I have a few comments on the above referenced Application.

- 1) It is uncertain what is meant in the users manual by "The communication cable shall be of commercially available filtered cable". If this is referring to a ferrite installed on the cable, please note that most types of standard cables do not normally contain a ferrite, as well as ferrites have characteristics based upon size, core spacing, material, etc. The FCC has generally required that the device either not require ferrites, is professionally installed with the ferrites and the ferrites are provided with the device to the installer (not end user), or the manufacturer must provide the cables with the device. It is uncertain how this can be done given the statements in the manual. Additionally it is uncertain if the reference to filtered cables has a different meaning, however test photographs appear to show ferrites on many of the I/O cables. Please review.
- 2) It is uncertain how 90.205(r) has been addressed in the new tune up procedure. Is the 31.2 dBm considered a maximum output power, or is the device cable of the +20%. Please explain.
