About this manual



▲ Safety

When riding your bicycle, do not stare at the computer for a long time. If you do not watch the road, you could hit an obstacle, which might cause you to lose control and fall.

Tools required

- + Screwdriver, Phillips type
- + Coin

Installation

Step 1: Install the Speed Sensor

Your NODE is not packed with a speed sensor. See your sensor packaging for sensor installation instructions.

Step 2: Attach the computer base

Attach to a handlebar

- + Insert the correct handlebar clamp (A) into the computer base (C) (Figure 1).
- Slide the head of the handlebar clamp to the end of the slot in the computer base.
- Insert the rubber pad (B) with logo into the back of the computer base (Figure 2).
- With the screw hole toward the back of the bike, wrap the handlebar clamp around the handlebar.
- Insert the screw and washer (G) and tighten with the screwdriver until the computer base no longer rotates on the handlebar (Figure 3). Do not overtighten.

Attach to a stem

- Insert the rubber pad (B) with logo into the back of the computer base (C) (Figure 4).




Figure 5. Base on stem.

- Position the computer base on the stem with the screw hole toward the back of the bike (Figure 5).
- + Secure the computer base to the stem using zip-ties (F).

Step 3: Install the battery




Figure 6. Battery Orientation **During Installation.**

- + Insert the supplied battery (D) with the '+' facing up or out (Figure 6).
- + Press the rubber o-ring (I) into the groove around the battery in the computer. (Figure 7)
- + Place the battery cover (H) over the battery with the slot facing upward.






Figure 8. Turn cover clockwise with coin.

- + Turn the cover clockwise with a coin. (Figure 8)
- + Slide the computer into the computer base (Figure 9) being careful not to press any buttons.

Step 4: Program the computer

4:1. Wake the computer:

Images and words appear on the screen, proceed to step 4.2 If the screen is blank, push any button on the computer

4:2. Select the language:

To change the language (choose English, Francais, Espanol, Deutsch), press T or B
To save the language and proceed to the next function, press s1


4:3. Select clock:

To change the type of clock (choose 12HR or 24HR), press s2
To save the clock and proceed to the next function, press s1


4:4. Set hours:

To change the hours, press T or B

To set the hours and proceed to minutes, press \$2

4:5. Set the minutes:

To change the minutes, press T or B

If desired, you can go back to the hours in the previous step by pressing s2

To save the SET CLOCK (time) and proceed to the next function, press s1

4:6. Set the wheel size:

To change the wheel size (choose from the wheel size menu), press T or B

To set a custom wheel size, see the Complete NODE Manual at Bontrager.com
To save the wheel and proceed to the next function, press st




4:7. Set units:

To change units (choose KM or MILES), press s2

To save the Units and proceed to the Odometer function, press s1

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4:8. Set odometer:

To skip this step and leave the value at 00000, press s1 and go to step 4:10

To change the highlighted number, press T or B

To select a value and proceed to the next digit, press s2

4:9. Repeat for each of the other four digits:

To change the highlighted number, press T or B

To select a value and proceed to the next digit, press \$2

If desired, you can go back to the first digit (and then the other digits) by pressing \$2

To save the odometer and proceed to the next process, press s1

4:10. Activate sensors:

Speed: spin the wheel

Cadence: rotate the crank arm

Heart rate: wear the chest strap


Power: rotate the crank arm (or, for a hub sensor, turn the wheel)

4:11. Wait for pairing to complete:

Note: the Node computer must be within 5 feet (1.5 meters) of the installed sensor(s).

4:12. Finish programming:

When the screen shows "Setup Complete," press s1 to save all your settings and switch to the Ride mode.

Force pair

If the NODE fails to pair with a sensor, you can force the pairing process:

In **RIDE** mode, hold s1 and s2 for three seconds (Figure 11) and activate sensors.

Step 5: Enjoy your ride

Starting a ride from sleep mode

Step 1: Connect sensors

Activate sensors

During the connecting process, the display shows CONNECTING SENSORS and the lower right corner of the display flashes the 'receiving' icon (Figure 12).

Step 2: Select new ride

- + To change the value (choose YES or NO), press s2 (Figure 13)
- + To select, press s1

Step 3: Enjoy your ride

Force connect

If your NODE did not connect correctly, you can "force connect," making the Node repeat the connecting procedure. In **RIDE** mode, hold so for three seconds and activate sensors (Figure 14).

Ending a ride

- + Hold T for 3 seconds






Figure 15. Choose YES or NO.

- + To change the value (choose YES or NO), press s2 (Figure 15)
- + To select press s1
