

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2.2 Test methodology.

The test methodology used is based on the requirements of 47 CFR Part 15 (july 10, 2008), sections 15.31, 15.35, 15.209 and 15.223.

The test methods, which have been used, are based on ANSI C63.4: 2003.

Radiated emission tests above 30 MHz were performed at a measurement distance of 3 meters.

Radiated emission tests below 30 MHz were performed at a measurement distance of 3 meters. To calculate the field strength level from these results to the appropriate distance at which the limit is specified, the appropriate extrapolation factor is used.

The receivers are switching automatically to the right bandwidth in accordance with CISPR 16. This is implemented in the receiver. The antenna factors are programmed in the test receiver. The receiver automatically calculates the appropriate correction factor for the utilized antenna and also the appropriate antenna factor for the cable loss. The total correction is automatically added to the measured value.

2.3 Test facility.

The Federal Communications Commission and Industry Canada has reviewed the technical characteristics of the test facilities at TÜV Rheinland EPS B.V., located in Niekerk, 9822 TL Smidshornerweg 18, The Netherlands, and has found these test facilities to be in compliance with the requirements of 47 CFR Part 15, section 2.948 (10-1-06 edition).

The description of the test facilities has been filed at the Office of the Federal Communications Commission under registration number 90828. The facility has been added to the list of laboratories performing these test services for the public on a fee basis.

The description of the test facilities has been filed to Industry Canada under registration number 2932G-1. The facility has been added to the list of laboratories performing these test services for the public on a fee basis.

2.4 Test conditions.

Normal test conditions:

Temperature (*) : +15°C to +35°C Relative humidity(*) : 20 % to 75 %

Supply voltage : 12V battery (new full battery is used for testing)

Air pressure : 950 – 1050 hPa

*When is was impracticable to carry out the tests under these conditions, a note to this effect stating the ambient temperature and relative humidity during the tests are stated separately.

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3 System test configuration.

3.1 Justification.

The system was configured for testing in a typical fashion (as a customer would normally use it).

The justification and manipulation of cables and equipment in order to simulate a worst-case behavior of the test setup has been carried out as prescribed in ANSI C63.4: 2003.

3.2 EUT mode of operation.

The EUT has been tested while continuously transmitting. The intentional radiator tests (47 CFR Part 15 sections, 15.209 and 15.223) have been performed with a complete functioning EUT with a new battery as power supply.

3.3 Special accessories.

No special accessories are used and/or needed to achieve compliance.

3.4 Equipment modifications.

No modifications have been made to the equipment in order to achieve compliance.

The results of the radiated emission tests, carried out in accordance with 47 CFR Part 15 section 15.209 with the EUT operating on 6.78 MHz are depicted in Table 1.

Notes:

- 1. Field strength values of radiated emissions at frequencies not listed in the table above are more than 20 dB below the applicable limit.
- 2. Measurement uncertainty is ±5.0dB
- 3. The reported field strength values are the worst case values at the indicated frequency. The EUT was varied in three positions, the antenna was varied in horizontal and vertical orientations and also in height (between 1m and 4m).
- 4. A Quasi-peak detector was used with a resolution bandwidth of 120 kHz, except for frequencies above 960 MHz where an average detector was used.

The results of the radiated emission tests in the frequency range 0.009 - 30 MHz, carried out in accordance with 47 CFR Part 15 section 15.209 and 15.223 with the EUT operating in continuous transmit mode on 6.78 MHz, are depicted in Table 2a.

Notes:

- Calculated measurement results are obtained by using the 40 dB/decade extrapolation factor and the antenna factor and cable loss is included. For instance the corrected value for 6.79 MHz is calculated as: Measurement result + Antenna Factor + Cable loss – Extrapolation Factor => 23.1 dBuV + 19.6 dB + 1 dB – 40 dB = 3.7 dBuV/m.
- 2. Frequency range:
 - a. 9- 90 kHz Average detector used during measurements
 - b. 110-490 kHz Average detector used during measurements
 - c. 490 kHz 1705 kHz Quasi peak detector used during measurements
 - d. 1705 kHz 10 MHz Average detector used during measurements
 - e. 10 MHz 30 MHz Quasi peak detector used during measurements
- 3. A resolution bandwidth of 9kHz was used during testing
- 4. Field strength values of radiated emissions at frequencies in the frequency range 0.009 30 MHz not listed in Table 2a are more than 20 dB below the applicable limit.

The results of the radiated emission tests in the frequency range 0.009 – 30 MHz, carried out in accordance with 47 CFR Part 15 section 15.223 and 15.35 for peak emissions with the EUT operating in continuous transmit mode on 6.78 MHz, are depicted in Table 2b.

Notes:

- Calculated measurement results are obtained by using the 40 dB/decade extrapolation factor and the antenna factor and cable loss is included. For instance the corrected value for 6.79 MHz is calculated as: Measurement result + Antenna Factor + Cable loss – Extrapolation Factor => 34.1 dBuV + 19.6 dB + 1 dB – 40 dB = 14.7 dBuV/m.
- 2. A resolution bandwidth of 9kHz was used during testing
- 3. Field strength values of radiated emissions at frequencies in the frequency range 0.009 30 MHz not listed in Table 2b are more than 20 dB below the applicable limit
- 4. The EUT was varied in three positions, the loop antenna was varied in horizontal and vertical orientations and also around it's axis. The reported value is the worst case found at the reported frequency.
- 5. Measurement uncertainty is ±5.0dB


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5 Plot of the carrier bandwidth
