### Inserting the Battery Packs

① Slide the battery cover and open it.

- ② Insert the battery pack until it securely fits the connector.
- ③ Close the battery cover.
- ④ Slide the battery cover until it clicks.

### CAUTION

- The computer does not operate without the battery cover locked.
- Make sure the latch is securely locked. Otherwise the battery pack may fall when you carry the computer.
- Do not touch the terminals of the battery pack and the computer. Doing so can make the terminals dirty or damaged, and may cause malfunction of the battery pack and the computer.

### About the battery for this computer

This computer uses 2 battery packs.

The battery is charged ( $\rightarrow$  page 13) and power is consumed only on either battery pack. These operations switch to the other battery pack automatically.

- When the computer is connected to the Cradle (optional: CF-VEBH11U, CF-VEBH11AU), the battery pack is charged when the AC adaptor is connected to the Cradle.
- With the battery charger (optional: CF-VCBU11U) or the Cradle (optional: CF-VEBH11U, CF-VEBH11AU), you can







### 1 Set your computer to the Cradle.

- Set the computer to the cradle, and connect the external keyboard and mouse to the cradle.
- Connect the AC adaptor to the Cradle and a power outlet. The battery charging starts automatically.

### CAUTION

- Do not remove the computer from the Cradle until the "Setting up the computer" procedure is completed.
- When using the computer for the first time, do not connect any peripheral device except the battery pack, Cradle, keyboard, mouse and AC adaptor.
- Handling the AC adaptor
  - Problems such as sudden voltage drops may arise during periods of thunder and lightning. Since this could adversely affect your computer, an uninterruptible power source (UPS) is highly recommended unless running from the battery pack alone.

③ Select any [Screen Saver] option other than [3D Text] and [Blank], and click [OK].

If you select [3D Text] or [Blank], the computer may not transition properly into sleep mode or hibernation mode while the screen saver is active, due to incompatibilities with Windows 7.
