How to setup your voice remote

- A. Make sure you are pointing your voice remote at the Set-Top Box you want to pair with.
- B. Press and hold the <u>Play/Pause</u> and <u>O</u> buttons at the same time for three seconds. Release when the blue light starts flashing on the remote.
- C. When the blue light stops flashing, your remote is connected and paired.
- D. Follow on-screen directions to pair the remote with your TV

Give voice control a try.

Hold the button down and say: "Tune to CNN" or "Show me comedy movies." Or, click OK to go to Live TV.
