

Measurement Procedure:

- 1. Preliminary radiated measurements were performed to determine the frequencies where the significant emissions might be found. With the EUT at one set position and the measurement antenna at a set height (i.e. without maximizing), the radiated emissions were measured using a peak detector and automatically plotted.
 The broadband measuring antenna was positioned at a 3 meter distance from the EUT. This data was then automatically plotted.
 - 2. All significant broadband and narrowband signals found in the preliminary sweeps were then measured using a peak detector at a test distance of 3 meters. The measurements were made with a bilog antenna over the frequency range of 30MHz to 1GHz, and a double ridged waveguide antenna was used for frequencies above 1GHz.



Time Period and Procedure:

- 1. The carrier frequency of the transmitter and the individual oscillators is measured at room temperature (25° C to provide a reference).

- 4. Frequency measurements are made at 10°C interval up to room temperature. At least a period of one and one half-hour is provided to allow stabilization of the equipment at each temperature level.
- 5. Again the transmitter carrier frequency and the individual oscillators is measured at room temperature to begin measurement of the upper temperature levels.
- 6. Frequency measurements are at 10 intervals starting at -30° C up to $+60^{\circ}$ C allowing at least two hours at each temperature for stabilization. In all measurements the frequency is measured within three minutes after reapplying power to the transmitter.
- 7. The artificial load is mounted external to the temperature chamber.


