Condensation


Moisture will form on the PVS if it is brought from cool surroundings into a warm room or if the temperature of the room rises suddenly. When this happens, the PVS's performance may be impaired. To prevent this, let the PVS stay in its new surroundings for about an hour before switching on, or make sure that the room temperature rises gradually. Condensation may also form during the summer if the PVS is exposed to the breeze from an air conditioner. In such cases, change the locations of the PVS.

Mobile telephone warning

To avoid interference with your picture and sound quality, operating problems, or even damage, keep your cordless and cellular telephones away from the PVS.

Installing a wall-mount bracket

Secure the wall-mount bracket (provided) to the back of your PVS using the screws. The versa mount is universal 75*75mm globally.







- 8. Numbers 0 to 9 (press to enter channel numbers)

- 11. RJ45 Connector (connect cable to the back of the PVS)

Making Connections

(1) Connecting the power cord

. Connect the power cord to the **DC INPUT** jack on the back of your PVS, then connect the other end of the cable to a power outlet.

(2) Connecting a digital ATSC signal

- . Make sure the PVS and the external device are powered off.
- . Connect one end of a coaxial cable to the **RF TUNER** on the back of your PVS, then connect the other end to the satellite TV jack.
- . Press **INPUT** on the wired controller or the AUTO switch on the side of TV to display the Input source menu, then press **Channel UP or Channel DOWN** button to select **TV**. Press **ENTER**.

.ATSC Modulation: Air: 8-VSB; Cable: 64QAM, 256QAM

Video System: MPEG-2 MP@ML

Audio System: AC-3, MPEG1/2 Layer I and II

(3) Connecting a standard AV device

- . Make sure the PVS and the external device are powered off.
- .Connect a component cable (included) into the **VIDEO INPUT** & **AUDIO INPUT** jacks on the back of your PVS, then connect the other end of the cable to the **AV OUTPUT** jacks on the external device.
- . Press **INPUT** on the wired controller or the AUTO switch on the side of TV to display the Input source menu, then press **Channel UP or Channel DOWN** button to select **DOCK**. Press **ENTER**.
- . YPbPr/YCbCr Support Formats: 480i, 480p, 576i, 576p, 720p, 1080i, 1080p

(4) Connecting an HDMI device

- . Make sure the PVS and the external device are powered off.
- . Connect one end of an HDMI cable to the HDMI INPUT jack on the back of your PVS, then connect the other end of the cable to the HDMI OUT jack on the external device.
- . Press **INPUT** on the wired controller or the AUTO switch on the side of TV to display the Input source menu, then press **Channel UP or Channel DOWN** button to select **HDMI**. Press **ENTER**.
- . Supported Formats: 480i, 480p, 576i, 576p, 720p, 1080i, 1080p


(5) Connecting a computer

. Make sure the PVS and the PC are powered off.

- . Connect a VGA cable to the **VGA INPUT** jack on the back of your PVS, then plug the other end of the cable into the VGA jack on the computer.
- . Press **INPUT** on the wired controller or the AUTO switch on the side of TV to display the Input source menu, then press **Channel UP or Channel DOWN** button to select **VGA**. Press **ENTER**.
- . PC-RGB Format: Up to 1920*1080@60Hz Color: 16bit, 24bit, 32bit

Setup/Installation Menu

1) Adjusting the picture



- . Press **Menu** button to enter PVS Setup menu.
- . Press **Volume UP** or **Volume DOWN** button to access the Picture menu.
- . Press **Channel UP** or **Channel DOWN** button to highlight a setting. Then press **Volume UP** or **Volume DOWN** button to adjust the setting or open a setting menu. If another menu opens, press **Volume UP** or **Volume DOWN** button to adjust the setting. You can select:

Picture Mode – Selects the picture mode, Vivid, Standard, Sports, Theater, Energy Savings, or Custom.

Contrast – Adjusts the contrast.


Brightness – Adjusts the brightness.

Color – Adjusts the color.

Tint – Adjusts the tint. This function is available in the NTSC system.

Sharpness – Adjusts the sharpness.

Advanced Video – Adjust the color temper, zoom, noise reduction, adaptive contrast submenu. For more information, see "Adjusting advanced video settings" below:



Color Temp. – You can select Personal, Normal, Cool, or Warm.


Zoom Mode – You can select Wide, Zoom, Cinema, or Normal Mode.

2) Adjusting the sound



- . Press **Menu** button to enter PVS Setup menu.

. Press **Channel UP** or **Channel DOWN** button to highlight a setting. Then press **Volume UP** or **Volume DOWN** button to adjust the setting or open a setting menu. If another menu opens, press **Volume UP** or **Volume DOWN** button to adjust the setting. You can select:

Sound Mode – You can select Standard, News, Music, Movie, Sports or Custom.

Bass – Adjusts the low sounds.

Treble – Adjust the high sounds.

Balance – Adjusts the balance between the left and right channels.

Surround - You can select On or Off.

AVC - You can select On or Off.

Digital Output – You can select PCM or RAW.


Audio Language – You can select English, French or Spanish.


. Press **MENU** one or more times to return to or close the main menu.

Note: If you adjust the Treble, Bass, or Balance, your PVS automatically changes the Sound Mode or Custom.

3) Setting Main Setup Menu

a. Turning Parental Controls On/Off






Press Menu button to enter PVS Setup menu. Press Volume UP or Volume DOWN button to access the Main Setup menu. Press Channel UP or Channel DOWN button to highlight Parental Controls, then press Volume UP or Volume DOWN button to enter into Password Setting. Press the number buttons to enter the password. The Parental Control menu opens (see picture below). Press Channel UP or Channel DOWN button to select System Lock, then press Volume UP or

Volume DOWN to select On or Off. To change the Unrated Lock, US, Canada, RRT Setting or Reset RRT option, the System Lock must be set to On.

b. Time Setting




Press Menu button to enter PVS Setup menu. Press Volume UP or Volume DOWN button to access the Main Setup menu. Press Channel UP or Channel DOWN button to highlight Time menu, then press Volume UP or Volume DOWN button to enter into Submenu. Press Channel UP or Channel Down, Volume UP or Volume Down buttons to adjust the setting. You can select:

- . Sleep Timer You can select 5 Min, 10 Min, 15 Min, 30 Min, 45 Min, 60 Min, 90 Min, 120 Min, 180 Min, 240 Min or Off.
- . Time Zone You can select Pacific, Alaska, Hawaii, Atlantic, Eastern, Central or Mountain.
- . DST(Daylight Saving Time) You can select On or Off.

Note: When daylight saving time is On, the clocks are set one hour ahead of local standard time.

When Daylight Saving Time is ON, the clocks are set one hour ahead of local standard time.


c. Using Closed Caption



Press Menu button to enter PVS Setup menu. Press Volume UP or Volume DOWN button to access the Main Setup Menu. Press Channel UP or Channel DOWN button to highlight Closed Caption menu, then press Volume UP or Volume DOWN button to enter into Submenu. Press Channel UP or Channel Down, Volume UP or Volume Down buttons to adjust the setting. You can select:

- . CC You can select On or Off.
- . Basic Selection You can select CC1, CC2, CC3, Text1, Text2, Text3 or Text4.
- . Advanced Selection You can select Service1, Service2, Service3, Service4, Service5 or Service6.
- . Option You can select Mode, Font Style, Font Size, Font Edge Style, Font Edge Color, FG Color, FG Opacity or BG Opacity.

d. Menu Setting





"Are you Sure" Yes or No. Press **Enter** button to confirm.

4) Channel Setup Menu



- . Press **Menu** button to enter PVS Setup menu.
- . Press **Volume UP** or **Volume DOWN** button to access the Channel Setup menu.
- . Press **Channel UP** or **Channel DOWN** button to highlight a setting. Then press **Volume UP** or **Volume DOWN** button to adjust the setting or open a setting menu. If another menu opens, press **Volume UP** or **Volume DOWN** button to adjust the setting. You can select:

Air/Cable – You can select Air or Cable.

Auto Scan – You can select Yes or No and press Enter to confirm.

Favorite – You can enter your favorite mode and channel number, channel name, and the favorite menu item would occur and press Enter to set.

Show/Hide – You can enter the channel number, channel name to the show/hide list.

Channel No. – You can enter the wanted channel number.

DTV Signal – It shows the current DTV signal strength.

Maintenance

Cleaning the cabinet

Wipe the front panel and other exterior surfaces of the PVS with a soft cloth lightly dampened with lukewarm water. Do not use a solvent or alcohol to clean the PVS. Do not spray insecticide near the PVS. Such chemicals may cause damage and discoloration to the exposed surfaces.

Troubleshooting

- a. No power
 Check if the power cord is connected, the wired controller is connected and the headphone is plugged into the headphone jack.
- b. No Picture or Sound

Check all cable connections. Make sure that the PVS is turned On.

c. Picture is Ok, but No Sound

Make sure headphones are fully inserted into the controller headphone jack. Check the volume level and mute setting. Replace the headphone jacks on the controller. Please contact your dealer or ARG direct for replacement headphone jack modules. These jacks are designed to be easily replaced.

d. Sound is OK, but no color Check the color setting and adjust it.

e. Overlapped Images

Make sure that the antenna is installed correctly.

f. Picture has snow

Check the antenna and its connection. If there are problems, correct them. If all connections are tight, the problem might be with a faulty antenna or cable. Check signs that may disrupt the image.

g. Stripes on picture

Check for interference from other electronic devices, such as radios and televisions, and keep magnetic or electronic devices away.

h. Bad stereo or SAP sound

A long broadcast distance or interference from radio waves can cause bad sound reception.

i. "Unsupported Mode" appears on the screen Check the resolution and frequency of your computer, and adjust it to the optimum resolution for the PVS.

j. "No Signal" appears on the screenMake sure that the signal cable is firmly connected to the PVS.

k. Image is not clear Adjust the phase control.

I. Image is not centered Adjust the horizontal control.

m. Poor sound quality through headphones

Make sure that the input source is selected correctly.

Make sure headphone plug is fully inserted into the controller headphone jack.

Make sure the Coiled Cable connecting the PVS and the controller is properly connected at both ends and the cable is not damaged.

n. PVS does not respond to the commands operated from the controller

Make sure the Coiled Cable connecting the PVS and the controller is properly connected at both ends and the cable is not damaged.

Check the RJ45 jack on the back of the controller for corrosion, foreign matter or damage. Try cleaning the jack with a cotton swab.

Replace the non-functioning controller with a new one or the one that you know works. Please contact your dealer or ARG for a replacement.

Troubleshooting - Digital Broadcasting

- a. Digital channel signal strength is low
 - . Check the antenna cable. Check that the antenna is correctly setup
- b. Digital channel is scrambled

It is subscription channel. Contact the service provider.

c. Audio only

The channel has audio contents only.

Headphone jacks replacement

It is normal for the contacts in the headphone jacks to wear out periodically. To remove the worn jack: press on the small arrow located on the back side of the controller and slide the jack module in the direction of the arrow. The headphone jack module can, in most cases, be replaced without removing the controller from the cardio machine. To Install: guide the grooves of the new jack module into the tabs of the controller. Push the jack module back into the controller until it clicks into place.
