From Settings application:

- 4. Press Options and select Activate.
- 5. Select whether calls shall be diverted To voice mailbox or To other number.
- 6. Enter the phone number and press OK.
 - Press Find to go to your Contacts to select a number.

Note: If either If not answered or If not available is selected in step 3, then after step 6, select a Delay time from the list before calls will be diverted.

To change the call barrings password, press **Options** and select **Edit barrings passw**.. Enter the password furnished by your wireless service provider. Enter, then verify the new password.

NETWORK SETTINGS

When you are not in your home country or region, you may be able to use a network which you are not directly subscribed to. This is called roaming.





PHOTOLIGHT

Light up your subject before snapping a picture or recording a video clip. To turn on the Photolight,

To switch off Photolight, return to standby mode, then press and hold \fbox .

Battery fails to charge	Do not connect the Travel Charger until after the battery has been installed.
Display looks faded	Check the Brightness setting (see <i>Display Settings</i> on page 93).
Emergency calls cannot be made	Check that the antenna symbol Ψ is displayed - move to a coverage area and operate your phone when the antenna symbol appears.
Calls cannot be made or received	 Check to make sure the phone is switched on. If keypad is locked, press Unlock softkey, then press <i>x</i>. If phone is locked, enter lock code.
