Safety information

The following list shows how to maintain your mobile phone and precautions to take as you use the device.

- Keep your mobile phone and its accessories out of the reach of children and pets.
- Maintain your mobile phone in dry conditions and keep it within normal operating temperatures. It may be damaged at temperatures higher than 55°C/131°F or lower than -20°C/-4°F.
- Do not dry your phone in a microwave oven. Sparks may occur and cause an explosion or fire.
- Do not use or store your mobile phone in dusty, dirty areas.
- Do not disassemble your mobile phone.
- Do not drop or cause severe impact to your mobile phone.
- Do not clean your mobile phone with chemical products, cleaning solvents or detergents.
- Contact your dealer immediately if your mobile phone does not work properly.
- Use only authorized batteries, battery chargers and accessories. Any malfunction or damage caused by the use of unauthorized batteries, battery chargers and accessories will void the limited product warranty.

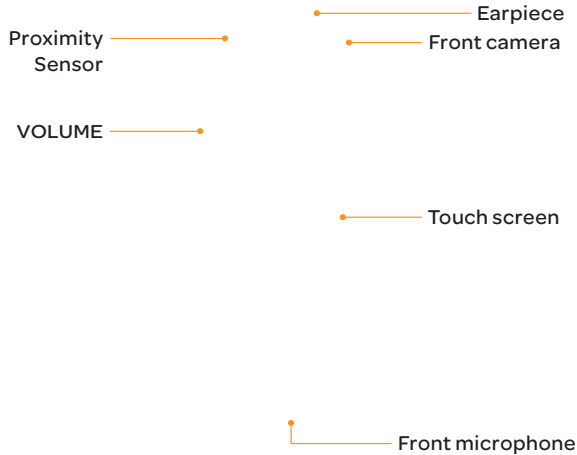

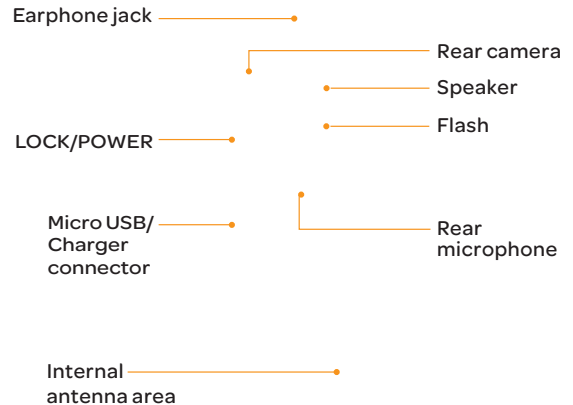

Getting Started

① Note

- Your phone may not be compatible with all types of stereo earphones.
- Do not cover the proximity sensor (area with LCD protection film). If you cover the sensor, the touch screen may not perform properly.
- Do not allow the touch screen to come in contact with water or chemicals.
- Do not block the internal antenna embedded in the phone.
- Do not hold the handset too close to your face, as you may block the microphone and prevent others from hearing you clearly..

Gripping the phone

Hold the phone in the correct position to avoid blocking the internal antenna.

- If you block the internal antenna, you may disrupt the wireless signal and increase battery consumption.
- Do not use metallic cases or accessories, as they can interfere with the signal reception.

Using the SIM or USIM card

Before using the card

- Be careful not to damage your fingernails when you remove the battery cover.
- Turn off the phone before installing the SIM or USIM card.
- Do not bend or force the card. Doing so may damage the card or destroy data on the card.
- Turn off the phone before removing the SIM or USIM card.
- Do not expose the SIM or USIM card to moisture.
- Avoid static electricity.
- Do not lose or transfer your SIM or USIM card to someone. Pantech is not responsible for damage due to theft or loss.

Installing the SIM or USIM card

1. Insert a finger into the groove at the bottom of the phone, and then lift up to remove the battery cover.
2. Remove the battery.
3. Insert the SIM or USIM card into the card slot. Ensure that the gold contacts on the card are facing the metal contacts on the phone.
4. Reinsert the battery and reattach the battery cover.

About SIM or USIM cards

When you sign up for phone service, you will receive a SIM or USIM card that contains your registration information, PIN code, and other personal data. Keep the card secure and handle it carefully. Do not bend or scratch the card and keep it away from moisture and static electricity. Pantech is not responsible for damages caused by theft or loss of your personal data.

Using the battery

Inserting the battery

1. Turn off the phone, if it is not already turned off.
 2. Insert your finger into the groove at the bottom of the phone, and then lift up to remove the battery cover.
 3. Align the gold contacts on the battery with the contacts located at the top of the battery compartment.
 4. Slide the battery into the phone until it lays flat in the compartment.
 5. Reattach the battery cover.
- ① **Note** Be careful not to damage your fingernails when you remove the battery cover.

About the battery

Your battery uses a lithium ion (Li-Ion) battery. Use only approved batteries and chargers with your phone. The average battery life will vary, based on your usage patterns. For more details, contact your retailer.

Charging the battery

Connect the charger adapter to the Micro USB/Charger connector of the phone

① Note

- Do not use the handset while the battery is charging. Doing so may result in an electric shock.
- Use only authorized adapters. Using unauthorized adapters may cause the handset to malfunction or may damage the handset or battery.
- Carefully align the connector as indicated in the image. Failure to do so may damage the charger connector or prevent the battery from charging.

Installing the microSD card

Insert a microSD card to store files, such as photos or videos.

1. Insert your finger into the groove at the bottom of the phone, and then lift up to remove the battery cover.
2. Remove the battery.
3. Insert the microSD card into the memory card slot. Ensure that the gold contacts on the card face the metal contacts on the phone.
4. Reinsert the battery and reattach the battery cover.

About the microSD card

Inserting a microSD card allows you to store files and application data. You can use up to a 32GB microSD card. We recommend that you format the microSD card before using it. For more information, refer to page 69.

Turning the phone on or off

Turning the phone on

Press and hold the LOCK/PWR key for more than two seconds.

Turning the phone off

1. Press and hold the LOCK/PWR key for more than two seconds.
 2. Tap **Power off** > **OK**.
 - Tap **Restart** to restart the phone.
- ① **Note** If you forcibly shut down the phone by removing the battery, the screen may malfunction shortly. This is normal and should not affect the lifespan of the screen.

Setting Mute mode

Press and hold the LOCK/PWR key for more than two seconds, and then tap **Mute mode**. All sounds except multimedia and alarms are silenced.

Setting Airplane mode

Press and hold the LOCK/PWR key for more than two seconds, and then tap **Airplane mode**. to turn off Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, and GPS functions. You can reactivate these functions individually, if desired.

Setting up the phone

When you turn on the phone for the first time, a welcome screen appears. To use Google apps and services, you must create or sign into a Google account. You can synchronize Contact, Calendar, and Gmail data for each account if you register multiple accounts.

1. Tap **Yes** when the **Data Network Settings** screen appears.
 2. Tap **Start**.
 - Tap **English** to change the language.
 3. Do one of the following:
 - Tap **Get a Google Account** to create a new account.
 - Tap **Sign in** to sign into an existing Google account.
 - Tap **Not now** to skip this step.
 4. If you chose to create a Google account, follow the onscreen instructions.
 5. Configure the backup and restore settings, and then tap **Next**.
 6. Configure the location service settings and tap **Next**.
 7. Enter your name and tap **Next** > **Finish**.
- ① **Note** You must be connected to the Internet to register a Google Account. If you tap **No** when the **Data Network Settings** screen appears, available Wi-Fi networks will appear. Select and tap an available Wi-Fi network. For more details, refer to page XX.

Resetting the phone

Email, Google account information, and contacts will also be deleted when you reset the phone. Before you reset the phone, back up your contacts, messages, photos, and other data.

1. Tap **Menu** > **Settings** > **System**.
2. Tap **Backup and reset**.

3. Tap **Factory data reset**.
4. Tap **Reset phone**.
5. Tap **Erase everything**.

Selecting a boot mode

Safe mode

This mode prevents all applications from starting when the phone boots. Select this mode when it appears that a downloaded application is crashing the phone as it boots up.

1. Press the LOCK/PWR key to access the boot mode.
2. When the 4G LTE logo appears, press and hold the Volume Up key.

Recovery mode

This mode offers several menus to recover the system when the phone cannot boot, due to system failures.

Press and hold the Volume Down key and the LOCK/PWR key at the same time to enter recovery mode.

Emergency mode

This mode allows you to force the phone into self-upgrade mode when an error occurs during an upgrade.

1. Remove and reinsert the battery.
2. Press and hold the Volume Up key, the Volume Down key, and the LOCK/PWR key at the same time.

Getting to know the phone's attractions

Locking messages

To prevent other people from viewing your messages or sending messages from your phone, tap **Messaging > Settings > Message Lock > Pattern** or **Password**, and then follow the on-screen instructions. Once the message lock function is activated, you must draw your pattern on the screen or enter the password to view or send messages. For more details, refer to page XX.

Using Multi mode

When you move the phone horizontally in some applications such as Email and Notepad, the phone changes to Multi mode. In Multi mode, you can view a list of items and details about the items at the same time. To stop the screen from rotating automatically, drag the area at the top of the screen downward, and then tap **Auto Rotate** in **Easy Setting**.

Capturing the screen

Press the Volume Down key and the LOCK/PWR key, and tap XX together for more than two seconds to capture an image of the screen. You can edit and share the captured image, and also set it as a wallpaper or contact photo. You cannot capture images from videos or the camera preview.

Viewing captured images

Drag the area at the top of the screen downward, and then tap **Image Captured**. You can also view captured images by tapping **Menu > Gallery > Screenshots**.

Locking the Screen

Changing the Screen Lock Type

The screen lock type is set to **Visual type** by default. The **Lock screen** menu is activated only when **Screen security** is set to **Slide**.

1. Tap **Menu > Settings > User theme**.
2. Tap **Lock screen > Type > Visual type**.
3. Drag the screen to the left or right to select a screen lock type, and then tap **Save**.

Adding a Screen Lock Wallpaper

To display wallpaper on the locked screen, tap **Wallpaper > image folder**, and then select a folder that contains images. If you do not select a folder, only the default image will appear.

Changing Screen Lock Shortcuts

Set the lock screen type to **Visual type**, and then tap **Shortcuts > Shortcut setting**. You can change the shortcuts to your favorite applications on the locked screen for your favorite apps.

Unlocking the screen

Unlocking the Visual Screen Lock

When you do not use the phone for a specified length of time or press the LOCK/PWR key, the screen turns off and the phone locks.

1. Press the LOCK/PWR key.
2. Tap and drag XX to XX.
 - You can also drag an application shortcut to XX to unlock the screen and launch the application..

Unlocking the Android Screen Lock

When you do not use the phone for a specified length of time or press the LOCK/PWR key, the screen turns off and the phone locks automatically.

1. Press the LOCK/PWR key.
2. Tap and drag XX to XX.
 - You can also tap and drag XX to XX to unlock the screen and launch the camera application.

Unlocking the Modern Screen Lock

When you do not use the phone for a specified length of time or press the LOCK/PWR key, the screen turns off and the phone locks.

1. Press the LOCK/PWR key.
2. Tap and drag XX into the circle.
 - You can also drag an application shortcut into the circle to unlock the screen and launch the application.

Locking the phone

Setting an unlock Patter, PIN, or Password

You must connect at least four dots for a pattern lock, enter at least four numbers for a PIN lock, or enter a password that is at least four characters long (at least one character must be a letter).

1. Tap **Menu > Settings > System**.
2. Tap **Security > Screen lock**.
3. Select and tap a lock type, and then follow the on-screen instructions.
 - Tap **No** to disable the screen lock.

Setting the Face Unlock Function

You can use this feature to recognize your face for unlocking the phone. The face unlock function is less secure than locking the phone with a pattern, PIN, or password.

1. Tap **Menu > Settings > System > Face unlock**.
2. Tap **Set it up > Continue**.
3. Align your face with the figure on the screen.
4. Tap **Continue** when your face is captured.
4. Select and tap the secondary unlock type.

Unlocking the phone

Unlocking the phone with a pattern

1. Press the LOCK/PWR key.
2. Draw a pattern on the screen.

You can make emergency call without having to unlock the screen.

If you forget your pattern

If you draw an incorrect pattern more than five times in a row, you cannot retry for 30 seconds. When this happens, you can unlock the phone by entering your Google account information.

If you draw an incorrect pattern more than 20 times, times total, you must do one of the following to unlock it:

Unlocking the phone with a PIN or Password

1. Press the LOCK/PWR key.
2. Enter your PIN or password, and then tap **OK** or **Complete**.

Note: You can make emergency calls without having to unlock the screen.

If you forget your PIN or password

If you enter an incorrect PIN or password more than three times in a row, the screen for entering a PIN unlock key (PUK) appears. Visit the Pantech website or a Pantech Service Center to unlock the phone.

If you enter the incorrect PUK more than 10 times

If you enter an incorrect PUK more than 10 times in a row, your SIM or USIM card will be permanently disabled. A new SIM or USIM card to use your phone.

Unlocking the phone with face recognition

phone unlocks when you align your face to the figure on the screen. If the phone fails to recognize your face, use secondary unlock type to unlock the phone.

1. Press the LOCK/PWR key.
2. Align your face with the figure on the screen.

Using the touch screen

About the touch screen

- Do not subject the touch screen to strong impacts.
- Do not use sharp tools that can scratch the touch screen.
- Do not allow the touch screen to come in contact with water or chemicals.
- Do not sit on the phone. Doing so may damage the touch screen.

Performing touch screen commands

Tap: Tap once to access a menu or an option.

Double tap: Tap an item twice.

Drag: Tap and hold your finger on an item and then move your finger without lifting it from the screen.

Flick: Place a finger on the screen and move the screen up, down, left, or right.

Pinch: Place two fingers on the screen and then spread them apart to zoom in, or move them together to zoom out.

Select and tap: Tap an item in a list.

Press and hold: Touch and hold an area for a few seconds.

Entering text

Entering text with the Android keyboard

Enter text with the keypad at the bottom of the screen. The keyboard shows word suggestions as you type. Tap a word to use it.

Editing text

1. Tap and hold the point where you want to start copying or cutting.
2. Drag the handles to adjust the selection.
 - Tap XX to select all text.
3. Tap XX (cut) or XX (copy).
4. Tap XX (paste) at the point where you want to paste the text.

Adding a word to the User dictionary

Add frequently-used words to the user dictionary for later use. You cannot add words that are already registered in the word suggestion list.

1. Enter a word in the text input field.
2. Tap the word.

To Insert a Word from the User Dictionary

Enter a few characters of the word, and then tap the word when it appears in the word suggestion list.

Understanding the Home screen

Layout of the Home screen

Home screen is the starting point to use applications. Access widgets, shortcuts, or folders, and display a wallpaper according to your preference. Home screen consists of seven panels.

No.	Description
1	Notification bar View the phone's status, battery usage, current time, and so on.
2	Background screen <ul style="list-style-type: none">Flick to the left or right to move to another panel. (Three panels on the left and three panels on the right)Pinch your fingers apart to hide icons.Pinch your fingers together to edit the Home screen.
3	Panel location bar View the number of panels and the location of the current panel. <ul style="list-style-type: none">Drag the white line to move to another panel.Tap the line for the desired panel to switch to it directly.
4	Shortcuts and folders bar View shortcut icons and folders <ul style="list-style-type: none">Tap a shortcut to run the app.Tap a folder to open it.

No.	Description
5	Launcher bar View shortcut icons and the menu icon. <ul style="list-style-type: none">Tap a shortcut to run the app.Tap Menu to open the menu screen.Flick to the left or right to view the Home screen settings bar (6) or the Shortcuts and folders bar (4).
6	Home screen settings bar Access settings for the Home screen.
7	Navigation buttons <ul style="list-style-type: none">XX(Back): Return to the previous screen.XX(Home): Return to the Home screen.XX(Recent apps): View a list of the recently accessed apps.

Navigating the Easy setting, Detail settings, and Notification screen

The Easy Setting, Detail Settings, and Notification help manage a few important functions easily and check ongoing events such network, GPS, alarm, or sound setting or the current running applications. Drag the top of the home screen down.

Close the Detail Settings.

Clear all notifications.

Drag it up to close the screen.

Customizing the Home screen

Adding a widget or shortcut

1. On the Home screen, tap and hold the empty area, or flick the Shortcuts and folders bar to the left and tap **Widget**.
2. Tap and hold an item to add, and drag it to the desired location.
 - Tap an item to automatically arrange it.
 - Tap an item with a number in it to view widgets and shortcuts inside the item.

Adding a folder

Add a folder that contains shortcuts or app icons to Background screen.

1. On the Background screen, tap and hold an icon, and drag it onto another icon.
2. Release your finger when a folder is created.

To add an icon to a folder

Tap and hold an icon on the Background screen, and drag it on to the folder.

Rearranging or deleting an icon, widget, or folder

Rearrange or delete icons, widgets, or folders on the Background screen and the Launcher bar. You can also place them on the Launcher bar.

1. On the Background screen, tap and hold an icon, widget, or folder.
2. Drag it to the desired location or to XX at the top of the screen.

Rearranging or deleting a panel

1. On the Background screen, pinch two fingers apart.
2. Tap and hold a panel, and drag it to the desired location or to XX at the top of the screen.

Adding a panel

You can add a panel when the total number of the panels on the Home screen is less than seven. You can create up to seven panels.

1. On the Background screen, pinch two fingers together.
2. Tap **New Panel**.

Using the Shortcuts and folders bar

Moving or deleting shortcut icons or folders

Move shortcut icons or folders on the Shortcuts and folder bar of the Homescreen to the Background screen, or delete them.

1. Flick the Launcher bar to the right on the Home screen
 2. Tap and hold a shortcut icon or folder, and drag it to the desired location or to XX at the top of the screen.
- ① **Note** To move an icon in a folder to the Background screen or delete it, open a folder, tap and hold the icon, and drag it to the desired location or to XX at the top of the screen.

Using the Home screen settings bar

Setting the Home screen wallpaper

1. Flick the Launcher bar to the left on the Home screen
2. Tap XX **Wallpaper**.
3. Tap a desired tab.
4. Tap a desired wallpaper.

(when you tap the **Gallery** tab)

- ① Move the blue lines to enlarge or reduce the area.

5. Tap **Set wallpaper** or **CROP**.

Changing the Home screen theme

1. Flick the Launcher bar to the left on the Home screen.
2. Tap **XX Home Theme**.
3. Flick the screen to the left or right to select a theme, and tap **Apply**.
 - Tap **XX** to edit the theme name.
 - Tap **XX** to delete the theme.

Deleting the user theme from the home screen

1. Press **XX** in idle mode and tap **Themes**.
2. Press **XX** and tap **Delete** if your phone has the saved user themes.
3. Select and tap one of the personal themes.
4. Tap **Done**.

Using Task Manager

Accessing recently used apps

Use the Task Manager to access recently used apps

1. Tap **XX**.
2. Tap a desired app.
 - Flick the app to the left or right to delete it from the list.
 - Tap and hold the app to delete it or view the app information.

Closing running apps

If you start an app and do not close it using the Task Manager, the app remains active even when you switch to the Home screen or start another app. Launching multiple apps can slow down the performance of the apps. Close unnecessary apps using the Task Manager.

Tap **Menu** > **Task Manager**.

Tap **End** next to an app.

Optimizing the system

When you launch multiple apps at a time or the CPU's sharing is high, the usage of battery and system load will increase. Check the CPU's sharing, RAM usage, and so on using the Task Manager, and optimize the system.

Tap **Menu** > **Task Manager**.

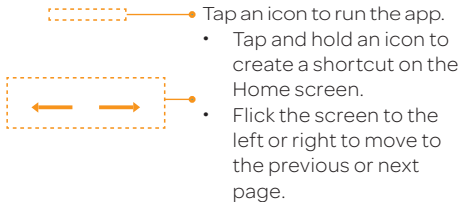

Using the Applications menu

Layout of the Applications menu screen

You can sort pre-installed apps and downloaded apps by group, in the alphabetical order, or view downloaded apps alone.

Press **Menu**.



Sort apps.

- 1 Tap **Groups** to manually arrange icons.
- 1 Tap **Alphabetical** to sort icons in the alphabetical order (flick up and down to search for apps).
- Tap **Downloads** to view downloaded apps.
- 2 Create a new group.

Using the menu options

Use the menu options to configure the menu screen.

Press **Menu**.

Tap **XX**.

- 1 Search for an app.
Rearrange or delete an app; Hide an app; View an app information.
 - Tap and hold an app to move it to a new location.
 - 2 Tap and hold an app, and drag it to **Storage** to hide.
 - Tap and hold an app, and drag it to **App Info** to view the app information.
 - Tap **XX** to delete an app.
 - 3 Edit group order or rename group titles.
 - 4 Access the Android Market.
 - 5 Share an app with other people.
 - 6 Change Icons.
 - 7 View the tutorial.
- ① **Note** Available items when you tap **XX** differ depending on sorting method (**Groups**, **Alphabetical**, or **Downloads**).

Connecting to the Internet

Connecting to a Wi-Fi network

When you turn on Wi-Fi after turning on the phone first time or resetting the phone, Wi-Fi settings screen appears.

1. Drag the top of the home screen down.
2. Tap XX **Wi-Fi** in **Easy Setting** to turn on Wi-Fi.
 - Tap XX **Wi-Fi** to turn off Wi-Fi.
3. Select and tap a network in the Wi-Fi network list.

- 1 Tap **ON** to turn off Wi-Fi.
 - 2 Unsecured network
 - 3 Secured network
 - 4 Tap **ADD NETWORK** to add a Wi-Fi network.
 - 5 Tap **SCAN** to search for available Wi-Fi networks again.
 - 6 Tap XX to access advanced settings and configure WPS connection.

① **Note** You must enter a password to connect to a secured Wi-Fi network.

Configuring Wi-Fi settings

If you turn off Wi-Fi and turn it on again, the phone automatically connects to the most recently connected network. To connect to another Wi-Fi network or configure Wi-Fi settings, drag the top of the home screen down, and tap XX **Wi-Fi** in **Detail Settings**. You can also tap **Menu** > **Settings** > **WIRELESS & NETWORKS** > **Wi-Fi**.

Connecting to a mobile network

You will need a data plan to access a mobile network.

1. Drag the top of the home screen down.
2. Tap XX **Data** in **Easy Setting** to turn on mobile network.
 - Tap XX **Data** to turn off mobile network.

Configuring mobile network settings

Tap **Settings** > **WIRELESS & NETWORKS** > **More...** > **Mobile networks** > **Data Services** to enable data access over mobile network.

Setting up a Bluetooth Connection

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless technology that enables wireless connections between electronic devices over a distance of about 10 meters.

Turning on Bluetooth

1. Drag the top of the home screen down.
2. Tap XX **Bluetooth** in **Easy Setting** to turn on Bluetooth.
 - Tap XX Bluetooth to turn off Bluetooth.

Pairing with devices

1. Drag the top of the home screen down.
2. Tap XX **Bluetooth** in **Detail Settings**.
3. Tap **OFF** next to **Bluetooth**.
4. Select and tap a device from the list.
5. Tap **Pair**.
 - If you are prompted to enter PIN, follow the instructions on the screen.

① Note

- You can also pair with devices by tapping **Menu > Settings > WIRELESS & NETWORKS > Bluetooth** from the Applications menu.
- To disconnect a device, tap **XX** next to the connected device, and then tap **Unpair**.
- Some devices are unpaired as you tap them.
- To use the Bluetooth technology on a PC, the PC must have a built-in Bluetooth technology or you must install an external Bluetooth Dongle. Refer to the User Manual for your PC for more details.

Using Bluetooth

Before using

- You can send data within 10 meters, but if there are obstacles between the devices, the operating distance may be reduced. Other manufacturers' headsets or PCs may be incompatible with your headset.
- Using the Bluetooth technology may affect battery life. Turn off Bluetooth when it is not in use to prevent unnecessary battery consumption.
- Bluetooth may interfere with other wireless devices that use the same frequency band.
- Headsets and hands-free devices may not be discoverable when they are connected to and in use with other devices, or when other devices are attempting to pair with them.
- When you make a call, listen to music, or watch TV with a Bluetooth device, sound quality degrades and the Bluetooth device will turn off as you move away from the handset. If you exceed the operating distance, the speakerphone feature will activate.
- When you use a Bluetooth headset, sound quality may degrade due to obstacles or interference. For optimal performance, use a Bluetooth headset within a short distance with no obstacles.

- You may have difficulty hearing some calls in noisy environments or outdoors, due to surrounding noise.
- Some Bluetooth headsets may not be compatible with the headset.
- When you connect the headset to a Bluetooth-enabled car stereo and tap the screen, the headset will switch to the music screen.

Making a call

If a Bluetooth headset or hands-free device is paired with the handset, it automatically connects to the handset when you make a call. You can make or answer a call by pressing the call key on the Bluetooth headset or hands-free device.

1. Pair the handset with a Bluetooth headset or hands-free device. (Refer to 'Setting up a Bluetooth Connection'.)
2. Start talking.

① Note

- Instructions on using Bluetooth headsets or hands-free devices may vary depending on device type. Refer to the device User Manual for more details.
- Some headsets may automatically attempt to reconnect when they are disconnected. The service status of the reconnection may differ from your settings.
- You can switch between a headset and the handset by long-pressing the call key on the Bluetooth headset when the hands-free device is connected. You can also tap **Bluetooth** on the screen during a call. Some Bluetooth headsets do not support the switching function.

Enjoying multimedia

Listen to music and watch video or TV with a Bluetooth headset or hands-free device.

1. Pair the headset with a Bluetooth headset or hands-free device. (Refer to 'Setting up a Bluetooth Connection'.)
2. Tap **Menu**.
3. Tap **Music, Videos, or Live TV**.

① Note

- Instructions on using Bluetooth headsets or hands-free devices may vary depending on device type. Refer to the device User Manual for more details.
- If a headset is connected in stereo, you can connect one more stereo headset in the device list and listen to music through two headsets. Sound quality may degrade when you connect two headsets, due to differences in specifications between them.
- Adjusting the volume on a headset only affects the headset volume. The volume of the handset must be adjusted on the handset.

Transferring data

Transfer multimedia files, contacts, and so on from the phone to other devices.

Transferring photos and videos from Gallery

Pair the phone with a Bluetooth headset or hands-free device. (Refer to 'Setting up a Bluetooth Connection'.) > Tap **Menu** > **Gallery** > a desired photo or video > XX > connected Bluetooth device.

Transferring contacts from People

Pair the phone with a Bluetooth headset or hands-free device. (Refer to 'Setting up a Bluetooth Connection'.) > Tap **Menu** > **People** > Tap and hold a desired contact > **Share contact** > **Bluetooth** > connected Bluetooth device.

① Note

- Steps and displayed items differ depending on content type.
- If a device is disconnected while it attempts to connect to the handset, a window for entering a passcode will appear when you attempt to pair again. You must enter the correct passcode to complete the connection.
- Transferrable data types may differ depending on the device type.
- Tap **Stop** to cancel transferring.

Configuring Bluetooth settings

1. Tap **Settings** from the Applications menu.
2. Tap **WIRELESS & NETWORKS** > **Bluetooth**.
 - Turn on Bluetooth, if it is turned off.
3. Tap XX > an option

Option	Description
Rename phone	Change the handset's Bluetooth name.
Visibility timeout	Set the length of time during which the handset is visible to other devices.
Show received files	View received files via Bluetooth.

Installing or uninstalling apps

Installing apps from Play Store

Download useful apps from Play Store and use them for your purposes. You must consent to the Play Store Terms of Service if you are accessing the Play Store for the first time.

Tap **Play Store** from the Applications menu.

1. Search for a desired app.
2. Select and tap an app.
3. Follow the on-screen instructions to install.

① **Note**

- Setting screens and steps may vary without prior notice.
- To view installed apps, tap **Menu** and move to the last page, or tap the bottom left corner of the screen to select **Downloads**.
- You can view the installation progress by dragging the top of the home screen down.
- If you access Play Store for the first time without registering a Google Account, the account registration screen appears. Follow the on-screen instructions to register an account.

Deleting apps

Tap **Menu**.

1. Tap the bottom left corner of the screen to select **Downloads**.
2. Tap **XX > Edit**.
3. Select and tap an application > **OK**.

Calling

Making a call

1. Tap **XX Phone**.
2. Enter the phone number or speed dial number.
3. Tap **XX** on the bottom of the screen.
 - Tap **XX** to access settings.
4. Tap **XX** to end a call.

① Note

- Tap and hold a speed dial number to make a call. If a speed dial number is more than two digits, tap the first digit shortly, and tap and hold the second digit.
- If you do not tap **XX**, you cannot end a call. Make sure to tap **XX** to end a call. If are using other functions during a call, drag the top of the screen down and tap **XX**, or tap **XX** on the call screen.
- Available items that appear when you tap **XX** differ depending on the number type (phone number or speed dial number).

Adding a pause or a wait to a phone number

Adding a pause

Enter the phone number > Tap **XX** > **Add 3-sec pause** > Enter the additional numbers > Tap **XX**. The additional number will be automatically entered after 3 seconds.

Adding a wait

Enter the phone number > Tap **XX** > **Add wait** > Enter the additional numbers > Tap **XX**.

When the **Send following tones?** message appears on the screen, tap **Yes**

Answering a call

1. Drag **XX** into the circle as shown below to answer a call.
 - Drag **XX** into the circle to reject a call with a message.
 - Press **XX** (volume key) to mute the ringtone or stop the vibration.
2. Start talking.
3. Tap **XX** to end a call.

① Note

- Caller ID may be displayed differently or not be displayed depending on your party's circumstances. Contact your service provider for more details.
- If you do not tap **XX**, you cannot end a call. Make sure to tap **XX** to end a call. If are using other functions during a call, drag the top of the screen down and tap **XX**, or tap **XX** on the call screen.

Rejecting a call

Drag **XX** into the circle to reject a call. You can send a message afer rejecting a call.

Checking missed calls

Drag the top of the screen down when **XX** appears at the notification bar. You can also check missed calls by tapping **XX Phone** > **Call log**.

Using functions during a call

Tap the menu icons that appear on the screen during a call to use a variety of functions.

Speaker	Talk through the speaker.
Noise free	Turn Noise Suppression on.
Bluetooth	Talk through the Bluetooth.
Hold	Place a call on hold.
Swap	Switch between two calls.
Mute	Mute the phone.
Dialpad	Switch to the dialer.
End	End a call.
Add call	Dial a second call.
Merge	Make a conference call.

① **Note** You can adjust the volume by pressing XX (volume key).

Managing Call Logs

Tap the menu icons that appear on the screen during a call to use a variety of functions.

1. Tap **XX Phone > Call log**.
2. Tap a call log to view details.
 - Tap and hold to make a call, send a message, send an email, view contact, or delete from Call log.
3. View the log.

① **Note** Up to 1,000 call logs for received and dialed calls are displayed.

Creating Contacts

Save new contacts to your phone or your Google account. If you have registered more than two Google accounts, you can select an account to save contacts to.

3. Enter related information.

Setting a Speed Dial Number

1. Tap **People**.

Viewing Saved Contacts

 - Type the first letter to get the names starting with that letter.
3. View the contact information.
 - Tap **XX** to designate as a favorite.
 - Tap **XX** to edit, share, or delete contact, or set ringtone and reject calls.

Deleting Contacts

Syncing Contacts with Google Account

① **Note** You must register a Google account to sync contacts with it. For more details, refer to page **XX**.

Setting Contacts Groups

Manage multiple contacts in groups. If you have registered more than two Google accounts, you must select an account to set groups.

4. Enter a group name and add group members.

Adding Group Members

After entering a group name, tap **XX > a desired member > XX**. You can also manually type the name of a desired member to add.

Managing Groups

Tap and hold a group in the group list, and select and tap an item. You can edit the group or set group ringtone. Select and tap group, and tap XX. You can send a message to up to 20 group members by tapping **Send**.

Adding to Favorite Contacts

1. Tap **People**.
2. Select and tap a contact, and tap **XX**.
 - You can also tap and hold a desired contact, and tap **Add to favorites**.

① **Note** You can view your favorite contacts by tapping **People > FAVORITES**. For more details, refer to page XX.

Messaging

Viewing the Conversations List

You can view 500 conversations by default. Drag up the list to view additional 100 conversations.

1. Tap **Messages**.
2. View the conversations list.
 - Tap XX to delete a conversation, select a quick text or template, check a voice mail, or access settings.

Searching for a message

In the conversations list, tap XX > **Search**, and enter a keyword.

① **Note** Available items that appear when you tap XX differ depending on whether you have received a message or not.

Viewing a Conversation

View sent and received messages in a conversation and sort conversations by date or contact name.

1. Tap **Messages**.
2. Select and tap a conversation.
 - Tap the photo to view options.
3. View the messages.
 - Tap and hold a message to delete, reply to, or forward it, or save attachment, view message information, and so on.
 - Tap XX to insert text, add slide, add cc/bcc, save as templates, move to the SIM or USIM card, and so on.

Sorting Conversations

In the conversations list, tap XX > **Sort** > a desired option.

① **Note** Available options differ depending on the message type (sent or received message) or contact information.

Sending a new message

Send text (SMS) or multimedia (MMS) messages.

3. Enter the recipient's number, speed dial number, or email address.

Using the Camera

Before Using

- It is recommended that you take a picture in bright areas. Avoid direct fluorescent or bulb lights.
- To achieve good pictures, ensure that the subject is stable and you hold the phone firmly
- The camera sensor needs some time to automatically adjust the exposure. Wait until the camera achieves correct exposure.
- The built-in camera is vulnerable to impact. Be careful not to drop the phone. Wipe the camera lens regularly with a soft cloth.
- The phone consumes more battery power when you use the camera. It is recommended you bring additional batteries
- The shutter sound is always emitted even when you set the silent mode.
- Location information may be saved to pictures depending on the GPS settings.
- Use the camera responsibly and adhere to all laws and regulations concerning its use.

Taking Pictures

The camera automatically detects a scene and adjusts the focus. You can tap the screen to focus on a desired area. Captured pictures are saved in the **Camera** folder under the Gallery app.

1. Tap **Menu > Camera**.
2. Tap **XX**.

1	Open menus and options.
2	Switch to the front camera.
3	Switch to video or panorama mode.

- You can also take a picture by pressing the volume key.

Downloading Music or Video Files from a PC

Listening to Music

Controlling Music on Lockscreen

- The instructions in this manual are based on the default playback screen. Available items may differ depending on the tap you selected.

Creating a Playlist

FCC Hearing-Aid Compatibility Regulations for Wireless Devices

On July 10, 2003, the U.S. Federal Communications Commission (FCC) Report and Order in WT Docket 01-309 modified the exception of wireless phones under the Hearing Aid Compatibility Act of 1988 (HAC Act) to require digital wireless phones be compatible with hearing-aids. The intent of the HAC Act is to ensure reasonable access to telecommunications services for persons with hearing disabilities.

While some wireless phones are used near some hearing devices (hearing aids and cochlear implants), users may detect a buzzing, humming, or whining noise. Some hearing devices are more immune than others to this interference noise, and phones also vary in the amount of interference they generate.

The wireless telephone industry has developed a rating system for wireless phones, to assist hearing device users find phones that may be compatible with their hearing devices. Not all phones have been rated. Phones that are rated have the rating on their boxes or a label located on the boxes.

The ratings are not guarantees. Results will vary depending on the user's hearing device and hearing loss. This should provide the hearing aid user with “normal usage” while using their hearing aid with the particular wireless phone. “Normal usage” in this context is defined as a signal quality that is acceptable for normal operation.

The M mark is intended to be synonymous with the U mark. The T mark is intended to be synonymous with the UT mark. The M and T marks are recommended by the Alliance for Telecommunications Industries Solutions (ATIS). The U and UT marks are referenced in Section 20.19 of the FCC Rules. The

HAC rating and measurement procedure are described in the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) C63.19 standard.
