After a review of the submitted information, I have a few comments on the above referenced Application.

Administrative Issues:

- 1) No cover letters (i.e. request for confidentiality) appear to be provided. Please confirm if confidentiality is required and provide the appropriate letter if necessary.
- FYI.....This application does not require a BOM, and this exhibit is therefore not being reviewed or forwarded to the FCC.

Technical Issues:

- 3) It appears that a bandpass filter or similar was used during radiated testing. Please explain. If a filter was used, please provide calibration information regarding the fundamental rejections, rolloff, tyical insertion loss, harmonic rejections, etc. of the filter. How was this taken into consideration during the test. Many readings appear to be taken around 2500 MHz. It is uncertain how the filter behaves between 2483.5 and 2500 MHz as well as for harmonics. Please provide information.
- 4) It appear that adequate bandedge testing for simultaneous transmission may not have been provided. Please review/explain and/or provide additional data as necessary. For example, review of page 103 does not clearly define the results between 2483.5 and 2500 MHz which is located in a restricted band. This area should have been zoomed in on to clearly show the results.
