During the process of testing, the EUT was controlled via R\&S Digital Radio Communication tester (CMU200) to ensure max power transmission and proper modulation. This result contains output power and EIRP measurements for the EUT. In all cases, output power is within the specified limits.

### 4.1.2 Radiated Output Power

## TEST DESCRIPTION

This is the test for the maximum radiated power from the EUT.
Per rule Part 24.232(c) specifies, "Mobile/portable stations are limited to 2 watts e.i.r.p. Peak power" and 24.232(e) specifies that "Peak transmit power must be measured over any interval of continuous transmission using instrumentation calibrated in terms of an rms-equivalent voltage."
Per rule Part 22.913(a) specifies " The ERP of mobile transmitters and auxiliary test transmitters must not exceed 7 Watts."

## TEST PROCEDURE

1. EUT was placed on a 1.50 meter high non-conductive stand at a 3 meter test distance from the receive antenna. A receiving antenna was placed on the antenna mast 3 meters from the EUT for emission measurements. The height of receiving antenna is 1.50 m . Detected emissions were maximized at each frequency by rotating the EUT through $360^{\circ}$ and adjusting the receiving antenna polarization. The radiated emission measurements of all transmit frequencies in three channels (High, Middle, Low) were measured with peak detector.
2. A log-periodic antenna or double-ridged waveguide horn antenna shall be substituted in place of the EUT. The log-periodic antenna will be driven by a signal generator and the level will be adjusted till the same power value on the spectrum analyzer or receiver. The level of the spurious emissions can be calculated through the level of the signal generator, cable loss, the gain of the substitution antenna and the reading of the spectrum analyzer or receiver.
3. The EUT is then put into continuously transmitting mode at its maximum power level during the test. Set Test Receiver or Spectrum RBW $=1 \mathrm{MHz}, \mathrm{VBW}=3 \mathrm{MHz}$, And the maximum value of the receiver should be recorded as ( $\mathrm{P}_{\mathrm{r}}$ ).
4. The EUT shall be replaced by a substitution antenna. In the chamber, an substitution antenna for the frequency band of interest is placed at the reference point of the chamber. An RF Signal source for the frequency band of interest is connected to the substitution antenna with a cable that has been constructed to not interfere with the radiation pattern of the antenna. A power ( $\mathrm{P}_{\mathrm{Mea}}$ ) is applied to the input of the substitution antenna, and adjust the level of the signal generator output until the value of the receiver reach the
previously recorded $\left(P_{r}\right)$. The power of signal source $\left(P_{M e a}\right)$ is recorded. The test should be performed by rotating the test item and adjusting the receiving antenna polarization.
5. A amplifier should be connected to the Signal Source output port. And the cable should be connect between the Amplifier and the Substitution Antenna. 6. This value is EIRP since the measurement is calibrated using an antenna of known gain (2.15 dBi) and known input power.

### 4.2 Radiated Spurious Emssion

## TEST APPLICABLE

According to the TIA/EIA 603D:2010 and FCC Part 2.1033 test method, The Receiver or Spectrum was scanned from lowest frequency frequency generated within the equipment to the $10^{\text {th }}$ harmonic of the highest frequency generated within the equipment, which is the transmitted carrier that can be as high as 1910 MHz . The resolution bandwidth is set as outlined in Part 24.238, Part 22.917, RSS-132 §5.5 and RSS-133 §6.5. The spectrum is scanned with the mobile station transmitting at carrier frequencies that pertain to low, mid and high channels of PCS1900 and GSM850.

## TEST PROCEDURE

1. EUT was placed on a 1.50 meter high non-conductive stand at a 3 meter test distance from the receive antenna. A receiving antenna was placed on the antenna mast 3 meters from the EUT for emission measurements. The height of receiving antenna is 1.50 m . Detected emissions were maximized at each frequency by rotating the EUT through $360^{\circ}$ and adjusting the receiving antenna polarization. The radiated emission measurements of all transmit frequencies in three channels (High, Middle, Low) were measured with peak detector.
2. A log-periodic antenna or double-ridged waveguide horn antenna shall be substituted in place of the EUT. The log-periodic antenna will be driven by a signal generator and the level will be adjusted till the same power value on the spectrum analyzer or receiver. The level of the spurious emissions can be calculated through the level of the signal generator, cable loss, the gain of the substitution antenna and the reading of the spectrum analyzer or receiver.
3. The EUT is then put into continuously transmitting mode at its maximum power level during the test.Set Test Receiver or Spectrum RBW $=1 \mathrm{MHz}, \mathrm{VBW}=3 \mathrm{MHz}$, And the maximum value of the receiver should be recorded as ( $\mathrm{P}_{\mathrm{r}}$ ).
4. The EUT shall be replaced by a substitution antenna. In the chamber, an substitution antenna for the frequency band of interest is placed at the reference point of the chamber. An RF Signal source for the frequency band of interest is connected to the substitution antenna with a cable that has been constructed to not interfere with the radiation pattern of the antenna. A power ( $\mathrm{P}_{\mathrm{mea}}$ ) is applied to the input of the substitution antenna, and adjust the level of the signal generator output until the value of the receiver reach the previously recorded $\left(\mathrm{P}_{\mathrm{r}}\right)$. The power of signal source ( $\mathrm{P}_{\text {Mea }}$ ) is recorded. The test should be performed by rotating the test item and adjusting the receiving antenna polarization.
5. A amplifier should be connected to the Signal Source output port. And the cable should be connect between the Amplifier and the Substitution Antenna. ## TEST LIMITS

According to 24.238 and 22.917 specify that the power of any emission outside of the authorized operating frequency ranges must be attenuated below the transmitting power $(P)$ by a factor of at least $43+10 \log (P) d B$. The specification that emissions shall be attenuated below the transmitter power $(P)$ by at least $43+10 \log (P)$ dB , translates in the relevant power range ( 1 to 0.001 W ) to -13 dBm . At 1 W the specified minimum attenuation becomes 43 dB and relative to a $30 \mathrm{dBm}(1 \mathrm{~W})$ carrier becomes a limit of -13 dBm . At $0.001 \mathrm{~W}(0 \mathrm{dBm})$ the minimum attenuation is 13 dB , which again yields a limit of -13 dBm . In this way a translation of the specification from relative to absolute terms is carried out.

### 4.5 Spurious Emssion on Antenna Port

## TEST APPLICABLE

The following steps outline the procedure used to measure the conducted emissions from the EUT.

1. Determine frequency range for measurements: From CFR 2.1057 and RSS-GEN the spectrum should be investigated from the lowest radio frequency generated in the equipment up to at least the $10^{\text {th }}$ harmonic of the carrier frequency. For the equipment of PCS1900 band, this equates to a frequency range of 9 KHz to 20 GHz , data taken from 30 MHz to 20 GHz . For GSM850, this equates to a frequency range of 9 KHz to 9 GHz , data taken from 30 MHz to 9 GHz .
2. The sweep time is set automatically by instrument itself. That should be the optimal sweep time for the span and the RBW. If the sweep time is too short, that is sweep is too fast, the sweep result is not accurate; if the sweep time is too long, that is sweep is too low, some frequency components may be lost. The instrument will give an optimal sweep time according the selected span and RBW.
3. The procedure to get the conducted spurious emission is as follows:

The trace mode is set to MaxHold to get the highest signal at each frequency;
Wait 25 seconds;
Get the result.
4. Determine EUT transmit frequencies: below outlines the band edge frequencies pertinent to conducted emissions testing.

## TEST LIMIT

Part 24.238, Part 22.917 specify that the power of any emission outside of the authorized operating frequency ranges must be attenuated below the transmitting power $(P)$ by a factor of at least $43+10 \log (P) d B$.
The specification that emissions shall be attenuated below the transmitter power (P) by at least $43+10 \log (P)$ dB , translates in the relevant power range ( 1 to 0.001 W ) to -13 dBm . At 1 W the specified minimum attenuation becomes 43 dB and relative to a $30 \mathrm{dBm}(1 \mathrm{~W})$ carrier becomes a limit of -13 dBm . At $0.001 \mathrm{~W}(0 \mathrm{dBm})$ the minimum attenuation is 13 dB , which again yields a limit of -13 dBm . In this way a translation of the specification from relative to absolute terms is carried out.

### 4.6 Frequency Stability Test

## TEST APPLICABLE

1. According to FCC Part 2 Section 2.1055 (a)(1) and RSS-GEN, the frequency stability shall be measured with variation of ambient temperature from $-30^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ to $+50^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ centigrade.
2. According to FCC Part 2 Section 2.1055 (E) (2) and RSS-GEN, for battery powered equipment, the frequency stability shall be measured with reducing primary supply voltage to the battery operating end point, which is specified by the manufacture.
3. Vary primary supply voltage from 85 to 115 percent of the nominal value for other than hand carried voltage equipment and the end voltage point was 3.40 V .

## TEST PROCEDURE

In order to measure the carrier frequency under the condition of AFC lock, it is necessary to make measurements with the EUT in a "call mode". This is accomplished with the use of R\&S CMU200 DIGITAL RADIO COMMUNICATION TESTER.

1. Measure the carrier frequency at room temperature;
2. Subject the EUT to overnight soak at $-30^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$;
3. With the EUT, powered via nominal voltage, connected to the CMU200 and in a simulated call on middle channel of PCS 1900 and GSM850, measure the carrier frequency. These measurements should be made within 2 minutes of Powering up the EUT, to prevent significant self-warming;
4. Repeat the above measurements at $10^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ increments from $-30^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ to $+50^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$. Allow at least 0.5 hours at each temperature, unpowered, before making measurements;
5. Remeasure carrier frequency at room temperature with nominal voltage. Vary supply voltage from minimum voltage to maximum voltage, in 0.1 Volt increments remeasuring carrier frequency at each voltage. Pause at nominal voltage for 0.5 hours unpowered, to allow any self-heating to stabilize, before continuing;
6. Subject the EUT to overnight soak at $+50^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$;
7. With the EUT, powered via nominal voltage, connected to the CMU200 and in a simulated call on the centre channel, measure the carrier frequency. These measurements should be made within 2 minutes of Powering up the EUT, to prevent significant self-warming;
8. Repeat the above measurements at $10^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ increments from $+50^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ to $-30^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$. Allow at least 0.5 hours at each temperature, unpowered, before making measurements;
9. At all temperature levels hold the temperature to $+/-0.5^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ during the measurement procedure;

## For Hand carried battery powered equipment

According to the JTC standard the frequency stability of the carrier shall be accurate to within 0.1 ppm of the received frequency from the base station. This accuracy is sufficient to meet Sec. 24.235, Frequency Stability The frequency stability shall be sufficient to ensure that the fundamental emission stays within the authorized frequency block. As this transceiver is considered "Hand carried, battery powered equipment" Section $2.1055(\mathrm{~d})(2)$ applies. This requires that the lower voltage for frequency stability testing be specified by the manufacturer. This transceiver is specified to operate with an input voltage of between 3.40VDC and 4.20VDC, with a nominal voltage of 3.80 DC . Operation above or below these voltage limits is prohibited by transceiver software in order to prevent improper operation as well as to protect components from overstress. These voltages represent a tolerance of $-10 \%$ and $+12.5 \%$. For the purposes of measuring frequency stability these voltage limits are to be used.

## For equipment powered by primary supply voltage

According to the JTC standard the frequency stability of the carrier shall be accurate to within 0.1 ppm of the received frequency from the base station. This accuracy is sufficient to meet Sec. 24.235, Frequency Stability. The frequency stability shall be sufficient to ensure that the fundamental emission stays within the authorized frequency block. For this EUT section 2.1055 (d)(1) applies. This requires varying primary supply voltage from 85 to 115 percent of the nominal value for other than hand carried battery equipment.
