To Whom it may concern:

Certification of this device in accordance with the shortened application route specified in 2.933 has been discussed with the FCC. The FCC has agreed that this is an appropriate route. See the copied portion of the email concerning filings IAW 2.933 by a TCB.

On May 30, 2002 in response to a question about certifications IAW 2.933 George Tannahill wrote:

Dennis,

Yes, TCB's can file under 2.933 of the rules. When the FCC reviews 2.933 filings it looks to see how old the application is. If it is more than a year or so old, all exhibit are requested. Also, for devices that may or may not require RF exposure evaluation, we check to see if the RF Exposure policies, rules or procedures have changed since the time of the original filing. We also look at the original to see how close to the limits the emissions were and how confident we are that a good test was done. The FCC also looks to see that the wording on the new grant is identical to the original. For a bluetooth application an audit is almost guaranteed and with the complex set of regulations for these types of devices, there are many issues that could cause the application to be set aside during an audit so be very careful since saving some time at the beginning of the process could cause significant issues when the FCC reviews it.
