Prediction of MPE limit at a given distance

Equation from page 18 of OET Bulletin 65, Edition 97-01

$S = PG/4\pi R2$

Where,

S = power density (mW/cm2)

P = output power at the antenna terminal (mW)

G = gain of transmit antenna (numeric)

R = distance from transmitting antenna (cm)

Maximum peak output power at antenna input terminal = 21.74 (dBm) *

Maximum peak output power at antenna input terminal = 149.2 (mW)

Antenna gain (typical) = 1.0 (dBi)

Maximum antenna gain = 1.26 (numeric)

Prediction distance = 20 (cm)

Prediction frequency = <u>1618.75 (MHz)</u>

MPE limit for uncontrolled exposure at prediction frequency = $1.0 \text{ (mW/cm}^2)$ Power density at prediction frequency = $0.03740 \text{ (mW/cm}^2)$

To solve for the minimum mounting distance required;

$R = \sqrt{(PG/4\pi S)}$

 $R = \sqrt{(149.2 \times 1.26 / 4\pi \times 0.03740)} = 20 \text{ cm}$ (Based on continuous transmission)
