
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




Test Configuration: Above 1GHz

For this product which is designed to be connected to the AC power line, the radio frequency voltage that is conducted back onto the AC power line on any frequency or frequencies within the band 150 kHz to 30 MHz shall not exceed below limits table.

4.1.3. Test Procedures


- Configure the EUT according to ANSI C63.4. The EUT or host of EUT has to be placed 0.4 meter far
 from the conducting wall of the shielding room and at least 80 centimeters from any other
 grounded conducting surface.
- 2. Connect EUT or host of EUT to the power mains through a line impedance stabilization network (LISN).
- 3. All the support units are connected to the other LISNs. The LISN should provide 50uH/50ohms coupling impedance.
- 4. The frequency range from 150 KHz to 30 MHz was searched.
- 5. Set the test-receiver system to Peak Detect Function and Specified Bandwidth with Maximum Hold Mode.
- 6. The measurement has to be done between each power line and ground at the power terminal.

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4.1.4. Test Setup Layout



LEGEND:

- (1) Interconnecting cables that hang closer than 40 cm to the ground plane shall be folded back and forth in the center forming a bundle 30 to 40 cm long.
- (2) I/O cables that are not connected to a peripheral shall be bundled in the center. The end of the cable may be terminated, if required, using the correct terminating impedance. The overall length shall not exceed 1 m.
- (3) EUT connected to one LISN. Unused LISN measuring port connectors shall be terminated in 50 Ω . LISN can be placed on top of, or immediately beneath, reference ground plane.
- (3.1) All other equipment powered from additional LISN(s).
- (3.2) Multiple outlet strip can be used for multiple power cords of non-EUT equipment.
- (3.3) LISN at least 80 cm from nearest part of EUT chassis.
- (4) Cables of hand-operated devices, such as keyboards, mice, etc., shall be placed as for normal use.
- (5) Non-EUT components of EUT system being tested.
- (6) Rear of EUT, including peripherals, shall all be aligned and flush with rear of tabletop.
- (7) Rear of tabletop shall be 40 cm removed from a vertical conducting plane that is bonded to the ground plane.





4.2. Maximum Peak Output Power Measurement

4.2.1. Limit

For systems using digital modulation in the 2400-2483.5MHz, the limit for peak output power is 30dBm. The limited has to be reduced by the amount in dB that the gain of the antenna exceed 6dBi. In case of point-to-point operation, the limit has to be reduced by 1dB for every 3dB that the directional gain of the antenna exceeds 6dBi.





- 2. Set RBW of spectrum analyzer to 3kHz and VBW to 30kHz. Set Detector to Peak, Trace to Max Hold.
- 3. Mark the frequency with maximum peak power as the center of the display of the spectrum.
- 4. Set the span to 30kHz and the sweep time to 10s and record the maximum peak value.



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


Power Density Plot / 2405 MHz


Power Density Plot / 2441 MHz


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Power Density Plot / 2477 MHz



- 2. The resolution bandwidth of 100 kHz and the video bandwidth of 100 kHz were used.
- 3. Measured the spectrum width with power higher than 6dB below carrier.



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


6 dB Bandwidth Plot / 2405 MHz


6 dB Bandwidth Plot / 2441 MHz


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4.5.3. Test Procedures

Configure the EUT according to ANSI C63.4. The EUT was placed on the top of the turntable 0.8
meter above ground. The phase center of the receiving antenna mounted on the top of a
height-variable antenna tower was placed 3 meters far away from the turntable.

- 2. Power on the EUT and all the supporting units. The turntable was rotated by 360 degrees to determine the position of the highest radiation.
- 3. The height of the broadband receiving antenna was varied between one meter and four meters above ground to find the maximum emissions field strength of both horizontal and vertical polarization.
- 4. For each suspected emissions, the antenna tower was scan (from 1 M to 4 M) and then the turntable was rotated (from 0 degree to 360 degrees) to find the maximum reading.
- 5. Set the test-receiver system to Peak or CISPR quasi-peak Detect Function with specified bandwidth under Maximum Hold Mode.
- 6. For emissions above 1GHz, use 1MHz VBW and RBW for peak reading. Then 1MHz RBW and 10Hz VBW for average reading in spectrum analyzer.
- 7. When the radiated emissions limits are expressed in terms of the average value of the emissions, and pulsed operation is employed, the measurement field strength shall be determined by averaging over one complete pulse train, including blanking intervals, as long as the pulse train does not exceed 0.1 seconds. As an alternative (provided the transmitter operates for longer than 0.1 seconds) or in cases where the pulse train exceeds 0.1 seconds, the measured field strength shall be determined from the average absolute voltage during a 0.1 second interval during which the field strength is at its maximum value.
- 8. If the emissions level of the EUT in peak mode was 3 dB lower than the average limit specified, then testing will be stopped and peak values of EUT will be reported, otherwise, the emissions which do not have 3 dB margin will be repeated one by one using the quasi-peak method for below 1GHz.
- 9. For testing above 1GHz, the emissions level of the EUT in peak mode was lower than average limit (that means the emissions level in peak mode also complies with the limit in average mode), then testing will be stopped and peak values of EUT will be reported, otherwise, the emissions will be measured in average mode again and reported.
- 10. In case the emission is lower than 30MHz, loop antenna has to be used for measurement and the recorded data should be QP measured by receiver. High Low scan is not required in this case.


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







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


For Emission not in Restricted Band Low Band Edge Plot / 2405 MHz

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4.7. Antenna Requirements

4.7.1. Limit

Except for special regulations, the Low-power Radio-frequency Devices must not be equipped with any jacket for installing an antenna with extension cable. An intentional radiator shall be designed to ensure that no antenna other than that furnished by the responsible party shall be used with the device. The use of a permanently attached antenna or of an antenna that uses a unique coupling to the intentional radiator shall be considered sufficient to comply with the provisions of this Section. The manufacturer may design the unit so that the user can replace a broken antenna, but the use of a standard antenna jack or electrical connector is prohibited. Further, this requirement does not apply to intentional radiators that must be professionally installed.
