
INSTALLATION AND OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS FOR CEILING FAN REMOTE CONTROLLER

NOTE: Before installing the unit, change the factory code switch setting to your own preferred setting. Be sure the code switch positions on the transmitter and receiver match each other or the unit will not function. If this unit cause interference with other appliances, you may need to select different combinations.

1. SETTING THE CODE

This unit has 16 different code combinations. To set the code, perform these steps:

- A. Setting the code on the transmitter.
 - a. Remove battery cover. Press firmly below arrow and slide battery cover off.
 - b. Slide code s witches to your choice of up or down position.(Factory setting is all up). Do not use this position. Use a small screwdriver or ball point pen to slide firmly up or down (Figure 1).
 - c. Replace battery cover on transmitter.
- B. Setting the code on the receiver.
 - a. Slide code switches to the same positions as set on your transmitter (Figure 2).



2. INSTALLING RECEIVER IN CEILING FAN

A. Safety precautions:

WARNING: HIGH VOLTAGE! Household electrical power can cause serious injury or death. Disconnect source of electrical power to the ceiling fan by removing fuse or switching off circuit breaker.

Make sure all electrical connections comply with local codes or ordinances and National electrical Code. If you are unfamiliar with electrical wiring, please use a qualified and licensed electrician. Do not use with solid state ceiling fans.

Electrical source and fan must be 115/120 volts, 60Hz. Maximum fan motor amps: 1.25 and Maximum light watts: 300 Incandescent only.

CAUTION: To reduce the risk of fire or injury, do not use this product in conjunction with any variable (rheostat) wall control.



B. Installing receiver in fan:

- a. Remove ceiling fan canopy from the mounting bracket
- b. Disconnect existing wiring between ceiling fan and supply at electrical junction box.
- c. Lay the black antenna wire on top of receiver, and put the receiver in the mounting bracket. (Figure 4).
- Make wiring connections as follows using the wire nuts supplied: (Figure 3).

CONNECT

Green fan wire......Bare supply wire Black receiver wire (AC IN L)......Black supply wire White receiver wire (AC IN N)......White supply wire White receiver wire(TO MOTOR N).White fan wire Black receiver wire(TO MOTOR L).Black fan wire Blue receiver wire (FOR LIGHT).....Blue light wire If other fan or supply wires are different color, have this unit installed by a qualified electrician.





- e. Push all connected wires up into junction box.
- f. Reinstall the canopy on the mounting bracket.
- g. Restore electrical power.
- C. Manually set fan speed control to HIGHT via pull chain and set light to ON via pull chain. IMPORTANT: Fan speed and light control will be activated by remote if pull chain for fan and light are not set to HIGHT and ON positions.
- 3. OPERATING TRANSMITTER:
 - A. Install the batteries(Fig.5).To prevent damage to transmitter, remove the battery if not used for long periods.
 - B. Store the transmitter away from excess heat or humidity.
 - C. This remote control unit is equipped with 16 code combinations to prevent possible interference from or to other remote units such as garage door openers, car alarm or security system. If you find that your fan and light kit go on and off without using your remote control, simply change the combination code in your transmitter and receiver.
 - D. Operation buttons on the panel of the transmitter(Fig.6)
 - HI key for fan light speed.
 - MED key for fan medium speed.
 - LOW key for fan low speed.
 - OFF key for fan speed off.



The light function is controlled by pressing the $\sqrt[5]{2}$ key. Hold key down to increase or decrease light. Tap key quickly to turn light off or on. If you press the button in excess of 0.7 second it becomes a dimmer. The light varies cyclically in 0.8 second. The light key has auto resume, so will stay at the same brightness as the last time it was turned off.

YOUR REMOTE NOW HAS FULL CONTROL OF THE FAN AND LIGHT.





- e. Fan manual speed control in highest position?
- f. Code set at exact same position in both transmitter and receiver?
- 2. Won't operate at distance: If transmitter operates fan and light kit when up close, but not at 40 feet away, try placing the black antenna wire higher and make sure the black antenna wire is visible.

UNIVERSAL REMOTE CONTROL PROGRAMMING INSTRUCTIONS

Now you can be the master of your electronic devices with one simple to use remote control, just follow the easy programming instructions below and you will have the ultimate control of your home entertainment equipment right at your fingertips.

Step1.Install the batteries.


Step2.Program the remote control.

- a. Press the "Code Search" key, hold it till the red light is on and then release the "Code Search" key.
- b. Press the device key "TV" or "VCR" or others at once.
- c. Input 3 digi brand code.
- Step3. Test your remote control, Press the "power" key, the device will be turned on when the code is correct. If the device was not turned on, repeat step 2 until you find the right code.

If you can not find your entertainment equipment code on the Brand code list or after having tried all the brand codes on the list, and you still can not turn on your device.

You can also use auto search mode, Procedures are as follows:

- Press the "Code Search" key, hold it till the red light is on and then release the "Code Search" key.
- 2. Press the device key "TV" or "VCR" or others at once which you want to setup.
- 3. Then press the "Code Search" key at once, red light start to blinking, now you are in the "Auto Search" mode.
- 4. When TV can be turned on or off, press "Code Search" key within 1~2 seconds.
- 5. Now you can operate your TV.
