### 4.2 RADIATED EMISSION MEASUREMENT

#### 4.2.1 LIMITS OF RADIATED EMISSION MEASUREMENT

According to 15.227 the field strength of emissions from intentional radiators operated under these frequencies bands shall not exceed the following:

Field strength limits are at the distance of 3 meters, emissions radiated outside of the specified bands, shall be according to the general radiated limits in 15.209 as following:

As shown in 15.35(b), for frequencies above 1000MHz, the field strength limits are based on average detector, however, the peak field strength of any emission shall not exceed the maximum permitted average limits, specified above by more than 20dB under any condition of modulation.

**NOTE:** 1. The measurement uncertainty is less than +/- 3.0dB, which is calculated as per the NAMAS document NIS81.

2. The calibration interval of the above test instruments is 12 months. And the calibrations are traceable to NML/ROC and NIST/USA.

3. "\*" = These equipment are used for the final measurement.

4. The horn antenna and HP preamplifier (model: 8449B) are used only for the measurement of emission frequency above 1GHz if tested.



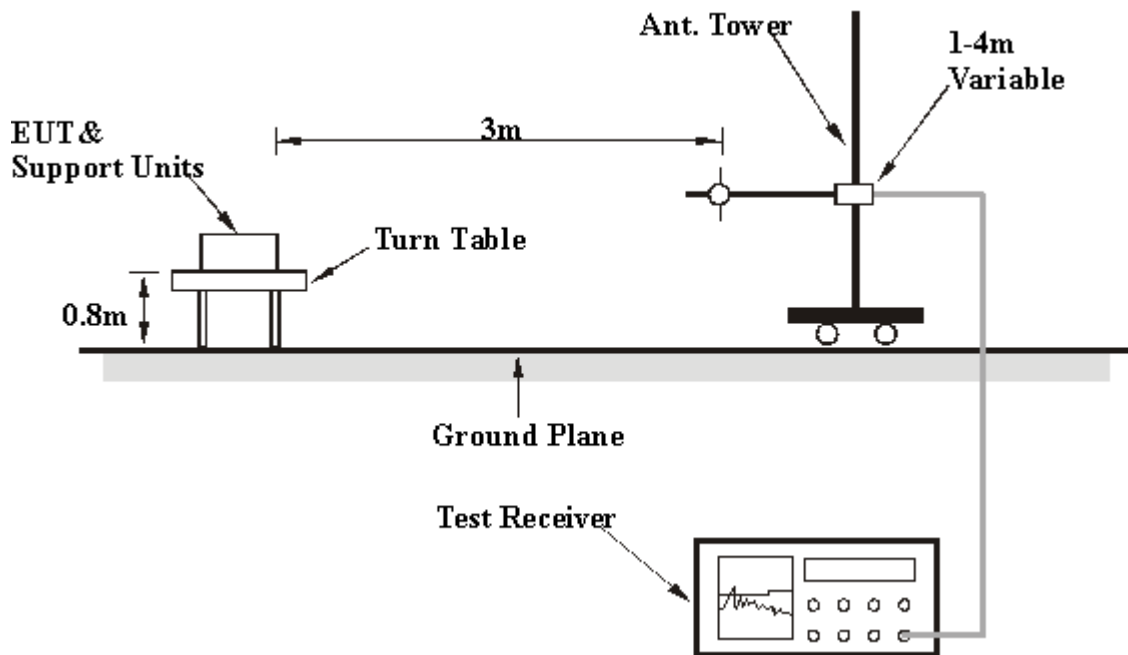
### 4.2.3 TEST PROCEDURE

- a. The EUT was placed on the top of a rotating table 0.8 meters above the ground at a 10 meter open area test site. The table was rotated 360 degrees to determine the position of the highest radiation.
- b. The EUT was set 3 meters away from the interference-receiving antenna, which was mounted on the top of a variable-height antenna tower.
- c. The antenna is a broadband antenna, and its height is varied from one meter to four meters above the ground to determine the maximum value of the field strength. Both horizontal and vertical polarizations of the antenna are set to make the measurement.
- d. For each suspected emission, the EUT was arranged to its worst case and then the antenna was tuned to heights from 1 meter to 4 meters and the rotatable table was turned from 0 degrees to 360 degrees to find the maximum reading.
- e. The test-receiver system was set to Peak Detect Function and Specified Bandwidth with Maximum Hold Mode.
- f. If the emission level of the EUT in peak mode was 10 dB lower than the limit specified, then testing could be stopped and the peak values of the EUT would be reported. Otherwise the emissions that did not have 10 dB margin would be re-tested one by one using the quasi-peak method or average method as specified and then reported in Data sheet peak mode and QP mode.

**NOTE:**

1. The resolution bandwidth and video bandwidth of test receiver/spectrum analyzer is 120kHz for Peak detection (PK) and Quasi-peak detection (QP) at frequency below 1GHz.
2. The resolution bandwidth and video bandwidth of test receiver/spectrum analyzer is 1 MHz for Peak detection at frequency above 1GHz.
3. The resolution bandwidth of test receiver/spectrum analyzer is 1 MHz and the video bandwidth is 300 Hz for Average detection (AV) at frequency above 1GHz.

#### 4.2.5 EUT OPERATING CONDITION

- Connected the receiver part of EUT with a computer system on the testing table.
- Set the transmitter and receiver at the same channel.
- Set the transmitter part of EUT under transmission condition continuously at specific channel frequency.
- The computer system sent "H" messages to Color Monitor and Monitor displayed "H" patterns on its screen.
- The computer system sent "H" messages to modem.
- The computer system sent "H" messages to printer, and the printer prints them on paper.
