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### 1.0 General Description

#### 1.1 Product Description

The Equipment Under Test (EUT) is a 2.4GHz Bluetooth speaker, which is operating between 2402MHz and 2480MHz (79 channels with 1MHz channel spacing). The EUT is powered by 100-240VAC. When the EUT is switched ON, the LED will flash. It is required to press the pairing button to pair with the corresponding device before playing audio. After pairing, the LED will stay lit. The EUT has an AUX IN jack to connect corresponding device to play audio.

The Model: XW-BTS1-K is the same as the Model: XW-BTS1-W in hardware aspect. The difference in appearance, trade name and model number serves as marketing strategy.

Antenna Type : Internal, Integral

#### 1.2 Related Submittal(s) Grants

This is a single application for certification of a transceiver.

#### 1.3 Test Methodology

Both AC mains line-conducted and radiated emission measurements were performed according to the procedures in ANSI C63.4 (2009). All radiated measurements were performed in an Open Area Test Site. Preliminary scans were performed in the Open Area Test Site only to determine worst case modes. All radiated tests were performed at an antenna to EUT distance of 3 meters, unless stated otherwise in the “**Justification Section**” of this Application.

#### 1.4 Test Facility

The open area test site and conducted measurement facility used to collect the radiated data is located at Garment Centre, 576 Castle Peak Road, Kowloon, Hong Kong. This test facility and site measurement data have been placed on file with the FCC and IC.

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### 2.0 **System Test Configuration**

#### 2.1 Justification

The system was configured for testing in a typical fashion (as a customer would normally use it), and in the confines as outlined in ANSI C63.4 (2009).

The device was powered by 120VAC (Model: OH-1015A0901660U-UL, Input: 100-240VAC 50-60Hz, Output: 9.0VDC 1.66A).

For maximizing emissions, the EUT was rotated through 360°, the antenna height was varied from 1 meter to 4 meters above the ground plane, and the antenna polarization was changed. This step by step procedure for maximizing emissions led to the data reported in Exhibit 3.0.

The rear of unit shall be flushed with the rear of the table.

The equipment under test (EUT) was configured for testing in a typical fashion (as a customer would normally use it). The EUT was mounted to a plastic stand if necessary and placed on the wooden turntable, which enabled the engineer to maximize emissions through its placement in the three orthogonal axes.

#### 2.2 EUT Exercising Software

There was no special software to exercise the device. Once the unit is powered up, it transmits the RF signal continuously.

#### 2.3 Special Accessories

There are no special accessories necessary for compliance of this product.

#### 2.4 Equipment Modification

Any modifications installed previous to testing by Ocean Star Electronics Ltd. will be incorporated in each production model sold/leased in the United States and Canada.

No modifications were installed by Intertek Testing Services Hong Kong Ltd.

#### 2.5 Measurement Uncertainty

When determining of the test conclusion, the Measurement Uncertainty of test has been considered.

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### 3.0 Emission Results

Data is included of the worst case configuration (the configuration which resulted in the highest emission levels). A sample calculation, configuration photographs and data tables of the emissions are included.

#### 3.1 Field Strength Calculation

The field strength is calculated by adding the Antenna Factor and Cable Factor, and subtracting the Amplifier Gain (if any), Average Factor (optional) from the measured reading. The basic equation with a sample calculation is as follows:

$$FS = RA + AF + CF - AG - AV$$

where

- FS = Field Strength in dB $\mu$ V/m
- RA = Receiver Amplitude (including preamplifier) in dB $\mu$ V
- CF = Cable Attenuation Factor in dB
- AF = Antenna Factor in dB
- AG = Amplifier Gain in dB
- AV = Average Factor in dB

In the following table(s), the reading shown on the data table reflects the preamplifier gain. An example for the calculations in the following table is as follows:

$$FS = RR + LF$$

where

- FS = Field Strength in dB $\mu$ V/m
- RR = RA - AG - AV in dB $\mu$ V
- LF = CF + AF in dB

Assume a receiver reading of 52.0 dB $\mu$ V is obtained. The antenna factor of 7.4 dB and cable factor of 1.6 dB are added. The amplifier gain of 29 dB and average factor of 5 dB are subtracted, giving a field strength of 27 dB $\mu$ V/m. This value in dB $\mu$ V/m was converted to its corresponding level in  $\mu$ V/m.

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### 8.0 Miscellaneous Information

The miscellaneous information includes details of the test procedure and measured bandwidth / calculation of factor such as pulse desensitization and averaging factor.

### 8.1 Measured Bandwidth

From the following plots, they show that the fundamental emissions are confined in the specified band (2400MHz to 2483.5MHz). In case of the fundamental emissions are within two standard bandwidths from the bandedge, the delta measurement technique is used for determining bandedge compliance. Standard bandwidth is the bandwidth specified by ANSI C63.4 (2009) for frequency being measured.

Emissions radiated outside of the specified frequency bands, except harmonics, are attenuated by 50dB below the level of the fundamental or to the general radiated emissions limits in Section 15.209, whichever is the lesser attenuation, which meet the requirement of part 15.249(d).

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### Peak Measurement

Bandedge compliance is determined by applying marker-delta method, i.e. (Bandedge Plot).

Lower bandedge

Peak Resultant field strength = Fundamental emissions (peak value) – delta from the plot

=104.0 dB $\mu$ V/m - 38.7 dB

=65.3 dB $\mu$ V/m

Average Resultant field strength = Fundamental emissions (average value) – delta from the plot

=73.9 dB $\mu$ V/m - 38.7 dB

=35.2 dB $\mu$ V/m

Upper bandedge

Peak Resultant field strength = Fundamental emissions (peak value) – delta from the plot

=103.5 dB $\mu$ V/m - 43.8 dB

=59.7 dB $\mu$ V/m

Average Resultant field strength = Fundamental emissions (average value) – delta from the plot

=73.4 dB $\mu$ V/m - 43.8 dB

=29.6 dB $\mu$ V/m

The resultant field strength meets the general radiated emission limit in section 15.209, which does not exceed 74 dB $\mu$ V/m (Peak Limit) and 54 dB $\mu$ V/m (Average Limit).

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### 8.2 Discussion Pulse Desensitivity

Pulse desensitivity is not applicable for this device. The effective period ( $T_{eff}$ ) is approximately  $625\mu s$  for a digital "1" bit which illustrated on technical specification, with a resolution bandwidth (3dB) of 100kHz, so the pulse desensitivity factor is 0dB.

### 8.3 Calculation of Average Factor

Based on the Bluetooth Specification Version 2.0 / 2.1 + EDR, the transmitter ON time for each timeslot of Bluetooth is  $625\mu s$ . DH5 has the maximum duty cycle, which consists of 5 continuous Tx slots and 1 Rx slot. Therefore one hopset take  $(5+1) \times 625\mu s = 3.75ms$ . For one period for a pseudo-random hopping through all 79 RF channels, it take:  $79 \times 3.75ms = 296.25ms$ .

The dwell time for DH5 is  $5 \times 625\mu s = 3.125ms$

Therefore,

$$\begin{aligned} \text{Duty Cycle (DC)} &= \text{Maximum On time in } 100ms/100ms \\ &= 3.125ms/100ms \\ &= 0.03125 \end{aligned}$$

$$\begin{aligned} \text{Average Factor (AF) of Bluetooth in dB} &= 20 \log_{10} (0.03125) \\ &= -30.1dB \end{aligned}$$

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### 8.4 Emissions Test Procedures

The following is a description of the test procedure used by Intertek Testing Services Hong Kong Ltd. in the measurements of transmitter operating under the Part 15, Subpart C rules.

The test set-up and procedures described below are designed to meet the requirements of ANSI C63.4 (2009). A typical or an unmodulated CW signal at the operating frequency of the EUT has been supplied to the EUT for all measurements. Such a signal is supplied by a signal generator and an antenna in close proximity to the EUT. The signal level is sufficient to stabilize the local oscillator of the EUT.

The transmitting equipment under test (EUT) is placed on a wooden turntable which is four feet in diameter and approximately one meter in height above the ground plane. During the radiated emissions test, the turntable is rotated and any cables leaving the EUT are manipulated to find the configuration resulting in maximum emissions. The EUT is adjusted through all three orthogonal axis to obtain maximum emission levels. The antenna height and polarization are also varied during the testing to search for maximum signal levels. The height of the antenna is varied from one to four meters.

Detector function for radiated emissions is in peak mode. Average readings, when required, are taken by measuring the duty cycle of the equipment under test and subtracting the corresponding amount in dB from the measured peak readings. A detailed description for the calculation of the average factor can be found in Exhibit 8.3.

The frequency range scanned is from the lowest radio frequency signal generated in the device which is greater than 9 kHz to the tenth harmonic of the highest fundamental frequency or 40 GHz, whichever is lower. For line conducted emissions, the range scanned is 150 kHz to 30 MHz.



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### 8.4 Emissions Test Procedures (cont'd)

The EUT is warmed up for 15 minutes prior to the test.

AC power to the unit is varied from 85% to 115% nominal and variation in the fundamental emission field strength is recorded. If battery powered, a new, fully charged battery is used.

Conducted measurements were made as described in ANSI C63.4 (2009).

The IF bandwidth used for measurement of radiated signal strength was 100 kHz or greater when frequency is below 1000 MHz. Where pulsed transmissions of short enough pulse duration warrant, a greater bandwidth is selected according to the recommendations of Hewlett Packard Application Note 150-2. A discussion of whether pulse desensitivity is applicable to this unit is included in this report (See Exhibit 8.1). Above 1000 MHz, a resolution bandwidth of 1 MHz is used.

Transmitter measurements are normally conducted at a measurement distance of three meters. However, to assure low enough noise floor in the forbidden bands and above 1 GHz, signals are acquired at a distance of one meter or less. All measurements are extrapolated to three meters using inverse scaling, unless otherwise reported. Measurements taken at a closer distance are so marked.
