




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### Impedance Measurement Plot for Head TSL






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### Impedance Measurement Plot Body TSL

(TEM-Cell:ifi110 EXX, Waveguide: R22)








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# Receiving Pattern ( $\phi$ ), $\vartheta = 0^{\circ}$


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# Dynamic Range f(SAR<sub>head</sub>)

Uncertainty of Linearity Assessment: ± 0.6% (k=2)



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




- 1. The EUT was connected to Base Station, Agilent 8960. Refer to the drawing of Setup Configuration.
