$$(P G) / (4 R ^ 2 \pi) = S$$

$$\left(\frac{258.2260191}{(mw)} \quad \frac{15.92209}{(gain)} \right) / \left(4 * \frac{20}{(cm)}^2 * \pi \right) = S \quad (mW/cm^2)$$

$$(4111.497211) / (4 * 400 * \pi) = S \quad (mW/cm^2)$$

$$(4111.497211) / (5026.548246) = 0.817956 \quad (mW/cm^2)$$
