RF exposure requirements - FCC ID: NT8-14B4093KAFSW2 and FCC ID: NT8-14B4094KAFSW2

Dear Application Examiner,

The maximum measured power output is 0,703 mW (-1,53 dBm), the maximum antenna gain is 2 dBi = numeric gain 1,585 (see also FCC test report - Exhibit B)

The maximum permissable exposure is defined in 47 CFR 1.1310 with 1 mW/cm². The distance from the EUT's transmitting antenna where the exposure level reaches the maximum permitted level is calculated using the general equation:

$$S = P*G / 4\pi R^2$$

 $S_{max} = 1 \text{mW/cm}^2$, P = 0.703 mW, linear power gain relative to the isotropic radiator = 2,0 dBi = 1,585 (numeric gain), R = distance in cm

Solving for R, the $1\,\text{mW/cm}^2$ limit is reached in a distance of 0,298 cm to the transmitting antenna.

The module has to be integrated in a way that the minimum distance of 0,298 cm is ensured so a statement in the users manual is not necessary.
