INTRODUCTION

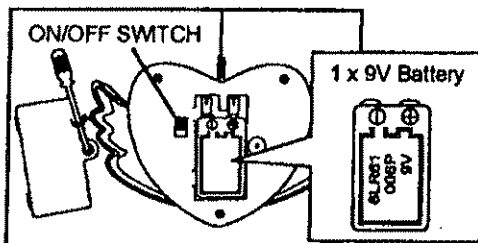
Every day's an adventure for the kids with a passion for fun! And when you do the driving, this RC motor scooter is an adventure for you too!

QUICK START

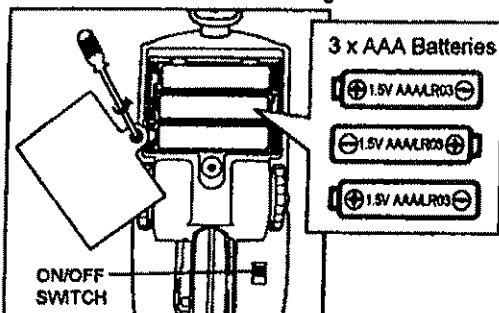
STEP 1: BATTERY INSTALLATION

Radio Control Handset

1. Switch the power to "OFF".
2. Using a Phillips screwdriver (not included) remove the screw and battery compartment cover from the bottom of the Handset. (see Fig. 1)
3. Install one (1) 9V alkaline battery (not included) making sure the (+) and (-) ends face the proper direction as indicated inside the battery compartment. (Fig. 1)
4. Replace the battery cover & tighten the screw.

Motor Scooter

1. Using a Phillips screwdriver (not included) remove the screw and battery compartment cover from the bottom of the scooter. (Fig. 2)
2. Insert three (3) AAA (1.5V) Alkaline batteries (not included) making sure the (+) and (-) ends face the proper direction as indicated inside the battery compartment. (Fig. 2)
3. Replace the battery cover & tighten the screw.

STEP 2: GIVE YOUR BRATZ KIDZ™ A RIDE

To get your Bratz Kidz™ ready to roll:

1. Place the helmet on her head and secure with the Velcro™ fastener. (Fig. 3)
2. Bend your Bratz Kidz™ legs at the knees and place her on the scooter (Fig. 4)
3. Fasten her seat belt using the Velcro™ fastener. (Fig. 4)

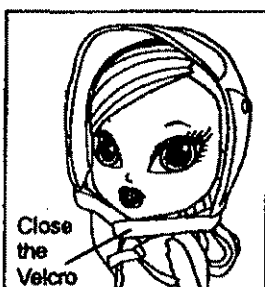

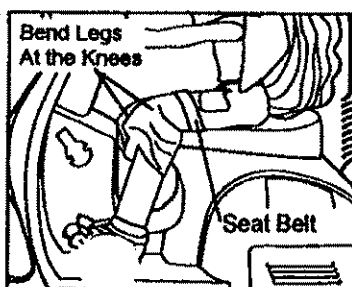

STEP 3: RACING YOUR SCOOTER

1. Switch the Remote Control Handset and the Motor Scooter switches to "ON."
2. Straighten the Antenna (Fig. 5)
3. Push the FORWARD, BACKWARD, LEFT and RIGHT buttons to race your vehicle in any direction! (Figs. 6 & 7)

NOTE: An indicator light on the handset will light only when you push the buttons.

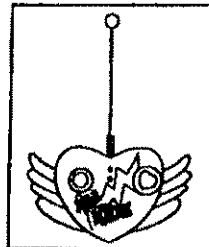

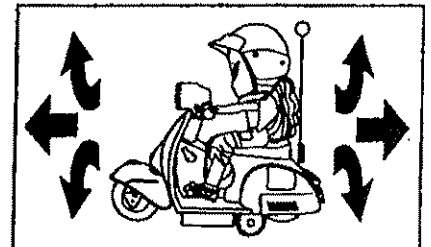

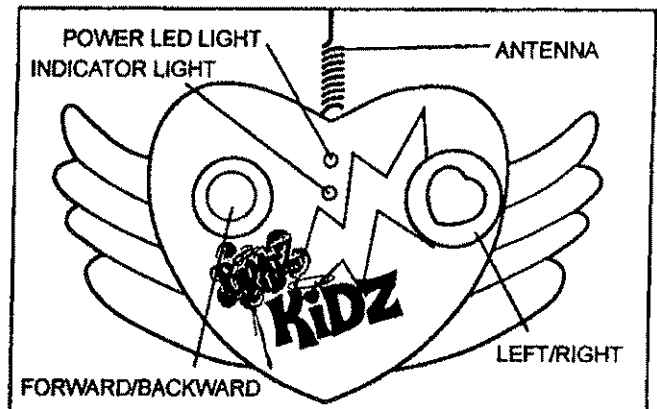

MOTOR SCOOTER STEERING ADJUSTMENT

1. Adjust your motor scooter's steering by rotating the Steering Knob bit by bit. (Fig. 8)
2. After each adjustment, place your motor scooter on the ground and take it for a spin!
3. Repeat these steps until you get the best steering action for your motor scooter.

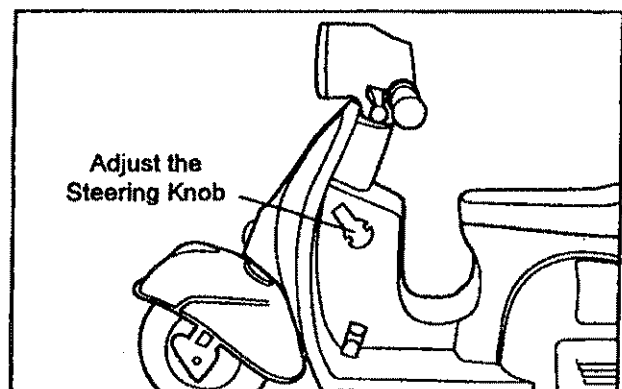

TROUBLE SHOOTING

IF THERE IS NO FUNCTION BETWEEN THE REMOTE CONTROL HANDSET AND THE MOTOR SCOOTER:

- Make sure the Remote Control Handset and the Motor Scooter switches to the ON position.
- Make sure the batteries are inserted properly.
- Replace the old batteries with new alkaline batteries.
- Move the remote control handset closer to the motor scooter to determine the best communication between the two. (The operating range is approximately 6 to 8 feet.)
- When not in use, turn both the remote and scooter switches to OFF to save battery power.

HELPFUL HINTS

CAUTION: DO NOT operate units during thunderstorms. DO NOT operate the motor scooter on the street or in traffic.
CAUTION: Keep fingers, hair and loose clothing away from the tires, wheel hubs and motors while the motor scooter is switched on.

- Avoid water when racing your motor scooter. In addition, do not submerge your Motor Scooter Handset in water.
- When your motor scooter starts to lose power and/or experiences a loss of performance ability, replace the batteries.
- Your motor scooter is operated by radio waves. It is possible the unit may not perform properly due to interference from nearby devices such as a cordless phones, hair dryers, radios, walkie-talkies or other radio-controlled toys.
- Avoid operating the motor scooter in sand and snow.
- Always select a safe place to play. Never operate your motor scooter on populated streets.

SAFE BATTERY PRECAUTIONS

1. Non-rechargeable batteries are not to be recharged;
2. Rechargeable batteries are to be removed from the toy before being charged;
3. Rechargeable batteries are only to be charged under adult supervision;
4. Different types of batteries or new and used batteries are not to be mixed;
5. Only batteries of the same or equivalent type as recommended are to be used;
6. Batteries are to be inserted with the correct polarity;
7. Exhausted batteries are to be removed from the toy;
8. The supply terminals are not to be short-circuited;
9. Do not dispose of the batteries in fire, batteries may leak or explode;
10. Batteries should be replaced by adult;
11. Use alkaline batteries for better performance;
12. When not in use for an extended time, remove batteries to prevent possible leakage.

CAUTION:

- DO NOT use rechargeable batteries in the Remote Control Handset or the Motor Scooter.
- Not suitable for children under 3 years.
- May contain small parts.
