "press and release a key immediately".

In standby mode, when you press a key on the keypad, the backlight will be turned on automatically. If you want to turn off the backlight, please refer to "Backlight" on page 40 for details.

Mohanuments Kays

There are 12 alphanumeric keys on the keypad. You can use these keys to enter numbers and letters. To enter a number, simply press the button with that number. To enter characters, press the key several times until the desired letter appears. To switch between upper and lower cases, long press the key.



When you have entered the first letter, the cursor will advance to the position of the next letter after about two seconds. You can type to enter the letter directly. To clear a letter or number, press ◀ on the navigation key. The cursor will move backward and the letter will be deleted. To delete all letters or numbers, simply long press ◀ on the navigation key.

For example, if you want to enter "Mary":

- Press key until "M" displays on the screen.
- Long press (2.) key, then press (2.) key several times until "a" appears on the screen.
- Press (7.) key several times until "r" appears on the screen.
- Press key several times until "y" appears on the screen.
- Finally, press key to confirm.



Chapter 2: Using Your Phone



Basic Operations

Turning on the phone






When the phone power is off, you can long press ① key to turn it on. The phone beeps and a welcome animation will appear on the screen. After you turn your phone on, it will start searching the network to use.

When the network service is acquired, the network name will be displayed on the screen. Under this "standby" mode, you can:

- Press ➤ on the navigation key to access the Main Menu. (see "Chapter 3: Menu Options" on page 25)
- Press on the navigation key to use **Voice Dialing**. (see "Use voice dialing" on page 58)
- Press ▼ on the navigation key to access Phone Book.
 (see "Phone Book Menu" on page 51)
- Press ▲ on the navigation key to enter **Call Logs**. (see "Call logs" on page 21)
- Long press 44 key to listen to the voice mail message.





You can not make a call if network service is not available.



Turning off the phone

When the phone power is on, you can long press (0) key to turn it off.

Making a call

In standby mode, you can make a call in one of the following ways:


- Key in the phone number, then press \(\sigma \) key.
- Press key to browse the last dialed numbers, then press key again to dial.
- Long press () key to redial the last dialed number.
- Press on the navigation key to use Voice Dialing (see "Use voice dialing" on page 58).
- Find a Phone Book record by name and press \(\bar{\sigma} \) key (see "Find by name" on page 52).
- Find a Phone Book record by location and press (see "Find by location" on page 52).
- Long press (2) ~ (See Word to use one-touch dialing (see "One touch dial" on page 44).
- Enter the location (number) of a Phone Book record and press \(\backslash key.
- From "Outgoing Call" log, choose the number to dial and press key (see "Call logs" on page 21).
- From "Incoming Call" log, choose the number to dial and press key (see "Call logs" on page 21).
- From "Missed Call" log, choose the number to dial and press key (see "Call logs" on page 21).

when you dial a phone number, you can long press key to insert a hard pause, or key key to insert a time pause. H (hard pause) or T (time pause) will appear on the screen.

If a hard pause is inserted, the phone will prompt you to send the numbers behind the hard pause when call is connected.




For example, if you enter:



After the call "1234567" is connected, the screen will prompt you to send the number "234". You can press (S) key to send.


If a time pause is inserted, the phone will send the numbers behind the time pause after 3 seconds. This is useful when you want to call a extension number.

For example, if you want to call 1234567, extension number 89:




3 seconds after the call "1234567" is connected, the phone will send the number "89" automatically. You can lengthen the pause duration by inserting more time pauses.

For example,



6 seconds after the call "1234567" is connected, the phone will send the number "89" automatically.

You can also use time pauses in combination with hard pauses:





Hard pause does not work if it is inserted right after a time pause without numbers in between (e.g, 1234567TH89).



Redialing a call

If the attempt to make a call failed, according to the setting in **Retry Mode** (see "Retry mode" on page 45), you can redial the last dialed number manually or let the phone redial the number automatically.

Answering a call


The phone rings or vibrates when a call is received. If the caller's number can be found in the Phone Book, the caller's name will appear on the screen. The call time will also be shown.

You can press \(\bigcep \) key to answer that call. Depending on the setting in **Answer Mode** (see "Answer mode" on page 44), you can also choose to answer a call by pressing any key (except

(0) key) on the keypad.



Your phone can also receive data and fax calls when it is connected to a host computer via a data service cable. The data and fax calls will be answered automatically. Meanwhile, "Fax Data" will be displayed on the screen.



Ending a call

Call Disconnected

You can press ① key to end a call. The call timer information will flash on the screen for about three seconds and the phone will then return to standby mode.

If the total call time exceeds the value you set in the **Call Time Limit** function (see "Call time limit" on page 45), a warning tone will be generated to remind you of the total call time.

In call options

During a phone call, you can choose to use the following features:

- Press the alphanumeric keys to send DTMF tone (for example, when you are asked to enter ID number, account number or other data).
- Press (0) key to end the call.
- If there is another call coming, you can press \infty key to answer the second incoming call and put the current call on hold. To unhold the call, press \infty key again (see "Call waiting" on page 20).
- Press the volume adjustment keys to adjust the ear piece volume.
- Press ➤ on the navigation key to enter the In Call
 Option menu:
 In the menu, you can highlight the desired item by pressing ▲ or ▼ on the navigation key and then press key to select.

Mute (Unmute): mute or unmute the current call. Scratch pad: jot down numbers on the scratch pad. When finished, you can press (S) key to save.

While you are speaking, you can initiate another call to the third calling party:

- Make a call to the third party and press (key.
- When the third party is connected, press (5) key again and the three calling party will be connected.
- To disconnect the third calling party, press \infty key. To disconnect all calls, press ① key.

Key guard

In standby mode, you can use the key guard function to keep from accidental key operation.

To activate key guard, long press (\$\overline{\psi_1}\$ key. To cancel, press (\$\overline{\psi_1}\$) key, then press key.

Call logs

You can enter the Call Logs menu by pressing A on the navigation key in standby mode.

There are 4 options in the Call Logs menu. You can highlight the desired item by pressing A or V on the navigation key and then press (5) key to select.





Reading messages





When you have a new text message, the phone will generate an alert sound and "You have new text message!" and 🖂 icon will appear on the screen. A blinking 🖂 icon means that you have received an urgent text message.

Press \(\bar{\sigma} \) key. The sender and time of the message will be appear on the screen.

If you have more than 1 new messages, you can press ▲ or ▼ on the navigation key to scroll the messages.

Press \(\bigcirc \) key again to read the message. After you read the message, you can press \(\bigcirc \) on the navigation key to save the message.

Calling voicemail


You can long press (i) key to listen to the voice mail message.



Knowing What Your Phone Says

Your phone lets you know its working status by issuing sounds or display text prompts on the screen.

Low battery warning



If the battery power is getting low, the battery icon on the screen will start to flash. If the phone has run out of the battery completely, the battery empty message will appear on the screen and the phone will be turned off automatically.


At this time, use the battery charger to charge the battery.

Battery charging

Charging

When the battery is being charged with phone power off, the battery charging animation will appear on the screen. If the phone power is on, the number of bars in the battery icon will change accordingly. When the battery is fully charged, a battery full notification will appear on the screen.

Missed call alert



When you have a missed call, a missed call information (including the number of call missed) will appear on the screen.

Roam alert

If you are roaming under other network service areas, the roam icon will appear on the screen, telling you that are under a home service area, roam service area or a secondary roam service area.



Power saving

If the phone can not acquire a network for a long time, the phone will enter power saving mode automatically. You can press any key to wake up the phone.

Chapter 3: Menu Options



In standby mode, you can press ▶ on the navigation key to enter the Main Menu. You can press ▲ or ▼ on the navigation key to scroll through the menu items and press (5) key to enter. The Main Menu includes many advanced options and you can get the most from your phone by using these functions.




Message Menu



The options in the Message Menu allow you to deal with text messages.



You can use this function to view the events that are previously recorded in the scheduler memory. If the memory is empty, "Record Empty" will appear on the screen.

If there are already events stored in the memory, you can press ▲ or ▼ on the navigation key to browse the events. You can press ♠ key to select an event and view its options:

Erase: press key again and the selected event will be deleted.

Modify: press key to start modifying the content of the event. When finished, press key and you will be prompted to enter the year, month, day and time of the alarm. Finally, press key to save.

Add an event

You can add new events to your scheduler here. The phone will generate an alarm to remind you of the event.

To add a new event, first press \infty key to enter this item, then key in the content of the event. When finished, press \infty key and you will be prompted to enter the year, month, day and time. Finally, press \infty to save.

Add a call

You can add a call reminder here.

To enter a new call reminder, first press \infty key to enter this item, then key in the content of the event. When finished, press \infty key and you will be prompted to enter the year, month, day and time of the alarm. Finally, press \infty key to save.

Erase all

You can use this function to delete all events in the scheduler. After you press \(\bigcirc\) key to enter this item, press \(\bigcirc\) key again and all events in the memory will be erased.







Ring volume




To adjust ring volume:

Ring type

You can change the ring types for your voice calls, scheduler alarms and message alert. Press (5) key to view the following option list:

Voice Call



Press key and 4 available ring types will be displayed on the screen:

Ring Only: the phone rings when a voice call is received. If you choose this item, you can then choose a ring type to use from the ring type list that follows up. There are 16 ring tones available.


Vibr. Only: the phone vibrates when a voice call is received.

Both: the phone rings and vibrates when a voice call is received. If you choose this item, you can then choose a ring type to use from the ring type list that follows up. There are 16 ring types available.

Neither: the phone neither rings nor vibrates when a call is received.


You can also let your phone generate different ring tones when your phone receives calls from different callers (see "Add a record" on page 53).

Message



Press \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown on the navigation key to scroll through the sound you like to use as the message alert tone. When you highlight each ring type, the phone plays the ring tone you choose. There are 3 ring types available. When you find the one you like, press () key to confirm.

Scheduler




Press ▲ or ▼ on the navigation key to scroll the sound you like to use as the scheduler alarm tone. When you highlight each ring type, the phone will generate the ring tone of that type to let you know what it sounds like. There are 3 ring types available. When you find the one you like, press () to confirm.

Key beep volume



You can adjust the volume of the beep generated when you press a key on the keypad. Press \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown on the navigation key to increase or decrease the key beep volume (the more bars displayed beside the speaker icon, the higher the key beep volume).

Key beep type



The options here allow you to choose between two different key beep types. Press ▲ or ▼ on the navigation key to highlight "Tone" or "Click" and then press 🕥 key to confirm.








Display Menu

You can press (S) key to enter its submenu that includes the options listed below. You can use ▲ or ▼ on the navigation key to highlight an item and press (5) key to enter.






Backlight

When you press a key on the keypad, the back light of the screen will be turned on automatically. The back light of the phone screen allows you to clearly read the information displayed on the screen when the environment is dark. However, letting the back light stay on too long will consume the power of battery quickly.

Press \bigcirc key to view the option list and use \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown on the navigation key to highlight an item, then press \bigcirc key to select.




6 Seconds: if no key is pressed after the back light is on for 6 seconds, it will be turned off automatically.

10 Seconds: if no key is pressed after the back light is on for 10 seconds, it will be turned off automatically.

30 Seconds: if no key is pressed after the back light is on for 30 seconds, it will be turned off automatically.

Always On: the back light stays always on until you turn off the power of your phone.

Banner




Services Menu

You can press (5) key to enter its submenu that includes the options listed below. You can use \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown on the navigation key to highlight an item and press (5) key to enter.





Key guard

You can activate this function to keep from accidental key operations.

Press \(\bigcep \) key to activate key guard. You can also activate the key guard function by long pressing \(\bigcep \) key in standby mode.

After you activate the key guard function, you can still press skey to answer an incoming call.

To deactivate key lock, first press key, then press key.

One touch dial

You can choose to turn on/off the touch dial function here. (For how to use the touch dial function, please see "One touch dial" on page 44.

Answer mode

When an incoming call is received, you can choose to use one of the following modes to answer that call. You can press \nearrow key to view the options below and use \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown on the navigation key to highlight the mode you want to use, then press \searrow to select:



Send key: the call will be answered when you press \(\) key. **Auto:** the call will be answered automatically after ringing for 3 seconds.

Any key: the call can be answered by pressing any key on the keypad (except (0) key).




The Auto mode works only when a hands free or car kit is connected to the phone, or the Answer Machine function is activated.



Call time limit


Each time you end a call, the limited alert timer will give you a warning beep if the total talk time exceeds the time limit set here.



Press \infty key and you will be prompted to enter the limit time in minutes. When finished, press \infty key to activate the function. If you set the limit time to 0, this function will be deactivated.

Retry mode

When you try to make a call but is not successful, you can let your phone try making the call again.



Press \bigcirc key to view the options and press \triangle or \blacktriangledown on the navigation key to highlight a mode you want to use. Finally, press \bigcirc key to confirm.


Off: the phone does not retry making the call.

Auto: if the call is not connected, your phone will try again until

the call is connected successfully.

Prompt: your phone will prompt you before retrying.

Scratch pad



During your phone conversation, you can use this function to jot down important memos, such as telephone numbers.

When you finish entering the content, you can press ▶ on the navigation key to save the data to Phone Book.



If you do not save the data, it will not last after you turn off the phone.



Calendar




Your phone is equipped with a calendar with which you can check and browse days and weeks easily.

To move among months, use \blacktriangle and \blacktriangledown on the navigation key. To move among days, use ◀ and ▶ on the navigation key.




Network Options Menu



The Network Options Menu contains options that you can choose to determine the operation mode of your phone with the network.

You can press 🕥 key to enter its submenu that includes the options listed below. You can use ▲ or ▼ on the navigation key to highlight an item and press (5) key to enter.






Prefer mode

The Prefer Mode determines which network the phone will select after it is turned on.

Press \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown on the navigation key to highlight a mode you want to use, then press \bigcirc key to confirm.



CDMA Prefer: the phone will first select the CDMA network when turned on.

CDMA Only: the phone can only use the CDMA network. **AMPS Only:** the phone can only use the AMPS network. **Temp AMPS:** you can choose this item to force an AMPS.

Chapter 4 : Care and Maintenance



Your phone is a delicate electronic device and shall be used and handled carefully in compliance with the instructions below. Failure to observe these instructions may cause your product warranty to void.

- Do not use your phone in dusty and humid areas. Your phone is extremely vulnerable to liquid and sand grains can scratch the surface of your phone.
- Do not store your phone in extremely hot or cold areas. Heat can cause damage to both the outer case and components inside the phone. In an extremely cold area, moisture can form inside the phone after you turn on your phone and it can damage the components inside.
- Do not drop, shake or knock your phone. This will cause damage to the components and circuits of the phone.
- Do not use strong detergents, thinners or other corrosive liquid to clean your phone. Instead, use a clean, lint-free and slightly dampened cloth. When you do so, keep water from getting inside the phone.
- Keep your phone, batteries and accessories away from reach of small children.
- Use only supplied or approved replacement antenna and other accessories. Unapproved antenna and accessories can cause damage to your phone and your health.
- Follow the safety instructions as set forth at the beginning of this manual.




When you encounter problems while using your mobile phone, please refer to the following table to solve the problem. If problem persists, please contact your dealer immediately for service.


