Overview

Standby Display

Operator's name shows you are ready to make or receive calls.

Menu (Softkey)

To use and set up phone and network features.

P-Book (Softkey)

To see PhoneBook entries for easy calling.

Call

Dials displayed number or name. Also answers calls.

On, Off, End

Hold down to switch on or off. Press to end call or return to standby.

Ringer On/Off

Hold down to avoid disturbance.

Key Lock

Hold down to switch on or off.

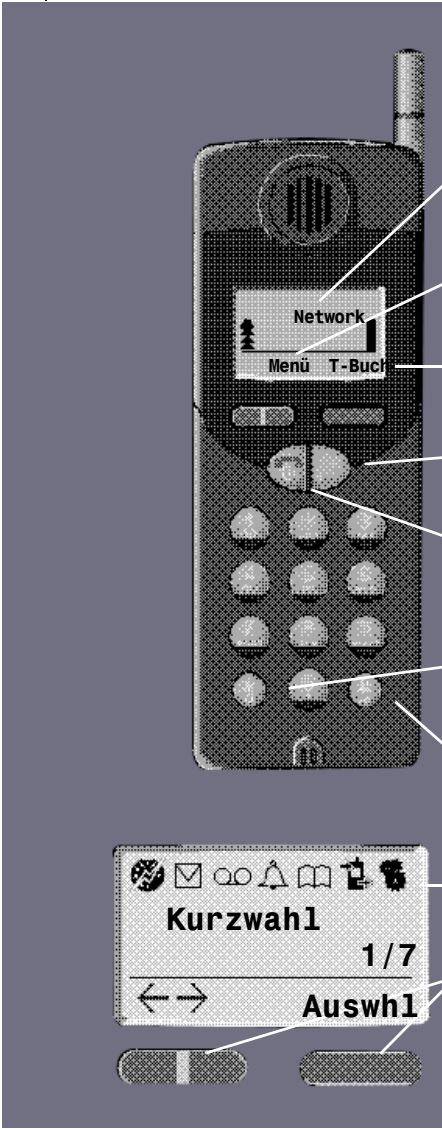

Precautions

If you experience difficulties, Siemens provide a dedicated helpline in most countries around the world (see rear cover).






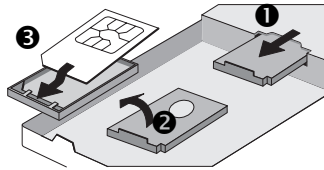
Getting Started

1. Insert SIM Card

Your Service Provider will supply a SIM card, containing your phone number and billing details. It may be used in other GSM phones.

You need a small size SIM card, and may need to carefully snap this out from credit card sized SIM.

- Remove rear cover and battery if fitted (see right).
- Pull out SIM holder (1).



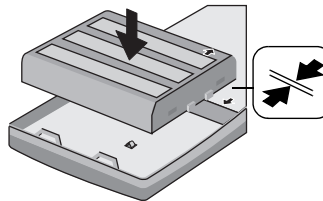
- Invert card holder (2) and insert SIM card (3).
- Ensure angled corner is correctly located and that card fits flush.
- **Reinvert card holder**, and slide back fully.

Demonstration

When SIM is not fitted, you can press **Demo**.

2. Fit and Charge Battery

- Remove battery cover.
- Locate battery as shown. Ensure correct orientation (align arrows).





- Lay cover flat on top of battery, then slide closed.

If removing battery ensure phone is switched off first.

To charge battery:

- Insert charging jack into hole on top of phone.
- Plug charging unit into mains power socket (ensure voltage stated on charger is not exceeded).

 Charging indication.
Allow 7 hours for maximum charge

 Charge level.
Beep sounds, when nearly empty.

Usage Time

A full charge can provide up to 80 hours standby, or 5 hours talktime - subject to network and environmental conditions.

Getting Started

3. Switch on



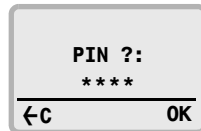
Hold down to switch on or off.

4. Enter PIN

Your SIM card is provided with a PIN code to prevent misuse.

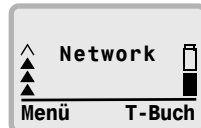


Enter your PIN code.
(Correct errors with ←C)



Press 

Your phone will register with Network, this may take some seconds.



You are ready to make and receive calls when Operator's name appears.

Notruf: Press soft key to access emergency service, (without a SIM).

You can always dial 112 (999 in UK). Please do not abuse this service.

PIN: SIM card will be blocked after third incorrect PIN entry. In this case, or if you forget your PIN, see p. 31.

To switch off PIN control or change your PIN number, see p. 25.

Network connection:



Incoming signal strength.




If it is very weak, there may be risks of call quality or continuity.

You can normally improve reception by moving to window, elevated or open space.

Your phone will automatically select another network if you are abroad, or outside your 'home' network.


Making Calls

Dialling with Keypad

 Dial required number.

Use always full area code, even if calling locally. Correct errors with **←C**, short press clears last digit, long press the total number.

 Call displayed number.

 Press to end your call.

Easier Ways to Call

For easier, quicker, and error free use, you can:

- Redial previous calls
- Automatically redial failed calls
- Call back received calls
- Call back unanswered calls
- Save the number, and name it in your PhoneBook. You then use the name to call it.
- Use your Quick Dial List

You can also:

- Call numbers in messages
- Call 2 or more numbers at once

You may use your **Menü** (see p. 13) or proceed as follows:

Last Calls

Your phone remembers the last numbers called (and received)


From your standby display:


Redialling your Last Call

 Press twice.

Redialling Previous Calls

 Press.

 Scroll to see previous calls.

 Press to call displayed number.

Auto Redialling

If a call is unsuccessful you are offered:

Wdh. Press to repeatedly dial number in progressive intervals for 15 minutes.

Any other use of phone will clear this.

Making Calls

Calling Back



The last 'identified' incoming calls are recorded.



Shows your last calls list.



Scroll left for quickest access to last received call list.



Press to call displayed number.

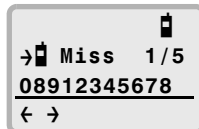
Numbers can only be identified if networks support Caller ID.

Missed Calls



If you fail to answer a call, your **T-Buch** 'key' is replaced:

Liste → Select to display your Missed Call list (some may be unknown).



Press to call displayed number, or scroll to display further missed calls.

Your Missed Call list can also be recalled via the **Menü** (see p. 23).

International Dialling



Hold down until ' + ' appears, providing international access from all countries.



Enter country code (see p. 29) then:



Dial national number (omitting leading '0').

For later use abroad, save 'home' country numbers with this prefix (see p. 8).

Alternative Line

If you subscribe to a second phone line (C11):



The active line is displayed (in standby).

To switch line:



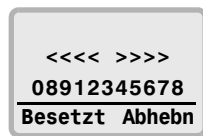

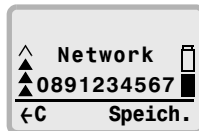

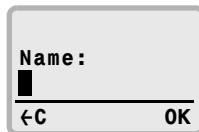


Dial complete number including area code, as usual.

For easier use abroad, enter international code + (see p. 6)



Press



Write name, number keys now write letters (see right).

OK

Press.



Dial number if required



or
Press to return to standby, ready for next entry.

Writing Names

Press number / letter keys repeatedly. The cursor advances after a short delay.



Press once for 'A', twice for 'B' etc.. Available characters are displayed on the bottom line.



Press to erase letter preceding cursor, hold down to erase name.



Press to manually switch 'letter' CASE (normally the first letter is UPPER CASE, switching automatically to lower case.



Press to create space

Other characters



These keys write punctuation, common symbols and cyrillic.

Press to see Option (see also p. 18).

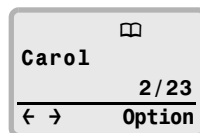

- You may enter a range of numbers for same person eg.
Carol O (Office)
Carol M (Mobile)
Carol H (Home)
- You can save up to 40 No/code combinations for call routing.

Calling from PhoneBook

T-Buch Press to open Phone-Book.


 Write first letter of required name, and/or scroll to display required name.



Call displayed name.

Hints

- If you have many entries starting with same letter, enter next letter and scroll backwards.
- In some cases your **T-Buch** key may not be offered.

PhoneBook

DTMF Control Codes

You can save code numbers for controlling remote services (eg. Answering Machine).



Enter the phone number.



Hold down until ' + ' appears. (This creates a 3 second pause). Repeat this, if a longer pause is required.



Enter DTMF number.

Save Press and add suitable name as usual.


Alternatively, just save the Control Code, and send it during call (see p. 9).

Info

Own Number

The first P-Book entry is for your own number. If your mobile number is not programmed, it will be helpful to enter it here.

Set Press

 **OK** Enter Number

If your SIM provides an alternate line (line **2**) you can view or set the second number.

Services PhoneBook

Your Operator or Service Provider may supply your SIM with P-Book entries for useful services. If so, you will see **Service T-Buch** as 3rd entry.

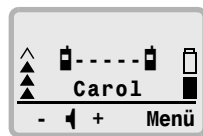
PhoneBook Restrictions

Your SIM may have a restricted PhoneBook, if so only listed calls may be made, and no new entries are possible. PIN2 is required to control this (FDN) restriction.

During a Call

Some features are only available during call.

Volume Control



 Press

Use either end of left softkey.

Recording a Number

If a caller dictates a number, you can record it.



Enter phone number.
The number can be
dialled or saved after call.

To prevent others seeing a secure code (eg Bank PIN):



Hold down (during call).

Time, Charge

To see current call time (charge if set):

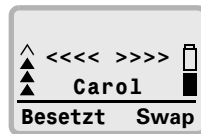
During a Call

Call waiting

During a call you can be advised that there is another waiting.

You may need to register for this service, and need to set your phone (see p. 24).

You will hear a special tone during call. Your caller will hear ringing tone.



You have 3 options:

1 End current call, answer new



Press to end current call, waiting call will ring and can be answered as usual.

2 Swap

Swap or  Press.

This accepts waiting call and places current call on hold. You may swap back and forth as required.

3 Reject waiting call

Busy Caller will hear busy tone.

or

Rufum1 This is offered instead if set (see p. 22).

Hold/Multi Party Calls

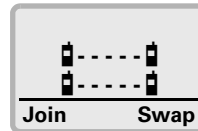
You can hold current call, call new number, swap back or join them together. During a call, explain your intention then:



Dial new number or use PhoneBook (via **Menü**).



Press, to hold the first call, and speak to the new party.



You have 3 options:

1 Swap

Swap or  Press.

This returns to the held call and places current call on hold. You may swap back and forth.

2 End / Return



Press to end current call.

You should press **Ja** to return to held call.

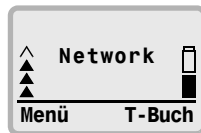
3 Join

Join Select to provide a 3 way conference. You may repeat this, adding a maximum of 5 calls.

Menu Use

Menu Principles

Your menu enables you to set up and use phone and Network features.



Press



Menu headings
Location/length



Scroll horizontally to display required top menu.

Auswahl Press.

Selecting an entry from Menu leads to a sub-menu, and sometimes further submenus.



Hold down to exit (return to normal standby state). A short press steps back to the previous menu.

Note: Holding down when in standby will switch off.

Your phone remembers your last 7 Menu tasks. You can simply repeat, modify or clear them. From standby:

 Press, your softkey offers:

Liste  Press, scroll and select from list.

The list is cleared when you switch off.

Short Cut

Menu functions are numbered. You may also select directly by entering successive location numbers eg.

Menü 2,3 willselect your Message list.

Alternative Line Menu

If you subscribe to a second phone line, you may set each menu entry specific to this line (eg. a different ring, divert, security). You must however select the required line before entering the menu (see p. 6).

Network Feature

Some Network features may not be currently offered by your Operator, or may require registration.



Indicates network dependent feature.

When set, you can call by just dialling one digit:

Record Quick Dial No. for future use. If list is full, choose entry to swap.



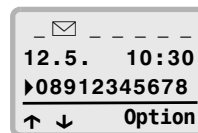



The display indicates the date and time received, also the originator's number.

 Scroll through message.

 Press to call highlighted **Rufnummer**.

Deleting Messages

At end of message you are asked to delete it:

Ja Press.


You should normally delete a message since capacity (of SIM card) is limited, and when full, you cannot receive more messages.







- If your message is not sent, you are offered **Wiederholen?**. If this fails, check that your Service Centre is correctly set and that the destination phone is compatible (see p. 26).
- Note that 'Message sent' means it has been received by your Service Centre, if it cannot be immediately delivered, it will be continuously retransmitted.





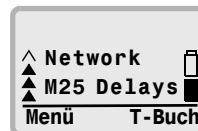
You can create messages yourself, or edit messages sent by others.

Messages

Your Operator may offer a Cell Broadcast service, where information can be broadcast within specific cells. A range of services including traffic, weather, etc. is being developed.

Please see **CB Setup**, p. 27 to switch on, and select topics.

Reading Cell Broadcast




A new broadcast scrolls through your display, until read manually (see below). Your network may replace a broadcast with a new one.

Last Call

You can see the duration of your last call, and if supported by your Network, the Units used. You can also see the associated Charge, if you have set this (see below).

Total Calls

This enables you to see the cumulative Time (Units and Charge if set). It also enables you to zero these.

Auto Display

Switch on this to see elapsed time during a call, the call time will also appear briefly after each call. Related charge is shown, if this is programmed.

Minute Beep

Switch on to hear a reminder beep every minute.

Charge Rate

If your network supports 'Advice of Charge', and you are registered for it, you will see number of Units used.



/ OK Enter valid Charge Rate per Unit (note decimal point on softkey). Your phone will calculate and display relevant charge.



/ OK Charge Rate per Minute can be entered, but note inaccuracy owing to tariff variations.



/ OK Charge Rate Currency can be named.

Charge Limit

Your phone can be set to suspend service after a predetermined number of Units have been used. This requires a special SIM, with a second PIN (PIN 2).

When switched on, the Units limit can be entered or changed. You can also use **Info** to check status.

Your Service Provider may use this feature to enable instant and possibly prepaid service.

Security

Security Codes

Use of your SIM is controlled by your PIN number. Other security functions are controlled by PHONECODE, this is a 4-8 digit code, originated by you when you set the first security function (you are asked to repeat it).



It is most important to keep PIN and PHONECODE numbers securely. The phone will be locked after three incorrect entries (your Service Provider may charge for unlocking).

SOS Emergency 112 (999 in UK) calls can always be made.



Lock Quick Dial

Trouble Shooting

Your phone will be reliable unless it suffers from extreme shock or moisture. The following list should help you identify and remedy problems. In many SIM and network-related instances it may, however, be necessary to call your Service Provider's Customer Service Helpline.
