I have a few comments on this Application.

1. Please note that the FCC ID label sheet states that it is proprietary information and not to be disclosed. Please note that this is not possible. FCC ID label information is not confidential and will be public information when granted. Please remove the proprietary statement on the label exhibit. (you can drop all but page 3 of the exhibit).
2. Please note that the antenna specs do not agree with the operational description. The operational description states the removable antenna has a gain of -1dBi while the antenna specs state a gain of -2dBi. Are they the same antenna? Please explain.
3. Please provide the schematics for the rf modem transmitter. These items are generally confidential and may not be available in the original filing for the modem.
4. Please note that the antenna appears to be able to be removed from the "antenna pouch" and used outside the pouch. What measures have been taken to avoid this situation and what tests have been performed to show compliance with the antenna outside the pouch? Please explain.
