Thank you for choosing the Pantech phone, our latest smartphone. The Pantech phone has many features designed to enhance your mobile experience. With its unique, stylish design you will enjoy the entire phone experience.

This User Guide contains important and useful information that will maximize your familiarity with all that the Pantech phone has to offer.

Important Safety Information

Safety information

The following list shows how to maintain your mobile phone and precautions to take as you use the device.

- Keep your mobile phone and its accessories out of the reach of children and pets.
- Maintain your mobile phone in dry conditions and keep it within normal operating temperatures. It may be damaged at temperatures higher than 55°C/131°F or lower than -20°C/-4°F.
- Do not dry your phone in a microwave oven. Sparks may occur and cause an explosion or fire.
- Do not use or store your mobile phone in dusty, dirty areas.
- · Do not disassemble your mobile phone.
- Do not drop or cause severe impact to your mobile phone.
- Do not clean your mobile phone with chemical products, cleaning solvents or detergents.
- Contact your dealer immediately if your mobile phone does not work properly.
- Use only authorized batteries, battery chargers and accessories. Any malfunction or damage caused by the use of unauthorized batteries, battery chargers and accessories will void the limited product warranty.
- Ensure that the battery and the battery charger do not come in contact with conductive objects.
- For optimal performance, use cases and accessories that do not contain magnets.

Safety precautions

- · Using a mobile phone while driving is prohibited.
- Using a mobile phone while driving can distract your attention and cause an accident. Always switch your phone off to drive safely.
- In an emergency, use a hands-free device built into your car or pull over in a safe place first.
- Check local laws and regulations and comply with them, with regard to the prohibition of mobile phone use while driving.

Switch off in restricted areas

Always switch your phone off in areas where mobile phone use is restricted.

Switch off in an aircraft

Always switch your phone off or select the airplane mode when you are in an aircraft. Electromagnetic waves emitted by your phone may affect the electronic navigation equipment in the aircraft.

Switch off in hospitals and near medical equipment

Always switch your phone off in hospitals and obey their regulations. Switch your phone off when using medical equipment for private purposes. Always consult with the medical equipment's manufacturer or an expert regarding phone use near the medical equipment.

Switch off in dangerous areas

Always switch your phone off in areas where explosive or dangerous materials (e.g. fuels or chemical products) are located and obey relevant instructions or signals. Do not insert or remove your mobile phone's battery in such areas.

Install a hands-free device in a safe location

Install a hands-free device away from the steering wheel and airbag expansion areas. Otherwise you can be injured in a car accident.

Keep away from other electronic devices

Mobile phones emit electromagnetic waves that may affect nearby electronic devices. After switching on your phone, do not place it close to other electronic goods.

About the battery usage

Your phone is powered by a Lithium Ion (Li-Ion) battery. In other words, you can recharge your battery while some charge remains without reducing your phone's autonomy due to the "battery memory effect."

- · Do not use a damaged battery or charger.
- Do not disassemble, open crush, bend, deform, puncture or shred the battery.
- Do not modify or remanufacture, insert foreign objects into the battery, immerse or expose to water or other liquids, expose to fire, explosion or other hazard.
- Do not put your battery in contact with conductive objects.
- Dispose of and recycle used batteries in accordance with local regulations. Do not dispose of batteries by burning; they may explode.


- Do not use an unauthorized charger or battery.
- Use the battery only for the device for which it is specified.
- Use the battery with a charging device that has been qualified for the device per this standard. Use of an unqualified battery or charger may present a risk of fire, explosion, leakage, or other hazard.
- Do not short circuit a battery or allow metallic conductive objects to contact battery terminals.
- Replace the battery only with another battery that has been qualified with the device per this standard, IEEE-Std-1725-2006.
- · Children should be supervised when they use the battery.
- Avoid dropping the phone or the battery. If the phone or the battery is dropped, especially on a hard surface, and the user suspects damage, take it to a service center for inspection.
- · Use your battery for the specified purpose only.
- The closer you move to your network's base station, the longer you can use your phone because less battery power is required for connection.
- The battery recharging time varies depending on the remaining battery capacity and the battery and charger type.
- · Battery life inevitably shortens over time.
- Since overcharging may shorten battery life, remove the phone from its charger once it is fully charged. Unplug the charger once charging is complete. Leaving the battery in hot or cold places, especially inside a car in summer or winter, may reduce its capacity and life.
- To prevent injury or burns, ensure that no metal objects come into contact with the + and - terminals of the battery.

Basic instructions

Useful tips

To understand information contained in this user guide, please keep in mind the following:

- We assume that you start operating applications from the Applications screen.
 - 1. Tap on the bottom of the home screen to access Applications.
 - 2. Flick the screen left or right. (Grid view only)
 Flick the screen up or down. (List view only)
 - 3. Tap an application you want to run and use.



- Words in bold fonts refer to the relevant action on the screen. For example, "Tap Add to contacts" for the screen below means that you have to tap 1.
- Words in all capital letters refer to hard keys of your phone.
 For example, LOCK/PWR indicates the lock/power key on the top right of the handset that locks the screen or turns on/off power.

- The symbol ">" refers to the next action. For example, "Tap Settings > Language & keyboard" means that you should tap Settings first and Language & keyboard next.
- "Applications" refers to the screen where all applications of the phone appear.
- "Home screen" refers to the screen that appears first when you unlock the screen.
- "Idle mode" refers to the status when you stay on the home screen ready to run an application.
- Channels through which you can share your items such as contacts or pictures increase as you subscribe to a service.
 For example, if you sign up for Facebook or Twitter, you can also share your information with others through Facebook or Twitter.

About Google accounts

We recommend that you have a Google account to use some applications provided by Google, e.g. Calendar, Latitude, Market, Talk, of the phone. For more information on setting up a Google account, refer to Activating the phone on page 13.

Follow the outlined steps that should be taken first before using the phone.

Inside the package

The package should contain the following items:

- Handset
- Battery
- MicroSD card
- Adapter
- USB cable

Installing the SIM/USIM card

- Press and hold the latch and slide it to remove the battery cover.
- Insert the SIM/USIM card into the slot. Ensure that the gold contacts of the card go against the metal contacts of the phone.
- 3. Close the battery cover by sliding it up until you hear "click."

About the SIM/USIM card

When you subscribe to the network operator, you receive the Subscriber Identity Module (SIM) card or the Universal Subscriber Identity Module (USIM) card that contains your registration information, PIN code, etc. You should keep it secure and handle carefully. Do not bend, scratch or expose it to moisture. Avoid static electricity.

① **Note** Do not lose or transfer your SIM/USIM card to someone. Pantech is not responsible for damage due to theft or loss.

Installing the microSD card

When you want to handle image files such as photos or videos or an external memory card, use the microSD card.

- Press and hold the latch and slide it to remove the battery cover.
- Insert the microSD card into the slot. Ensure that the gold contacts of the card go against the metal contacts of the phone.
- 3. Close the battery cover by sliding it up until you hear "click."

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About the microSD card

A microSD card is a removable flash memory card where you can save data. Save pictures and contacts, and download applications to the SD card. You can expand the external memory up to 32GB. It is recommended that you format the

microSD card before using the phone. For more information, refer to page 75.

① **Note** We recommend you format the microSD card before using the phone. For more information, refer to page 75.

Inserting the battery

- Press and hold the latch and slide it to remove the battery cover.
- 2. Align the gold contacts on the battery with the contacts located at the top of the battery compartment on the phone.
- 3. Press the battery down until it lays flat in the compartment.
- 4. Close the battery cover by sliding it up until you hear "click."




About the battery

The phone uses a Lithium Ion (Li-Ion) battery. Make sure to use the authorized battery and charger only. Maximum hours to use the battery might vary depending on service types offered by the service provider and temperatures. For more details, inquire at your nearest dealer.


① Note The Li-Ion battery can be recharged while some charge remains without reducing your phone's autonomy due to the "battery memory effect" inherent in those technologies.

Charging the battery

 Open the protective cover on the right side of the phone and connect the charger adapter to the USB connector of the phone.




① Note Make sure to align the connector as indicated in the image. Otherwise, the charging connector will be damaged and the battery will not be charged.

Turning the phone on/off

To turn on the phone,

- 1. Press and hold the LOCK/PWR key for a few seconds.
- 2. Unlock the screen.

To turn the phone off,

- 1. Press and hold the LOCK/PWR key.
- 2. Tap Power off.
- 3. Tap **OK**.
- Note If you press the LOCK/PWR key shortly, the LCD screen turns on or off

Unlocking the screen

The screen is locked by default when you turn on power. To unlock the screen.

- Press the LOCK/PWR key, **■**, **△**, **与** or **Q**.
- Drag one of the application icons into the circle diagonally.
 The phone will open the corresponding application.
- Enter a PIN or a password if the screen is locked by a PIN or a password.

Locking the screen

Lock the screen to protect information in the phone or save the usage of the battery.

To lock the screen, press the LOCK/PWR key in any mode.

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

① Note The phone may not be compatible with specific earphone or headset models. The stereo earphones that support common call management features including making and answering calls have not been standardized. Therefore the phone may not be compatible with some stereo earphones.

Gripping the phone

Hold the phone in the right position for a call as indicated below:



- Make sure not to block the internal antenna embedded in the phone. Check the location of the antenna on the illustration on page 12.
- · Metal accessories can affect the quality of calls.
- ① Note If you place your hand over the area where the internal antenna is installed during a call or transmission/reception of data, the signals may be poor and the battery life may drain very fast

Activating the phone

Go through the following steps when you turn on the phone for the first time.

Learning how to use the phone

- 1. Press and hold the LOCK/PWR key to turn on the phone.
- 2. Tap the android.
- 3. Select and tap a language for the phone and tap Next.
- 4. Tap either **Mobile network or Wi-Fi** or **Wi-Fi only**, for Internet connection and tap **Next**.

- Tap Connect to Wi-Fi network > Next if you want to establish a connection to the Wi-Fi network. Or tap Next if you want to connect to the network later.
- Select and tap an available Wi-Fi network if you have tapped Connect to Wi-Fi network > Next in step 2. Follow the necessary steps to connect to the Wi-Fi network. For more information, refer to page 91.
- 7. Check the mobile network or Wi-Fi network and tap Next.
- 8. Tap See location in applications (such as Maps) using wireless networks to Use Google location, tap Agree for Location consent, and tap Next.
- 9. Tap **Google account** if you want to set up a Google account and follow the necessary steps, or just tap **Next**. For more information on creating a Google account, refer to the next section.
- Check how to unlock screen and tap Next in the middle of the screen.
- 11. Check how to view new events in the notification bar and tap **Next**.
- 12. Tap **Tap here to start typing** in the middle of the screen if you want to learn how to use the onscreen keyboard and follow the instructions. Or you can tap **Skip** and learn it later.
- Tap Sync now for Address Book sync. You should insert a SIM/USIM card in the phone. Tap Skip if you want to sync later and tap OK.

Creating a Google account

After finishing learning how to use the phone:

- Tap Settings > Accounts & sync > Add account
- 2. Tap Google > Next > Create.
- 3. Enter your first name, last name, and user name for the account, and if you finish entering them, tap Next.

 The user name should be less than 6 or more than 30 characters. You can also select an alternative.
- Tap Next > Connect to Wi-Fi if you have not connected the phone to the Wi-Fi network and follow the instructions.
- 6. Tap Next.
- 7. Select and tap a security question and enter an answer.
- 8. Enter a secondary email address and tap > Create.
- 9. Tap I agree, Next for the Google Terms of Service.
- 10. Tap **Try again** if your password is too weak for a password or contains invalid characters.
- 11. Repeat the steps 5 to 9.
- 12. Type the characters that appear on screen and tap 🗾 > Next.
- 13. Tap Finish setup.
- ① **Note** Steps for connecting to Wi-Fi network and Google location service might not appear if you have already done with them.

Using the touch screen

Run an application or perform functions with the touch screen. The following finger actions help you easily understand how to use the touch screen and the phone.

Tap: Tap once to access a menu or an option.

Double tap: Tap an item twice.


Drag: Tap and hold your finger on an item and move it without losing contact with the screen.


Flick: Place a finger on the screen and move the screen up or down, or left or right.

Pinch: Place two fingers on the screen and move them apart to zoom in a picture, a document or a web page, or move them together to zoom out.

Select and tap: Tap one in the list of options available.

Press and hold: Press a key for a few seconds.






① **Note** Use one finger at a time except when you deal with a picture or a document. The phone will not recognize it when you use more than two fingers at the same time.

A CAUTION

- Do not use sharp tools that can scratch the touch screen.
- Do not allow the touch screen to come in contact with water or chemicals. The touch screen may malfunction in humid conditions or in chemicals.
- Do not sit on the phone. The touch screen can be damaged.

Understanding the home screen

Home screen is the starting point to use applications. Access shortcuts, widgets or folders, and display a wallpaper according to your preference.



idle mode

① Note Press you want to move to the home screen.



Navigating the home screen

The phone provides seven different screens where you can place items according to your preference.

- 1. Flick the screen from the left to the right or vice versa.
- 2. Tap a desired application or widget to run.

Navigating the notification and easy setting screen

The Easy Settings and Notification help manage a few important functions easily and check ongoing events such network, GPS, alarm, or soune setting or the current running applications.

- 1. Drag the top of the home screen down.
- 2. Tap an icon in Easy Setting that you want to run. The icon turns orange when the function is on.
- 3. Tap or drag up the bottom of the home screen to close the Easy Setting and notification mode.



Customizing the home screen

Adding a shortcut


- 1. Press and hold on an empty space on the home screen.
- 2. Tap Shortcuts.
- 3. Select and tap an item among those in the list to place on the home screen as a shortcut.



① **Note** You can also make a shortcut of an application by pressing and holding the application in Applications.

Adding a widget

- 1. Press and hold an empty space on the screen.
- 2. Tap Widgets.
- 3. Tap either Pantech Widgets or Android Widgets.
- 4. Select and tap an item among those in the list to place on the home screen as a shortcut.



① Note Make sure to secure enough room on the screen for a widget. Depending on the type of the widget, you have to delete another widget or shortcut or rearrange them.

Adding a folder

- 1. Press and hold an empty space on the home screen.
- 2. Tap Folders.
- 3. Select and tap an item among those in the list to place on the home screen as a shortcut.



Adding a wallpaper from the Gallery

- Press and hold an empty space on the home screen and tap Wallpapers, or press in idle mode and tap Wallpaper.
- 2. Tap Gallery.
- 3. Select and tap a picture and adjust the size.
- 4. Tap Save.
- ① Note If you want to create a live wallpaper, tap Wallpapers > Live wallpapers, select a wallpaper and tap Set wallpaper. Please remember that Maps consumes the battery relatively quickly. Even if you select wallpaper other than Maps, it is recommended that you save the battery consumption by tapping Force stop (Tap Settings > Applications > Manage applications > Maps).

Deleting a shortcut or a widget from the home screen

- 1. Press and hold a shortcut or widget you want to delete.
- 2. Drag it to the trash bin on the bottom of the screen and release it.

Changing the home screen theme

- Press
 ≡ in idle mode and tap Themes. The User theme
 (Unsaved) is selected by default.
- 2. Select and tap a home screen theme among contextual themes and tap **Done**.
- 3. Tap Yes in the saving theme screen, enter a new user theme

name and tap **Done**. The home screen appears under the new name.

Deleting the user theme from the home screen

- 1. Press in idle mode and tap Themes.
- 2. Press and tap Delete.
- 3. Select and tap one of the personal themes.
- 4. Tap Done.

Changing the order of screens

- 1. Press and hold in idle mode.
- 2. Press and hold a screen and drag it to the new position.
- 3. Tap a screen or press ♠ or ★ if you want to go back to the home screen.
- ① Note You can also change the order of screens by pinching to zoom the screen in.

Selecting the language

- 1. Press **=** in idle mode.
- 2. Tap Settings > Language & keyboard > Select language.
- 3. Select and tap a language that you want to use for the phone.
- ① Note We recommend to set the language option first before using other functions.

Understanding the applications menu

When you download an application in the phone, it will be added to the applications menu.

Changing the view mode

Getting Started

- 1. Tap on the bottom of the home screen.
- Press

 and tap List View if in the Alphabetic Grid, User
 Defined Grid, or Date Grid view mode.
- Press and tap Alphabetic Grid, User Defined Grid, or Date Grid to see applications at a glance if in the list view mode



Sorting applications

- 1. Tap ② on the bottom of the home screen.
- 2. Press and tap Sort.
- 3. Select and tap **Alphabetic Grid**, **User Defined Grid**, or **Date Grid**. Sorting function is not available in the list view.

Rearranging applications (User Defined Grid view only)

- 1. Tap on the bottom of the home screen.
- 2. Press and tap Rearrange.
- 3. Press and hold an application and drag it to its new location. If you want to undo your changes, press ≡ and tap Reset.

Changing the background image (Grid view only)

- 1. Tap on the bottom of the home screen.
- 2. Press and tap Background.
- 3. Flick the screen left or right and tap an image you want to change.
- 4. Tap **OK**.

Uninstalling applications (Grid view only)

- 1. Tap on the bottom of the home screen.
- Press and tap Uninstall. The removable downloaded applications will appear. Uninstalling function is not available in the list view.
- 3. Tap an application you want to uninstall.
- 4. Tap **OK**.
- Press and tap Exit if you want to return to the applications menu.

Adding an application shortcut to the home screen

- 1. Tap on the bottom of the home screen.
- 2. Press and hold an application you want to place as a shortcut.
- 3. Drag the shortcut to the new position if you want to rearrange.

Searching applications

- 1. Tap ② on the bottom of the home screen.
- 2. Press **Q**, and enter a word to search.

Calling

Making a call

- 1. Tap on the bottom of the home screen.
- 2. Enter the area code and the phone number. Tap ☑ to delete the previous number. Press and hold ☑ to delete the whole number.
- 3. Tap \(\screen\) on the top of the screen.

Answering and ending a call

- 1. Drag to the right to answer the call.
- Tap to end a call during the conversation. After ending a call, its summary is shortly displayed.

Adjusting the volume

- Press the volume key + to increase the volume during a call.
 Press the volume key to decrease the volume during a call.
- ① Note Press the volume key in idle mode if you want to adjust the ringer volume. If you want to set it to the vibration mode, press the volume key all the way down until the mode appears.

Holding and unholding a call

- 1. Tap **Hold** during a call. The party will hear nothing.
- 2. Tap **Unhold** to resume the call.
- 3. Tap **End** to finish the call.

Turning Noise Suppression on/off

- 1. Press during holding a call.
- 2. Select and tap an option you want.

Swapping a call for a multiparty call

- Tap Add call during a call. The first party will hear a waiting sound.
- 2. Tap Swap to change the calling party.
- 3. Tap **End** to finish the call.

Making a conference call

- 1. Tap on the bottom of the home screen.
- 2. Enter the area code and the phone number.
- 3. Tap **Add call** to invite a third party to the call.
- 4. Tap **Merge calls** to let all the parties to participate in the conversation.



Making a call from the Address Book

- 1. Tap on the bottom of the home screen.
- 2. Tap Contacts, select and tap a contact to call.
- Tap Call home, Call mobile or Call work according to your preferences.
- Note To open Contacts simply, tap in from the home or applications
 menuscreen

Making an emergency call

- 1. Tap Emergency call when the screen is locked.
- 2. Tap 911 or other numbers for emergency calls.

Checking missed calls

- 1. Tap on the bottom of the home screen.
- 2. Tap Call log and check missed calls.
- 3. Select and tap a number to call back.
- 4. Tap a if you want to make a call to the number.

Checking the call history

- 1. Tap on the bottom of the home screen.
- 2. Tap Call log.
- 3. Select and tap a contact to see.
- 4. Tap G if you want to make a call to the contact.
- ① Note The displayed call time is not equal to the call charge. You can search Call & Date usage when you press in the Call log mode.

Checking your voice mail

- 1. Tap on the bottom of the home screen.
- 2. Press and hold 1 on the keypad.
- ① **Note** The screen moves to the voice mail contact editing screen if the number has not been designated for the voice mail.

Saving a new contact

- 1. Tap on the bottom of the home screen.
- 2. Enter a telephone number.
- 3. Press and tap Add to contacts.
- 4. Tap Create new contact.
- 5. Enter necessary information of the contact and tap Save.

Talking through the speaker

- Tap Speaker during a call. A white bar appears under Speaker when the function is on.
- 2. Tap **Speaker** if you want to stop using the function.
- ① Note If a headset is connected to the phone, the speaker does not work.

Talking through the Bluetooth

- Tap **Bluetooth** during a call. A white bar appears under
 Bluetooth when the function is on.
- 2. Tap **Bluetooth** if you want to stop using the function.
- ① **Note** Refer to the relevant manual of the Bluetooth headset for more information

Muting the phone

- Tap Mute during a call. A white bar appears under Mute when the function is on.
- 2. Tap Mute if you want to turn off the function.

Adding a call

- Tap Add call to make a call to another party during a call with a party.
- 2. Enter the telephone number and tap 📞
- ① Note The current call is held when you make a call with another party.

Using the Yellow Pages

- 1. Tap on the home screen.
- 2. Tap ▶ > YP.
- 3. Tap **Change** (You can specify the location where you want to find business). If you don't change, it would do a search near current location by default.
- Select and tap a business name that you want to see from each category, or enter a business name and tap 2.



Messaging

Sending a new message

- 1. Tap **Messaging** from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap New message.
- 3. Enter the recipient's number or tap ♣, > a contact > **Done**. Enter another recipient's number or tap ♣ if you want to send a message to multi people.
- 4. Tap in the message field and then enter a message using the virtual keyboard.
- 5. Tap **Send**.



Accessing the Internet

Opening a new window

- 2. Press and tap New window. Another window appears.

Viewing the thumbnail windows

- 1. Tap **Web** from the applications menu.
- 2. Press and tap Windows.
- 3. Select and tap a window on the bottom of the screen that you want to see.
- 4. Tap on the screen. You can see the window in full screen view.



Adding bookmarks as Widget

- 1. Tap Web from the applications menu.
- Press and tap Bookmarks while you are visiting a web page.
- 3. Tap +Add on the top of the screen.
- 4. Enter the name and location of the website and tap **OK**.



Viewing browser history

1. Tap **Web** from the applications menu.

- 2. Press and tap Bookmarks.
- Tap Most visited if you want to see web pages that you visit
 the most. Tap the star icon next to the website if you want to
 add it to bookmarks.
- Tap **History** if you want to see past browsing activity. Press
 and tap **Clear history** if you want to delete the browsing history.

Setting the display options

- 1. Tap Web from the applications menu.
- 2. Press and tap More > Settings.
- 3. Tap Text size, select and tap your preferred text size.
- 4. Tap **Default zoom**, select and tap your preferred zoom mode.
- Tap Block pop-up windows if you want to prevent pop-up windows from appearing. The check box is selected by default.

Setting privacy options

- 1. Tap Web from the applications menu.
- 2. Press and tap More.
- 3. Tap Settings.
- 4. Tap Clear all cookie data > OK if you want to delete all cookie data.
- 5. Tap Clear form data > OK if you want to delete all form data.

Shopping in the Android Market

Download useful applications from the Android Market and use them for your purposes.

Downloading applications

- 1. Tap Market from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap **Next** and follow the necessary steps for adding a Google account if you do not have a Google account.
- 3. Tap **Accept** on the Android Market Terms of Service if you are accessing the Android Market for the first time.
- Tap Apps in the middle of the screen if you want to install useful applications.
- 5. Select and tap a category.
- 6. Tap Top paid, Top free or Just in.
- 7. Select and tap an application.
- 8. Tap FREE > OK for free applications. Tap the paid price > OK and follow the necessary steps for paid applications.



Searching places

- Tap Maps from the applications menu. You can see your current location on the map.
- ① Note Make sure to connect to wireless networks or GPS satellites by tapping Settings > Location & security and tapping either Use wireless networks or Use GPS satellites.
- 2. Tap on the search box and type the keyword using the virtual keyboard and tap 🗗 or 🌯.
- 3. Tap lif you want to see the result list. lappears when there are many results that match your search.
- 4. Select and tap the location that you want to see, and check the related information.



Zooming in and out of the map

- 1. Tap 🕀 to zoom in the map.
- 2. Tap Q to zoom out of the map.

① Note You can double-tap the screen to zoom in the map.

Searching directions

- 1. Tap Maps from the applications menu.

- 3. Enter the name of the place you want to visit.
- 4. Decide whether you want to go to the end point by car, public transportation, or foot.
- 5. Tap **Go**.

Searching the current location on the map

Using Places

Finding places

- Tap Places from the applications menu.
- Enter a keyword in the search box, or tap Restaurants, Coffee, Bars, Attractions, ATMs, Gas Stations, or Explore Nearby.
- 3. Select and tap a place in the search results.
- ① Note If you want to sort the result by distance or ratings by customers, tap **Distance** or **Rating** in the search results.

Viewing places at a glance

- 1. Tap **Places** from the applications menu.
- 2. Select and tap a category.
- 3. Press in the search results and tap See map. You can see related places in the map.

Adding a category for places

- 1. Tap Places from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap **Add** on the bottom of the screen and enter a category to add. The category appears on the screen.

Adding starred places

- 1. Tap **Places** from the applications menu.
- 2. Select and tap a category.
- 3. Select and tap a place that you want to see.
- 4. Tap the star icon for each place. When selected, the icon turns yellow.
- ① Note You can see stared places by pressing **and** tapping **Starred Places** in the first screen of Places.

Using Latitude

Share your location with your friends or check those of your friends. Make sure to have a Google account to use Latitude.

Joining Latitude

- 1. Tap **Latitude** from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap **OK** for the tip on the updated map.
- 3. Tap **Allow & Share** if you allow your location to be informed to your friends. The Latitude screen appears shortly where your personal information is displayed.
- 4. Press if you want to see your location in the map.

Adding friends from contacts

- 1. Tap Latitude from the applications menu.
- 2. Press and tap Add friends.
- 3. Tap Select from Contacts.
- 4. Select and tap the contact you want to add as your friend and tap **Add friends**.
- ① Note All contacts are displayed by default. If you want to classify contacts, tap All Contacts on the top of the screen, and select and tap a category of contacts.
- 5. Tap Yes if you want to send sharing requests.

Adding friends from email addresses

- 1. Tap Latitude from the applications menu.
- 2. Press and tap Add friends.
- 3. Tap Add via email address.
- 4. Enter the email address of your friend and tap Add friends.
- 5. Tap Yes if you want to send sharing requests.

Accepting invitation from friends

- 1. Tap **Latitude** from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap 1 new sharing request on the top of the screen.
- Tap Accept and share back. You can see the location of your friend shortly below.



3. Tap Change your photo, tap either Take a picture or Pick from gallery, and change your photo.



Managing friends

- 3. Tap **Real-time updating**, and select and tap the time interval for refreshing locations.
- 4. Tap **Sharing options**, and select and tap an option.

Checking personal settings



- 5. Tap Use My Location if you allow your location to be used for Google search results.

Selecting items that can be searched

- 2. Press and tap Search settings.
- 3. Tap Searchable items.
- 4. Select and tap items you want to include for the search result.

Managing search history

- 1. Tap Google Search from the applications menu.
- 2. Press and tap Manage search history.

- ① Note Make sure to tap Search history first if you want to use Manage search history.
- 3. Enter the email address and password for your Google account
- 4. Select and tap search history in the list and tap Remove if vou want to remove the search history.

News & Weather

News and Weather offers news in various fields and weather information in your region.

Viewing weather information

- 1. Tap News & Weather from the applications menu. Information on your current region for the moment is provided by default.
- 2. Tap on the weather information in the middle of the screen if you want to check the weather forecast throughout the dav.
- 3. Tap on the chart and drag the vertical bar on the screen to the left or right if you want to see weather information for a certain time of the day.

Connectivity

This chapter introduces useful tips on how to connect to the network available that enables applications of the phone to run.

Using a Wi-Fi network

Connecting to a Wi-Fi network

- 1. Tap **Settings** from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap Wireless & networks > Wi-Fi settings.
- 3. Tap Wi-Fi to activate the technology.

Activating Wi-FI

- Select and tap a network. You should enter the password if the network is secured. indicates a secured Wi-Fi network.
- 5. Tap **Connect**. Once the network is remembered, the phone will automatically connect to it when in range.



① Note The icon next to each network indicates the strength of the signal. For example, ? indicates the signal is poor while ? indicates the signal is strong.

Connecting to a Wi-Fi

network

Using the Easy Setting

- Tap on the top of the home screen and drag it down, or press in idle mode and tap Notifications.
- 2. Tap in Easy Setting. The icon turns red when the function is on

About network notifications

You are informed by default when a Wi-Fi network is available around you. The message an in the status bar indicates a network is available. Tap **Network notification** in the Wi-Fi settings if you do not want to be informed the availability of the network

Setting Wi-Fi networks

- 1. Tap **Settings** from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap Wireless & networks > Wi-Fi settings.
- 3. Tap Wi-Fi to activate the technology.
- 4. Tap **Automatic connection** if you want the phone to connect to Wi-Fi network automatically.
- Tap WPS button connection if you want to establish a new wireless connection using the Wi-Fi Protected Setup (WPS). You should press WPS button on your Wi-Fi access point within two minutes.

Searching for Wi-Fi networks

- 1. Tap **Settings** from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap Wireless & networks > Wi-Fi settings.
- 3. Tap **Wi-Fi** to activate the technology. The phone scans networks automatically every six seconds. The newly found networks appear on the bottom of the list.

Adding a Wi-Fi network

- 1. Tap **Settings** from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap Wireless & networks > Wi-Fi settings.
- 3. Tap Wi-Fi to activate the technology.
- 4. Tap Add Wi-Fi network.
- Enter Network SSID and select the security type among Open, WEP, WPA/WPA2 PSK and 802.1x EAP. Aside from Open, you must enter a password for the network.
- 6. Tap Save.

Disconnecting to a Wi-Fi network

- 1. Tap the network that is connected to the phone.
- 2. Tap Forget to disconnect with the network.
- ① **Note** You can also disconnect to the Wi-Fi network by pressing and holding the network and tapping **Forget network**.

Connecting to a 3G network

Use 3G (or EDGE if available) to connect the phone to the Internet and exchange multimedia messages. You will need a data plan to access a 3G network.

3G settings are already preconfigured on the phone, and it is ready to use 3G services. Please do not change the settings: this may cause services to stop working.

① Note Using 3G loads Internet data faster in some cases, but may decrease battery performance. If you are making a lot of phone calls, you may want to turn 3G function off to extend battery performance.

Using Bluetooth

Bluetooth technology enables wireless connections between electronic devices. Using this technology, you can send images, text, and business cards.

With Bluetooth technology, the phone provides:

- Connection to hands-free devices.
- · Connection to electronic devices.

Pairing with devices

- 1. Tap Settings from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap Wireless & networks > Bluetooth settings.
- 3. Tap Bluetooth to activate the technology.
- 4. Tap Scan for devices.
- 5. Select and tap a device from the list.
- 6. Enter PIN to pair with the device.
- 7. Tap **OK**.



Scanning devices

Requesting pairing

Using the Easy Setting

- Tap on the top of the home screen and drag it down, or press in idle mode and tap Notifications.
- 2. Tap 🚯 in Easy Setting. The icon turns red when the function is on.

Bluetooth settings

- 1. Tap **Settings** from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap Wireless & networks > Bluetooth settings.
- 3. Tap Bluetooth to activate the technology.
- 4. Tap **Discoverable** if you want to let other people pair their devices with the phone. The status lasts for 120 seconds.

Sharing a picture using Bluetooth

- 1. Tap **Gallery** from the applications menu.
- 2. Select and tap a picture to share.
- 3. Tap Menu > Share > Bluetooth.
- Select and tap a device among those paired with the phone. The other party will receive a message to accept the requesting permission.

Renaming the device

- 1. Tap **Settings** from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap Wireless & networks > Bluetooth settings.
- 3. Tap **Bluetooth** to activate the technology.
- 4. Tap **Device name** and enter a new name.
- 5. Tap **OK**.

Making the phone a modem

The phone provides other devices with an Internet connection by becoming a Wi-Fi hotspot.

Activating the USB Tethering


- Connect the phone with an electronic device using the USB cable.
- 2. Tap **Settings** from the applications menu.
- 3. Tap Wireless & networks > Tethering & portable hotspot.
- 4. Tap **USB tethering** to activate the technology. The electronic device that is connected to the phone can now access the Internet.
- ① **Note** You cannot use a few applications that require Internet connection while using the tethering technology.

Becoming a portable Wi-Fi hotspot

- 1. Tap **Settings** from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap Wireless & networks > Tethering & portable hotspot.
- 3. Tap **Portable Wi-Fi hotspot**. The phone can offer the Internet connection to other devices around you.

Setting options for portable Wi-Fi hotspot

- 1. Tap **Settings** from the applications menu.
- Tap Wireless & networks > Tethering & portable hotspot > Portable Wi-Fi hotspot.
- 3. Tap Portable Wi-Fi hotspot settings > Configure Wi-Fi hotspot.
- 4. Enter a name for Network SSID. Tap **Hide SSID** if you want to hide the SSID.



① Note The default password is an 8-digit random number. When you tap Configure Wi-Fi hotspot > Show password, you can view the current password.





Storage

The microSD card offers useful functions including mass storage and media file transfer.

Managing the memory card

You should manage the microSD card carefully. If you do not follow the steps described below to manage the memory card, you can incur serious damage to the card.

Viewing available memory

- 1. Tap **Settings** from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap **Storage**. You can view and check the status of Total space and Available space for SD card and Internal storage.

Unmounting the SD Card

- 1. Tap Settings from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap Storage > Unmount SD card > OK.
- 3. Press and hold the LOCK/PWR key.
- 4. Tap Power off > OK.
- 5. Open the battery cover.
- 6. Remove the battery.
- 7. Remove the SD card.
- ① Note If you want to mount the SD card, tap Settings > Storage > Mount SD card.

Formatting the microSD card

- 1. Tap **Settings** from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap Storage > Unmount SD card > OK.
- 3. Tap Erase SD Card > Erase SD Card > Erase everything.

Connecting to a PC

Synchronize files and exchange data with a computer using the PC data cable. Keep in mind that you cannot transfer media files if you turn on the USB debugging mode (Settings > Applications > Development > USB debugging).

Selecting the USB mode

- 1. Tap **Settings** from the applications menu.
- Tap Storage > USB Mode. If you have turned on the USB debugging function, tap OK to turn it off.
- 3. Select and tap a USB mode.
 - Tap Media Transfer > OK if you want to transfer media files between the phone and your PC when they are connected.
 - Tap Mass storage > OK if you want to save mass files in the phone.
 - Tap Ask on connection > OK if you want to select the USB mode whenever the phone is connected.
- 4. Connect the USB cable to the phone.
- 5. Connect the other end of the cable to your computer.

Turning on/off the USB mode in the Easy Setting

- 1. Connect the phone to your computer using the USB cable.
- Tap on the top of the home screen and drag it down, or press
 ≡ in idle mode and tap Notifications.
- Tap USB connected > Turn on USB storage. Keep in mind that you can use this function only when you have selected the USB mass storage mode.

4. Tap **OK**.

① Note Tap Turn off USB storage in the notifications screen if you want to turn off the function, and tap Turn off USB storage.

Using the phone as Mass Storage

Copy files between your computer and the microSD card in the phone. In the mass storage mode, a few applications—Handy Memo, Voice Memo, Sketch Pad, Music Player, Camera, Camcorder, Document Viewer—that need the microSD card will not run.

Copying files

- 1. Tap **Settings** from the applications menu.
- Tap Storage > USB Mode. If you have turned on the USB debugging function, tap OK to turn it off.
- 3. Tap Mass Storage > Turn on USB storage > OK.
- 4. Select and copy files to transfer from the phone.
- 5. Paste files to your PC.
- 6. Tap **Turn off USB storage** if you finish copying files and then disconnect the phone from your computer.

Transferring files through Media Transfer

Transfer media files between your computer and the microSD card in the phone. Once you have turned on the MTP connection, media files are collected through Windows Media Player $^{\text{TM}}$.

Transferring files

- 1. Tap **Settings** from the applications menu.
- Tap Storage > USB Mode. If you have turned on the USB debugging function, tap OK to turn it off.
- 3. Tap Media Transfer > Turn on MTP connection > OK.
- 4. Select files to transfer from the phone or your PC.
- 5. Transfer files to your PC or the phone.
- 6. Tap **Turn off MTP connection** if you finish transferring files and then disconnect the phone from your computer.

Tools

The phone offers a variety of tools that help you live a convenient life.

Clock Tools

Clock Tools offers the current time in major cities and time zones around the world. World time is displayed first by default.

Viewing the world time

- 1. Tap **Clock Tools** from the applications menu.
- Tap Add new city and enter the name of a city. Type the first letter and you can find the city more easily.
- 3. Select and tap the city.

Rearranging the order of cities

- 1. Tap Clock Tools from the applications menu.
- 2. Press and tap Rearrange.
- 3. Select a city to relocate and drag up or down to rearrange the order.
- 4. Tap Done.

Deleting a city

- 1. Tap Clock Tools from the applications menu.
- 2. Press and tap Delete.
- 3. Select and tap the trash icon next to the city to delete.
- 4. Tap Done.
- Note You can delete a city by pressing and holding it and tapping Delete > Yes


Using the timer

- 1. Tap **Clock Tools** from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap Timer.
- 3. Press **■** and tap **Set** for setting the time.
- 4. Set the hour, minute and second and tap **Done**.
- 5. Tap **Start**.
- Note You can reset the time by tapping Reset while the timer is running.

Using the stopwatch

- 1. Tap Clock Tools from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap Stopwatch.
- 3. Tap **Lap** on the top of the screen and tap **Start**. This function is used when you want to measure time that takes to run for a certain distance.

- 4. Tap Lap > Split on the top of the screen and tap Start. This function is used when you want to measure the accumulated time.
- 5. Tap **Reset** to restart the stopwatch.




Clock

Clock helps set the alarm and see basic information on your region including time and weather. Desk clock is provided by default.

Adding a new alarm

- 1. Tap **Clock** from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap 🗑 and tap Add alarm.
- 3. Enter the hour and the minute and tap Set.
- 4. Adjust settings for alarm and tap **Done**. You will see a green bar under the set alarm.



Changing an alarm

- 1. Tap Clock from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap ♥.
- 3. Select and tap the alarm time to change.
- 4. Adjust settings and tap Done.

Deactivating an alarm

- 1. Tap Clock from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap 📆.
- 3. Tap of the alarm to deactivate. A green bar indicates that the alarm is on. The color disappears when the alarm is turned off.

Deleting an alarm

- 1. Tap Clock from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap ♡.
- 3. Press and hold the alarm to delete, and tap **Delete alarm**.
- 4. Tap **OK**.

Setting an alarm

- 1. Tap Clock from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap (?).
- 3. Press and tap Settings.
- 4. Tap Alarm in silent mode if you want to play the alarm even when the phone is in silent mode. The check box is selected by default.
- 5. Tap Alarm volume if you want to adjust the volume, set the volume and tap OK.
- 6. Tap **Snooze duration** if you want to adjust the snooze duration, select and tap the duration and tap OK.
- 7. Tap **Side button behavior** if you want to assign an action for the side buttons, select and tap the option and tap OK.

Adding Clock widget

You can create a different integrate clock with Weather, Clock, and Schedule functions.

- 1. Press and hold an empty space on the home screen.
- 2. Tap Widgets > Pantech Widgets > Integrated Clock.
- 3. Select and tap a style.
- 4. Tap World Time, Weather, or Calendar section on the Integrated Clock widget to view the details.



Calculator

Perform basic mathematical calculations with the calculator in the phone.

Doing calculations

- 1. Tap Calculator from the applications menu.
- 2. Enter a number and tap a mathematical sign you want to use.
- 3. Tap C to delete a number and hold C to delete the whole number



Saving a calculation

- 1. Tap Calculator from the applications menu.
- 2. Press during a calculation.
- 3. Tap **Save** and enter the file name. The date of the day appears on the screen by default.
- 4. Tap Done.

Editing a saved calculation

- 1. Tap Calculator from the applications menu.
- 2. Press and tap List.
- 3. Select and tap a calculation to edit.
- 4. Tap the result and edit it.
- 5. Press and tap Save.

Deleting a calculation

- 1. Tap Calculator from the applications menu.
- 2. Press and tap List.
- 3. Press and hold the calculation to delete, and tap Delete.
- 4. Tap Yes.

Converter

Converter helps convert values for length, volume, weight, temperature, area and speed.

Converting values

- 1. Tap Converter from the applications menu.
- 2. Select a unit type. Length is selected by default. Change the unit type by tapping **▼** or **▶**.

- 3. Tap on the box below the unit type and enter a value.
- 4. Select the original unit by dragging the wheel in the middle of the screen.
- 5. Select a target unit. The changed value promptly appears below.



Resetting a conversion

- 1. Tap Converter from the applications menu.
- 2. Press during a conversion and tap Reset.

Sketch Pad

Sketch a drawing and share it with your friends. The screen is set to portrait mode only.

Creating a drawing

- 1. Tap Sketch Pad from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap **Create new** if there are saved drawings. The sketch board appears first if there are no saved drawings.
- 3. Sketch a drawing.

Tools

- 4. Select the size and color of the brush and the size of the eraser.
- 5. Press and tap **Background** if you want to select as background of the drawing.
- Press and tap Import image if you want to select a photo as background of the drawing.
- 7. Tap **Save** and enter the name of the drawing to save.
- 8. Tap Save.

- 1. Tap Sketch Pad from the applications menu.
- 2. Press and hold the drawing to delete, and tap Delete.
- 3. Tap **Yes**.

- 2. Press and hold the drawing to edit, and tap Edit.
- 3. Edit the drawing and tap **Save**.

Saving to the Gallery

- 1. Tap **Sketch Pad** from the applications menu.

- 1. Tap **Sketch Pad** from the applications menu.
- 2. Press and hold the drawing to share, and tap Share.

Changing the view mode

- 1. Tap Sketch Pad from the applications menu.
- 2. Press and tap List view. You can see the file name and file format of the drawings.
- Press and tap Thumbnail view if you want to see drawings only.

Voice Dialer

Perform functions by speaking on the phone.

Searching for a contact

- 1. Tap **Voice Dialer** from the applications menu.
- 2. Say a contact's name.
- 3. Tap on the message or \mathbf{OK} .

Voice Search

Search the Internet by speaking on the phone.

- 1. Tap Voice Search or press and hold Q.
- 2. Say a keyword on the mic.



Voice search

Search results

Compass

Compass helps you find your location using the speed and the distance of your moving. Turn on the GPS function to use.

Setting the way point

- 1. Tap **Compass** from the applications menu.
- 2. Press and tap Search Way Point.
- 3. Type the way point name in the box and select an address and tap **Done**. You can see the distance and the direction from the current location.
- ① Note When there is interference on the compass, keep it away from the interfering items or wave the phone in a figure 8 motion.
 You can also set a way point by pressing and holding the I'mark in the list and tapping Set as way point.

Moving toward the way point

- Tap Start after you set the way point and start moving. The moving track begins to be recorded.
- Tap Pause if you stop recording temporarily. Tap Resume if you want to resume recording.
- 3. Tap Stop if you want to end recording.
- 4. Tap **Yes** if you want to export data. The data is saved in the external memory card.
- Note You might experience difficulties using the compass if you are indoors or near metal materials.



Reviewing the moving track

- 1. Tap **Compass** from the applications menu.
- Press and tap Map View. indicates your current location on the map.
- 3. Tap **Start**. The marker **()** on the map starts moving.
- 4. Tap (a) and move it up if you want to zoom in the map. Move it down if you want to zoom out the map.

Searching the way point

- 1. Tap Compass from the applications menu.
- 2. Press and tap Search way point.
- Tap on the search box and type the keyword using the virtual keyboard.
- 4. Select an address and tap Done.

Creating I'mark

- 1. Tap Compass from the applications menu.
- 2. Press and tap Add to I'mark.
- 3. Enter the name, latitude, longitude, proximate range and comment and tap **Save**.

Deleting I'mark

- 1. Tap Compass from the applications menu.
- 2. Press and tap I'mark list.
- 3. Press and tap Delete.
- 4. Select and tap the I'mark to delete.
- 5. Tap Done.
- ① Note You can delete a I'mark by pressing and holding the I'mark in the list and tapping **Delete**.

Adding a photo for I'mark

- 1. Tap Compass from the applications menu.
- 2. Press and tap Add photo.
- 3. Tap **Take a photo** if you want to take a picture.
- 4. Tap **Picture** if you want to add a photo from your gallery.

Navigation

Searching for the destination by voice

- 1. Tap **Navigation** from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap **Speak Destination** and speak your destination toward the phone.
- 3. Select and tap a destination in the list when there are many possible destinations.



① Note You can also search the destination by typing it or selecting in the contacts.

Finding directions using Google Maps

- 1. Tap **Maps** from the application menu.
- 2. Press and tap Directions.
- 3. Enter the name of the end point.
- 4. Tap ♠, ♠or ↑ and tap Go.
- 5. Select and tap a place in the results.



Setting the end point manually

- 1. Tap Maps from the application menu.
- 2. Press and tap Directions.
- 3. Tap Point on map if you want to set the end point.
- 4. Tap a point on the map.
- 5. Tap Tap to select this point.
- 6. Tap 🚗 , 🖨 or 🤾 and tap Go.
- ① Note You can also set your location following the same process.

Checking the traffic conditions

- Press and tap Route Info while Navigation is running.
- Flick the screen along the suggested route to the destination. Depending on the traffic conditions, the road appears in green (good), yellow (congested) or red (jammed).
- 3. Tap and tap the route if you want to set an alternative route.



Weather

Adding a new city

- 1. Tap **Weather** from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap Add new city.
- Enter the name of the city you want, or flick the screen upwards and tap one. Weather information of the city appears on the list.



Viewing weather information

Deleting a city

- 1. Tap Weather from the applications menu.
- 2. Press and tap Delete.
- 3. Select and tap the trash icon next to the city to delete.
- 4. Tap Done.

Updating weather information

- 1. Tap Weather from the applications menu.
- 2. Press
- 3. Tap Update all.

Stocks

Check the current stock market conditions and establish your investment strategy with the phone. Stocks is in synch with Google Finance by default.

Checking the current stock market conditions

- Tap Stocks from the applications menu. You can see the overall stock market conditions for the moment.
- 2. Select and tap an index in the list. The fluctuation of the index for one day is displayed by default.
- 3. Tap **Prev** or **Next** above the graph in the middle of the screen if you want to adjust the period of the fluctuation.
- ① **Note** You can also change the period by tapping the graph and select and tap one from one day to the maximum when data is available.

Detailed information

Renaming the stock market index

- 1. Tap **Stocks** from the applications menu.
- 2. Press and hold an index to rename and tap Rename.
- 3. Enter a new name of the index and tap **OK**.
- ① Note You can also rename an index by pressing = and tapping Edit, selecting and tapping an index to rename.

Deleting the stock market index

- 1. Tap **Stocks** from the applications menu.
- 2. Press and hold an index to delete and tap **Delete**.



• Note You can also delete an index by pressing and tapping Edit, selecting and tapping next to an index to delete. The trash bin appears in front of the index. Then, tap the trash bin.

Adding the stock market index

- Tap Stocks from the applications menu.
- 2. Press and tap Edit.
- 3. Tap on the box in the bottom of the screen, enter the name of the index and tap (a).



Sharing the stock market information

- 1. Tap Stocks from the applications menu.
- 2. Select and tap an index to see the relevant information.
- 3. Press and tap Share.
- 4. Tap Bluetooth, Facebook, Gmail, Messaging or Twitter.

Adjusting the alert

- Tap Stocks from the applications menu.
- 2. Select and tap an index to receive the alert.
- 3. Press and tap Alert.
- 4. Enter the value for Above and tap ; enter the value for Below and tap ...

Setting the alert

- 1. Tap Stocks from the applications menu.
- 2. Press and tap Settings.
- 3. Tap **Ringtone**, and select and tap a ringtone for the alert and tap **OK**.
- 4. Tap Check interval, and select and tap the refresh period.
- 5. Tap **Check time**, adjust the time for checking stock market indexes and tap **OK**.

Writing notes

- 1. Tap Stocks from the applications menu.
- 2. Select and tap an index to write notes.
- 3. Press and tap Notes.
- 4. Tap on the screen and enter a message.
- 5. Press **1** if you want to check the notes. Press **1** again and you can see the note on the bottom of the screen.

Viewing related news articles

- 1. Tap **Stocks** from the applications menu.
- 2. Select and tap an index to see the relevant news.
- 3. Flick the screen downwards, and select and tap an article to see.

Adjusting the appearance

- 1. Tap Stocks from the applications menu.
- 2. Press and tap Settings.
- 3. Tap **Sort**, and select and tap the sorting order for the stock market indexes.
- 4. Tap **Default Chart**, and select and tap the refresh period. The comparing period of the graph for each index changes accordingly.

Adding the Stocks widget

- 1. Press and hold the empty space of the screen.
- 2. Tap Widgets.
- 3. Tap Android Widgets > Stocks.
- 4. Select and tap a market in the portfolio list and tap **Save**.
 You can see the stock market indexes on the home screen.

RSS Reader

RSS Reader helps check updated news from various sources.

Creating channels

- 1. Tap RSS Reader from the applications menu.
- Tap All channels > Add Channel. If you have already subscribed to channels, Tap RSS Reader > All channels, and press = and tap Add channel.
- 3. Tap URL, Google Reader or Recommendation.
 - Tap URL and enter the title and URL of the channel, tap Category, select the relevant category and tap Done.
 If there is no category you want, tap Create New and create a category.
 - Tap Google Reader, select and tap a channel, and tap Add.
- ① Note Make sure to register your Google account first by tapping RSS Reader, pressing = and tapping Settings > Username.
 - Tap Recommendation, select and tap a category you want to add, and select and tap a channel and tap Add.

Viewing new feeds

- 1. Tap RSS Reader.
- 2. Tap New feeds.
- 3. Press and tap Update.
- 4. Select and tap updated new feeds to read.

Managing favorites

- 1. Tap RSS Reader.
- 2. Tap Favorites.
- 3. Tap the star icon next to a favorite if you want to lease the favorite.

Managing categories

- 1. Tap **RSS Reader** from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap Categories.
- 3. Press and tap Edit category.
- 4. Select and tap a category, enter a new name and tap **Save**.
- 5. Tap **Create New** if you want to make a new category, enter the name of the category and tap **Save**.

Setting options

- 1. Tap RSS Reader.
- 2. Press and tap Settings.
- 3. Tap **Automatic Update**, select the interval of updating feeds and tap **OK**.

Settings

This chapter explains how to change the settings of the phone. Access the settings from Applications or simply do it from the home screen by pressing **=** and tapping **Settings**.

Personalize

Setting and managing home screen themes

- 1. Tap Settings > Personalize > Themes.
- 2. Select a predefined theme or a user saved theme that you want to apply to the home screen.
- 3. Tap **Done**. The selected theme will be applied to the home screen.

Setting home wallpaper

- 1. Tap Settings > Personalize > Home Wallpaper.
- 2. Tap Gallery, Live wallpapers or Wallpapers.
- Select an image you want to use as wallpaper and tap Set wallpaper.
- ① Note Please remember that Maps consumes the battery relatively quickly. Even if you select wallpaper other than Maps, it is recommended that you save the battery consumption by tapping Force stop (Tap Settings > Applications > Manage applications > Maps).

Wireless & networks

Setting Airplane mode

Tap Settings > Wireless & networks > Airplane mode.
 If you turn on Airplane mode, Wi-Fi, Bluetooth and GPS functions are turned off at once. However, you can turn on each function for your preference.

2. Tap Airplane mode again to reactivate other functions.

Turning Wi-Fi on/off

- 1. Tap Settings > Wireless & networks.
- 2. Tap Wi-Fi if you want to turn on or off.

Setting Wi-Fi networks

- 1. Tap Settings > Wireless & networks.
- 2. Tap **Wi-Fi settings** to manage the wireless network. Refer to page 70 for more information.

Turning Bluetooth on/off

- 1. Tap Settings > Wireless & networks.
- 2. Tap Bluetooth if you want to turn on or off.

Setting Bluetooth

- 1. Tap Settings > Wireless & networks.
- 2. Tap **Bluetooth settings** to manage the wireless technology option. Refer to page 72 for more information.

Setting Tethering and portable hotspots

- Tap Settings > Wireless & networks > Tethering & portable hotspot.
- Tap USB tethering to provide Internet connection to other devices. You should connect the phone with your other device through the USB cable.
- 3. Tap **Portable Wi-Fi hotspot** to make the phone a portable Wi-Fi hotspot. Refer to page "Becoming a portable Wi-Fi hotspot" on page 72 for more information.

Setting VPN settings

- Tap Settings > Wireless & networks > VPN settings > Add VPN.
- Tap Add PPTP VPN, Add L2TP VPN, Add L2TP/IPSec PSK VPN or Add L2TP/IPSec CRT VPN.
- 3. Set up the network by entering necessary information.

Setting mobile networks

- 1. Tap Settings > Wireless & networks > Mobile networks.
- Tap Data Services to allow access to data over mobile network.
- 3. Tap International Data roaming to connect to data services when roaming and tap OK.
- ① Note You may incur significant roaming charges.
- Tap Access Point Names> Phone APN, Broadband APN, or Wap APN. Press = and tap New APN if you want to add an APN in the Phone APN or Wap APN mode.
- 5. Tap **Network operators > Default Setup > Automatic** or **Manual** if you want to search networks and select one.

Call settings

Managing fixed dialing numbers

- 1. Tap Settings > Call settings > Fixed Dialing Numbers.
- 2. Tap FDN activation, Change PIN2 or FDN list.
- 3. Enter the necessary information.

Setting your voicemail

Tap Settings > Call settings > Voicemail settings > Voicemail number.

- 2. Enter the voicemail number or tap █ and select a contact to designate as the voicemail number and tap OK.
- 3. Tap **OK**.

Setting Auto Redial

Tap Settings > Call settings > Auto Redial.

Setting TTY mode

- 1. Tap Settings > Call settings > TTY mode.
- 2. Tap TTY Off, TTY Full, TTY HCO or TTY VCO.
- 3. Tap **OK**.

Setting DTMF Tones

- 1. Tap Settings > Call settings > DTMF Tones.
- 2. Tap Normal or Long.
- 3. Tap **OK**.

Setting Caller ID

- 1. Tap Settings > Call settings > Caller ID.
- 2. Tap Network default, Hide number or Show number.
- 3. Tap **OK**.

Setting Call forwarding

- 1. Tap Settings > Call settings > Call forwarding.
- 2. Tap Always forward, Forward when busy, Forward when unanswered or Forward when unreachable.

Setting Call waiting

Tap Settings > Call settings > Call waiting > Call waiting.

Turning suppression on/off

- 1. Tap Settings > Call settings.
- Tap Noise Suppression if you want to turn suppression on or off.

Sound

Setting silent mode

- Tap Settings > Sound > Silent mode. All other functions except the media volume and alarms are silenced if you select this option.
- 2. Tap Silent mode again to activate all functions.

Setting to vibrate

- 1. Tap Settings > Sound > Vibrate.
- 2. Tap Always, Never, Only in Silent mode or Only when not in Silent mode.
- 3. Tap **OK**.

Setting volume

- Tap Settings > Sound > Volume.
 Make sure to deselect Silent mode.
- Adjust the volume for ringtone, media and alarm. Tap Use incoming call volume for notifications if you want to use this function. Otherwise, deselect it and adjust the volume for notifications.
- 3. Tap **OK**.

Setting phone ringtone

- 1. Tap Settings > Sound > Phone ringtone.
- 2. Select and tap a ringtone in the list.
- 3. Tap **OK**.

Setting notification ringtone

- 1. Tap Settings > Sound > Notification ringtone.
- 2. Select and tap a ringtone for notifications.
- 3. Tap **OK**.

Setting feedback options

- 1. Tap Settings > Sound.
- 2. Tap **Audible touch tones** if you want to play tones when using the dial pad. It is selected by default.
- 3. Tap **Audible selection** if you want to play sound when making selection on the screen.
- 4. Tap **Screen lock sounds** if you want to play sound when locking and unlocking the screen.
- 5. Tap **Haptic feedback** if you want the phone to vibrate when you press soft keys. It is selected by default.

Setting Sound effect

- 1. Tap Settings > Sound > NASH Sound Effect.
- 2. Select and tap an effect from 3D sounds and equalizers. You can choose the user set.
- 3. Tap Done.

Display

Setting brightness

- 1. Tap Settings > Display > Brightness.
- 2. Drag to the right to increase the brightness. Drag it to the left to decrease the brightness.
- 3. Tap **OK**.

Setting auto-rotate screen

Tap **Settings > Display > Auto-rotate screen** if you want to make the screen rotate automatically when you move the phone horizontally or vertically.

Setting animation options

- 1. Tap Settings > Display > Animation.
- 2. Tap No animations, Some animations or All animations.
- 3. Tap **OK**.

Setting screen timeout

- 1. Tap Settings > Display > Screen timeout.
- 2. Select and tap the time interval to turn off the screen.
- 3. Tap **OK**.

Location & security

Setting my location

- 1. Tap Settings > Location & security > Use wireless networks.
- 2. Tap **Agree** to allow Google's location service to collect anonymous location data.
- 3. Tap **Use GPS satellites** if you want to find street-level locations.

Setting screen lock with a pattern key

- Tap Settings > Location & security > Set up screen lock > Pattern.
- 2. Read "Securing your phone" page and tap Next.
- 3. Watch how to set up the pattern and tap Next.
- Drag your pattern on the screen and tap Continue. Make sure to connect the pattern with at least four dots. Tap Retry and draw another pattern if you want to set up one.
- 5. Tap Continue.
- 6. Drag the pattern again and tap **Confirm**.



- Tap Settings > Location & security > Set up screen lock > PIN.
- 2. Enter numbers as PIN and tap **Continue**. The PIN should be at least 4 characters.

Forgot your password for Google account?

If you have forgotten your password for Google account, reset it at the Google website.

- 2. Enter the email address or username that you use to sign in to your Google account and click **Submit**.
- 3. Enter the characters that you see on the screen and click **Continue**.
- Select an option about recovering your account and click Continue.
- 5. Take necessary steps for each option:

- Check your email account you provided when you created your Google Account and follow the instructions if you have selected Email to ••••••@*****.
- Fill in the form for Google Accounts Help if you have selected I no longer have access to these, and click Submit on the bottom of the window.

- 2. Enter your password and tap **Continue**. The password should be at least 4 characters.
- 3. Enter the password again to confirm.
- 4. Tap **OK**.



- 2. Tap **Visible passwords** if you want to see passwords while typing it.

Selecting device administrators

- 1. Tap Settings > Location & security.
- Tap Select device administrators if you want to add or remove device administrators.

Setting to use secure credentials

Tap **Use secure credentials** if you allow application to access secure certificates and other credentials.

Installing certificates from SD card

Tap Install from SD card if you want to install encrypted certificates from SD card.

Setting the credential storage password

- 1. Tap Settings > Location & security > Set password.
- 2. Enter a new password and enter it again to confirm.
- 3. Tap **OK**.

Clearing the storage

Tap **Clear storage** if you want to clear credential storage of all contents and reset its password.

Applications

Allowing installation of unknown applications

- 1. Tap Settings > Applications.
- 2. Tap **Unknown sources** to allow non-market applications to be installed on the phone.

Managing applications

- Tap Settings > Applications > Manage applications > Downloaded.
- Tap an application and tap Force stop if you want to stop its operation by force. Tap Uninstall if you want to uninstall the application.
- 3. Tap **Running** on the top of the screen and tap an application to manage its operation.

Viewing running services and applications

- 1. Tap Settings > Applications > Running services.
- 2. Tap a service or an application to stop its operation or to edit its options.
- 3. Tap **Stop** if you want to stop its operation.

Viewing storage used by applications

1. Tap **Storage use** to view storage used by applications

Viewing items used the battery

1. Tap **Battery use** to view what has been using the battery.

Debugging USB

- 1. Tap Settings > Applications > Development.
- 2. Tap **USB debugging** to allow the debug mode when the USB cable is connected.
- 3. Read and tap **OK** on the USB debugging information page.

Maintaining the staying condition

- 1. Tap Settings > Applications > Development.
- Tap Stay awake to keep the phone awake while it is being charged.

Allowing mock locations

- 1. Tap Settings > Applications > Development.
- 2. Tap **Allow mock locations** to pretend to be in another location for development purposes.

Accounts & sync

Managing background data

- 1. Tap Settings > Accounts & sync.
- 2. Tap **Background data** if you want to sync, send and receive data any time.

Allowing background data to sync automatically

- 1. Tap Settings > Accounts & sync.
- 2. Tap Auto-sync if you want to sync data automatically.

Adding an account

- 1. Tap Settings > Accounts & sync.
- 2. Tap Add account.
- 3. Select and tap an account type, and follow the necessary steps for creating an account.

Privacy

Backing up data

- 1. Tap **Settings > Privacy**.
- 2. Tap **Back up my data** if you want to back up your data.
- 3. Tap **Automatic restore** if you want to restore backed-up data for an application.

Resetting the phone

- 1. Tap Settings > Privacy.
- Tap Factory data reset if you want to erase all data from the phone. Tap Erase SD card if you want to erase all data on the phone's SD card such as music or photos.
- 3. Tap Reset phone.
- 4. Tap Erase everything.

Storage

Selecting the USB mode

- 1. Tap Settings > Storage.
- 2. Tap **USB Mode**. If you turn on the USB debugging function, tap **OK** to turn it off.
- 3. Tap Media Transfer, Mass storage or Ask on connection, tap OK, and follow the relevant steps.

Viewing the status of space

 Tap Settings > Storage. The status of the total and available spaces on the SD card and the available space on the internal storage will appears.

Mounting/Unmounting a SD card

 Tap Unmount SD card > OK if you want to remove the SD card from the phone safely. Tap Mount SD card if you want to mount the card.

Erasing a SD card

 Tap Erase SD card if you want to erase all data on the phone's SD card.

Language & keyboard

Selecting the language

- 1. Tap Settings > Language & keyboard > Select language.
- 2. Select and tap a language to use for the phone.

Setting Swype

- 1. Tap Settings > Language & keyboard > Swype.
- 2. Tap **Word prediction** if you want to see predicted words as you type in the Swype.
- Tap Word choice window and drag the bar to the left or the right if you want to adjust the frequency of the word choice window, and tap OK.
- 4. Tap **Speed vs. accuracy**, drag the bar to the left or the right if you want to adjust the response speed and tap **OK**.

Setting the Android keyboard

- 1. Tap Settings > Language & keyboard > Android keyboard.
- 2. Tap **Vibrate on keypress** if you want the phone to vibrate when you press soft keys.
- 3. Tap **Voice input** if you want to change the method for voice input. Tap **On main keyboard**, **On symbols keyboard** or **Off** and tap **OK**.
- 4. Tap Input languages, select and tap the language for the keyboard and press \mathbf{h} .

Setting the Android keyboard word suggestion

- 1. Tap Settings > Language & keyboard > Android keyboard.
- Tap Show settings key if you want to change the status of the settings key while typing. Tap Automatic, Always show, or Always hide and tap OK.
- 3. Tap **Quick fixes** if you want to correct commonly typed mistakes. The check box is selected by default.
- 4. Tap **Show suggestions** if you want to see suggestions while you type. The check box is selected by default.

Managing the user dictionary

- 1. Tap Settings > Language & keyboard > User dictionary.
- 2. Press and tap Add.
- 3. Enter the name of the dictionary in the box and tap **OK**.

Voice input & output

Text-to-speech helps listen to a text file by transforming it to a speech file.

Setting input options

- Tap Settings > Voice input & output > Voice recognizer settings.
- 2. Tap **Language**, select and tap a language that will be used for the input language.

FCC Hearing-Aid Compatibility Regulations for Wireless Devices

On July 10, 2003, the U.S. Federal Communications Commission (FCC) Report and Order in WT Docket 01-309 modified the exception of wireless phones under the Hearing Aid Compatibility Act of 1988 (HAC Act) to require digital wireless phones be compatible with hearing-aids. The intent of the HAC Act is to ensure reasonable access to telecommunications services for persons with hearing disabilities.

While some wireless phones are used near some hearing devices (hearing aids and cochlear implants), users may detect a buzzing, humming, or whining noise. Some hearing devices are more immune than others to this interference noise, and phones also vary in the amount of interference they generate.

The wireless telephone industry has developed a rating system for wireless phones, to assist hearing device users find phones that may be compatible with their hearing devices. Not all phones have been rated. Phones that are rated have the rating on their boxes or a label located on the boxes.

The ratings are not guarantees. Results will vary depending on the user's hearing device and hearing loss. If your hearing device happens to be vulnerable to interference, you may not be able to use a rated phone successfully. Trying out the phone with your hearing device is the best way to evaluate it for your personal needs.

- M-Ratings: Phones rated M3 or M4 meet FCC requirements and are likely to generate less interference to hearing devices than phones that are not labeled. M4 is the better/ higher of the two ratings.
- T-Ratings: Phones rated T3 or T4 meet FCC requirements and are likely to generate less interference to hearing devices than phones that are not labeled. T4 is the better/ higher of the two ratings.

Hearing devices may also be rated. Your hearing device manufacturer or hearing health professional may help you find this rating. Higher ratings mean that the hearing device is relatively immune to interference noise. The hearing aid and wireless phone rating values are then added together. A sum of 5 is considered acceptable for normal use. A sum of 6 is considered for best use.



In the above example, if a hearing aid meets the M2 level rating and the wireless phone meets the M3 level rating, the sum of the two values equals M5. This is synonymous for T ratings. This should provide the hearing aid user with "normal usage" while using their hearing aid with the particular wireless phone. "Normal usage" in this context is defined as a signal quality that is acceptable for normal operation.

The M mark is intended to be synonymous with the U mark. The T mark is intended to be synonymous with the UT mark. The M and T marks are recommended by the Alliance for Telecommunications Industries Solutions (ATIS). The U and UT marks are referenced in Section 20.19 of the FCC Rules. The HAC rating and measurement procedure are described in the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) C63.19 standard.

To ensure that the Hearing Aid Compatibility rating for your phone is maintained, secondary transmitters such as Bluetooth and WLAN components must be disabled during a call. See page 71 for instructions to disable these components.

This phone has been tested and rated for use with hearing aids for some of the wireless technologies that it uses.
