Dear Sir or Madam:

This letter is to serve as an attachment to the FCC Form 731 Equipment Authorization Application filed by Identec Solutions, Inc. ("Identec"). Identec is seeking authorization to manufacture and market within the United States a radio frequency mobile interrogator (I-CARD III) in a Type II PC Card format intended to communicate with remote tags.

We direct the Commission's attention to its recent approval of Identec's I-PORT3 fixed interrogator (FCC ID O2E-ILR-I-PORT3; 731 Confirmation Number EA294170). The I-CARD III will serve much the same function as the recently approved I-PORT3; however, unlike the I-PORT3, the I-CARD III will allow for mobile interrogation.

The entry of the I-PORT3 into the marketplace experienced significant delay, and Identec hopes to avoid similar delays with the I-CARD III. Should any questions arise with regard to the present application and the operation of the equipment described therein, we respectfully note that Mr. Stanley Lyles and Mr. Joe Dichoso of the OET staff may be qualified to answer such questions internally given their diligent work performed on the I-PORT3 application and their familiarity with the operation of that device.
