# EXHIBIT 1 GENERAL DESCRIPTION

## 1.0 **General Description**

### 1.1 Product Description

This Equipment Under Test (EUT) is an audio wireless speaker for it associated transmitter. The main function of the EUT is used to receive the modulated signal that transmitting by its corresponding transmitter. The operational frequency range is Channel 1 – 912.4MHz, Channel 2 – 913.0MHz and Channel 3 – 913.6MHz.

It is powered by an AC/DC adaptor (Model: KSAD1800070W1US, Input: 100-240VAC, Output: 18VDC 0.7A) or 8 x size C rechargeable batteries. The power indicator (red LED) in front of the EUT's body will be lighted while the power switch was on. A MONO/STEREO switch that is located at the back of the unit is used for set mono/stereo mode, a Tuning knob which is located at the front of the body is used for adjust the volume/power on. The unit can be set to mono or stereo mode, the monaural mode (MONO) is recommended when using a single speaker. An additional speaker in order to utilize the stereo option is needed, set the left/mono/right switch to "L" on the speaker located to the left from the listener, and set the other speaker to the "R" position.

Antenna Type: Internal, Integral

## 1.2 Related Submittal(s) Grants

The Certification procedure of transmitter for this receiver (with FCC ID: NOY-AW872TX) is being processed as the same time of this application.

## 1.3 Test Methodology

Both AC mains line-conducted and radiated emission measurements were performed according to the procedures in ANSI C63.4 (2003). Radiated Emission measurement was performed in Open Area Test Sites and Conducted Emission was performed in Shield Room. Preliminary scans were performed in the Open Area Test Sites only to determine worst case modes. For each scan, the procedure for maximizing emissions in Appendices D and E were followed. All Radiated tests were performed at an antenna to EUT distance of 3 meters, unless stated otherwise in the "Justification Section" of this Application.

## 1.4 Test Facility

The open area test site and conducted measurement facility used to collect the radiated data is located at Garment Centre, 576 Castle Peak Road, Kowloon, Hong Kong. This test facility and site measurement data have been fully placed on file with the FCC.

# EXHIBIT 2 SYSTEM TEST CONFIGURATION

## 2.0 **System Test Configuration**

### 2.1 Justification

The system was configured for testing in a typical fashion (as a customer would normally use it), and in the confines as outlined in ANSI C63.4 (2003).

The EUT was powered by an AC/DC adaptor (Model: KSAD1800070WIUS, Input: 100-240VAC, Output: 18VDC 0.7A) or 8 x size C size rechargeable batteries.

For maximizing emissions, the EUT was rotated through 360°, the antenna height was varied from 1 meter to 4 meters above the ground plane, and the antenna polarization was changed. The step by step procedure for maximizing emissions led to the data reported in Exhibit 3.0.

The rear of unit shall be flushed with the rear of the table.

The equipment under test (EUT) was configured for testing in a typical fashion (as a customer would normally use it). The EUT was placed on turntable, which enabled the engineer to maximize emissions through its placement in the three orthogonal axes.

For simplicity of testing, the unit was operated to receive continuously.

### 2.2 EUT Exercising Software

There was no special software to exercise the device. Once the unit is powered up, it receives the RF signal continuously.

## 2.3 Special Accessories

There are no special accessories necessary for compliance of this product.

## 2.4 Equipment Modification

Any modifications installed previous to testing by Atom Industrial Limited will be incorporated in each production model sold / leased in the United States.

No modifications were installed by Intertek Testing Services Hong Kong Ltd.

## 2.5 Measurement Uncertainty

When determining the test conclusion, the Measurement Uncertainty of test has been considered.

## **EMISSION RESULTS**

## 3.0 **Emission Results**

Data is included worst case configuration (the configuration which resulted in the highest emission levels). A sample calculation, configuration photographs and data tables of the emissions are included.

## 3.1 Field Strength Calculation

The field strength is calculated by adding the reading on the Spectrum Analyzer to the factors associated with preamplifiers (if any), antennas, cables, pulse desensitization and average factors (when specified limit is in average and measurements are made with peak detectors). A sample calculation is included below.

$$FS = RA + AF + CF - AG + PD + AV$$

where FS = Field Strength in  $dB\mu V/m$ 

RA = Receiver Amplitude (including preamplifier) in  $dB\mu V$ 

CF = Cable Attenuation Factor in dB

AF = Antenna Factor in dB AG = Amplifier Gain in dB

PD = Pulse Desensitization in dB

AV = Average Factor in -dB

In the radiated emission table which follows, the reading shown on the data table may reflect the preamplifier gain. An example of the calculations, where the reading does not reflect the preamplifier gain, follows:

$$FS = RA + AF + CF - AG + PD + AV$$

## 3.1 Field Strength Calculation (cont'd)

## **Example**

Assume a receiver reading of  $62.0 dB_{\mu}V$  is obtained. The antenna factor of 7.4dB and cable factor of 1.6dB is added. The amplifier gain of 29dB is subtracted. The pulse desensitization factor of the spectrum analyzer was 0dB, and the resultant average factor was -10 dB. The net field strength for comparison to the appropriate emission limit is  $32 dB_{\mu}V/m$ . This value in  $dB_{\mu}V/m$  was converted to its corresponding level in  $\mu V/m$ .

 $RA = 62.0dB\mu V$  AF = 7.4dB CF = 1.6dB

AG = 29.0dB

PD = 0dB

AV = -10dB

 $FS = 62 + 7.4 + 1.6 - 29 + 0 + (-10) = 32dB\mu V/m$ 

Level in  $\mu V/m$  = Common Antilogarithm [(32dB $\mu V/m$ )/20] = 39.8 $\mu V/m$

## 8.0 <u>Miscellaneous Information</u>

The miscellaneous information includes details of the test procedure.

## 8.1 Discussion of Pulse Desensitization

This device is a superheterodyne receiver. No desensitization of the measurement equipment is required as the received signals are continuously.

## 8.2 Calculation of Average Factor

This device is a superheterodyne receiver. It is not necessary to apply average factor to the measurement result.

### 8.3 Emissions Test Procedures

The following is a description of the test procedure used by Intertek Testing Services Hong Kong Ltd. in the measurements of superheterodyne receivers operating under Part 15, Subpart B rules.

The test set-up and procedures described below are designed to meet the requirements of ANSI C63.4 – 2003.

The equipment under test (EUT) is placed on a wooden turntable which is four feet in diameter and approximately one meter in height above the ground plane. During the radiated emissions test, the turntable is rotated and any cables leaving the EUT are manipulated to find the configuration resulting in maximum emissions. The EUT is adjusted through all three orthogonal axes to obtain maximum emission levels. The antenna height and polarization are varied during the testing to search for maximum signal levels. The height of the antenna is varied from one to four meters.

Detector function for radiated emissions is in peak mode. Average readings, when required, are taken by measuring the duty cycle of the equipment under test and subtracting the corresponding amount in dB from the measured peak readings.

The frequency range scanned is from the lowest radio frequency signal generated in the device which is greater than 9kHz to 5000MHz, whichever is lower. For line-conducted emissions, the range scanned is 150kHz to 30MHz.

## 8.3 Emissions Test Procedures (cont'd)

The EUT is warmed up for 15 minutes prior to the test.

AC power to the unit is varied from 85% to 115% nominal and variation in the fundamental emission field strength is recorded. If battery powered, a new, fully charged battery is used.

Conducted measurements are made as described in ANSI C63.4 – 2003.

The IF bandwidth used for measurement of radiated signal strength was 100kHz or greater when frequency is below 1000MHz. Where pulsed transmissions of short enough pulse duration warrant, a greater bandwidth is selected according to the recommendations of Hewlett Packard Application Note 150-2.

Measurements are normally conducted at a measurement distance of three meters. However, to assure low enough noise floor in the forbidden bands and above 1GHz, signals are acquired at a distance of one meter of less. All measurements are extrapolated to three meters using inverse scaling, unless otherwise reported. Measurements taken at a closer distance are so marked.
