## 8 RF measurement testing


## 8.1 Description of test setup

For the spurious measurements we use the substitution method according TIA/EIA 603.

#### 8.1.1 Radiated measurements

The radiated emissions from the EUT are performed in a semi anechoic chamber. The EUT is placed on a conductive turntable and powered with nominal voltage. The signalling is performed either from outside the chamber with a signalling unit (AP or other) by air link using a signalling antenna or directly by special test software from the customer.

### 8.2 Results GSM 850

All GSM-band measurements are done in GSM mode only (circuit switched).

All relevant tests have been repeated using 8-PSK modulation if EDGE mode is supported. All tests were performed with one timeslot in uplink activated and one timeslot in downlink activated. For each mode the highest output power was determined and used.

## 8.2.1 RF output power

#### **Description:**

This paragraph contains average power, peak output power and ERP measurements for the mobile station. In all cases, the peak output power is within the required mask (this mask is specified in the JTC standards, TIA PN3389 Vol. 1 Chap 7, and is no FCC requirement).

### 8.2.2 Spurious emissions radiated

#### **Description:**

The following steps outline the procedure used to measure the radiated emissions from the mobile station. The site is constructed in accordance with ANSI C63.4:2009 requirements and is recognized by the FCC to be in compliance for a 3 and a 10 meter site. The spectrum was scanned from 30 MHz to the 10th harmonic of the highest frequency generated within the equipment, which is the transmitted carrier that can be as high as 848.8 MHz. This was rounded up to 12 GHz. The resolution bandwidth is set as outlined in Part 22.917. The spectrum was scanned with the mobile station transmitting at carrier frequencies that pertain to low, mid and high channels of the GSM-850 band.

The final open field emission (here 10m semi-anechoic chamber listed by FCC) test procedure is as follows:

- a) The test item was placed on a 0.8 meter high non-conductive stand at a 3 meter test distance from the receive antenna.
- b) The antenna output was terminated in a 50 ohm load (if possible).
- c) A double ridged wave guide antenna was placed on an adjustable height antenna mast 3 meters from the test item for emission measurements.
- d) Detected emissions were maximized at each frequency by rotating the test item and adjusting the receive antenna height and polarization. The maximum meter reading was recorded. The radiated emission measurements of the harmonics of the transmit frequency through the 10th harmonic were measured with peak detector and 1 MHz bandwidth. If the harmonic could not be detected above the noise floor, the ambient level was recorded. The equivalent power into a dipole antenna was calculated from the field intensity levels measured at 3 meters.
- e) Now each detected emissions were substituted by the substitution method, in accordance with the TIA/EIA 603.

#### **Results:**

Radiated emissions measurements were made only at the upper, center, and lower carrier frequencies of the GSM-850 band (824.2 MHz, 836.4 MHz and 848.8 MHz). It was decided that measurements at these three carrier frequencies would be sufficient to demonstrate compliance with emissions limits because it was seen that all the significant spurs occur well outside the band and no radiation was seen from a carrier in one block of the GSM-850 band into any of the other blocks. The equipment must still, however, meet emissions requirements with the carrier at all frequencies over which it is capable of operating and it is the manufacturer's responsibility to verify this.

The final open field radiated levels are presented on the next pages.

All measurements were done in horizontal and vertical polarization; the plots show the worst case.

The plots show only the middle channel. If spurious were detected, the lowest and highest channel were checked too. The found values are stated in the table below.

As can be seen from this data, the emissions from the test item were within the specification limit.




Plot 1: Channel 189 (Traffic mode up to 30 MHz)





Plot 2: Channel 128 (30 MHz - 1 GHz), vertical polarization




Plot 3: Channel 128 (1 GHz - 12.75 GHz), vertical polarization





Plot 4: Channel 128 (30 MHz - 1 GHz), horizontal polarization




Plot 5: Channel 128 (1 GHz – 12.75 GHz), horizontal polarization





Plot 6: Channel 189 (30 MHz - 1 GHz), vertical polarization




Plot 7: Channel 189 (1 GHz - 12.75 GHz), vertical polarization





Plot 8: Channel 189 (30 MHz - 1 GHz), horizontal polarization




Plot 9: Channel 189 (1 GHz – 12.75 GHz), horizontal polarization





Plot 10: Channel 251 (30 MHz - 1 GHz), vertical polarization




Plot 11: Channel 251 (1 GHz - 12.75 GHz), vertical polarization





Plot 12: Channel 251 (30 MHz - 1 GHz), horizontal polarization




Plot 13: Channel 251 (1 GHz - 12.75 GHz), horizontal polarization





Plot 14: Channel 128 (30 MHz - 1 GHz), EDGE, vertical polarization




Plot 15: Channel 128 (1 GHz - 12.75 GHz), EDGE, vertical polarization





Plot 16: Channel 128 (30 MHz - 1 GHz), EDGE, horizontal polarization




Plot 17: Channel 128 (1 GHz - 12.75 GHz), EDGE, horizontal polarization





Plot 18: Channel 189 (30 MHz - 1 GHz), EDGE, vertical polarization




Plot 19: Channel 189 (1 GHz - 12.75 GHz), EDGE, vertical polarization





Plot 20: Channel 189 (30 MHz - 1 GHz), EDGE, horizontal polarization




Plot 21: Channel 189 (1 GHz – 12.75 GHz), EDGE, horizontal polarization





Plot 22: Channel 251 (30 MHz - 1 GHz), EDGE, vertical polarization




Plot 23: Channel 251 (1 GHz – 12.75 GHz), EDGE, vertical polarization





### 8.3.2 Spurious emissions radiated

#### **Description:**

The following steps outline the procedure used to measure the radiated emissions from the mobile station. The site is constructed in accordance with ANSI C63.4:2009 requirements and is recognized by the FCC to be in compliance for a 3 and a 10 meter site. - a) The test item was placed on a 0.8 meter high non-conductive stand at a 3 meter test distance from the receive antenna.
- b) The antenna output was terminated in a 50 ohm load (if possible).
- c) A double ridged wave guide antenna was placed on an adjustable height antenna mast 3 meters from the test item for emission measurements.
- d) Detected emissions were maximized at each frequency by rotating the test item and adjusting the receive antenna height and polarization. The maximum meter reading was recorded. The radiated emission measurements of the harmonics of the transmit frequency through the 10th harmonic were measured with peak detector and 1 MHz bandwidth. 


Plot 1: Channel 661 (Traffic mode up to 30 MHz)





Plot 3: Channel 512 (1 GHz - 12.75 GHz), vertical polarization




Carrier notched with 1.9 GHz rejection filter



Plot 5: Channel 512 (1 GHz - 12.75 GHz), horizontal polarization




Carrier notched with 1.9 GHz rejection filter




Plot 6: Channel 512 (12 GHz - 18 GHz)

Plot 7: Channel 512 (18 GHz - 26 GHz)





Plot 9: Channel 661 (1 GHz - 12.75 GHz), vertical polarization




Carrier notched with 1.9 GHz rejection filter



Plot 11: Channel 661 (1 GHz - 12.75 GHz), horizontal polarization




Carrier notched with 1.9 GHz rejection filter




Plot 12: Channel 661 (12 GHz - 18 GHz)

Plot 13: Channel 661 (18 GHz - 26 GHz)





Plot 15: Channel 810 (1 GHz – 12.75 GHz), vertical polarization





Plot 17: Channel 810 (1 GHz – 12.75 GHz), horizontal polarization






Plot 18: Channel 810 (12 GHz - 18 GHz)

Plot 19: Channel 810 (18 GHz - 26 GHz)





Plot 21: Channel 512 (1 GHz - 12.75 GHz), EDGE, vertical polarization





Plot 23: Channel 512 (1 GHz - 12.75 GHz), EDGE, horizontal polarization






Plot 24: Channel 512 (12 GHz - 18 GHz), EDGE

Plot 25: Channel 512 (18 GHz - 26 GHz), EDGE





Plot 27: Channel 661 (1 GHz - 12.75 GHz), EDGE, vertical polarization





Plot 29: Channel 661 (1 GHz - 12.75 GHz), EDGE, horizontal polarization






Plot 30: Channel 661 (12 GHz - 18 GHz), EDGE

Plot 31: Channel 661 (18 GHz - 26 GHz), EDGE





Plot 33: Channel 810 (1 GHz - 12.75 GHz), EDGE, vertical polarization





Plot 35: Channel 810 (1 GHz - 12.75 GHz), EDGE, horizontal polarization






Plot 36: Channel 810 (12 GHz - 18 GHz)

#### 9 Test equipment and ancillaries used for tests

Typically, the calibrations of the test apparatus are commissioned to and performed by an accredited calibration laboratory. The calibration intervals are determined in accordance with the DIN EN ISO/IEC 17025. In addition to the external calibrations, the laboratory executes comparison measurements with other calibrated test systems or effective verifications. Weekly chamber inspections and range calibrations are performed. Where possible, rf-generating and signalling equipment as well as measuring receivers and analyzers are connected to an external high-precision 10 MHz reference (GPS-based or rubidium frequency standard).

In order to simplify the identification of the equipment used at some special tests, some items of test equipment and ancillaries can be provided with an identifier or number in the equipment list below (Labor/Item).
