I have a few comments on the above referenced Application.

- 1) The internal photographs may not normally be held confidential strictly on the basis of trade secrets. Please remove this justification from the letter of confidentiality or provide a better justification. As an alternative, you may use a black marker to "black out" the top of any readable components and provide new internal photographs. Please let us know how you wish to proceed with this issue.
- 2) It does not appear that voltage and current information was provided for the DC voltages/currents applied into the several elements of the final radio frequency amplifying device for normal operation over the power range. Please provide.
- 3) Please explain the rational behind Note 1 in Section 4.5 of the report (i.e., 90.217(b) stipulates +/- 25 kHz, note states +/- 50 kHz). Was the area near the fundamental adequately tested via radiated measurements?
- 4) There is a question pending with the FCC in relation to this application. If further information is necessary, we will let you know as soon as possible.
