Getting to know Your phone.

- 1. MENU: used to enter the MENU facility and return to standby mode
- 2. SEND: Lets you place and receive calls
- 3. CLS: Allows you to clear characters from the screen
 - To erase one character from the display screen, briefly press it once
 - To erase all of them, hold it down for one second
- 4. END: Lets you disconnection a call and backup menu levels
- 5. Message Key: Lets you access your voicemail or SMS box and read to your messages.
- 6. PWR: Turns the phone on and off
- 7. STO: used to confirm a setting in the menu facility and stored the number
- 8. i : emergency Key, you can store one number for emergency. It does operate when the Keyguard is activated
- 9. '**: used to scroll up through menu functions & allows you to select the type of character(upper-case, lower-case, symbol) while in edit functions

10.'#▼': used to scroll down through menu functions

Display indicators.

Different indicators are displayed based on the phone's operation mode.

- Indicates that your Phone is operating in digital mode. If this indicator is not displayed, either your phone is operating in analog mode or no service is available.
- Indicates that your Phone is operating in analog mode.
- Measures your current signal strength. More lines means more signal strength.
- This means the phone is outside service areas. When this is displayed, you cannot use your phone.
- Tells you a call is in progress.
- Rm If this indicator is not displayed, you are in the HOME Network. If it is displayed(it may or may not be flashing), you are on another service provider's network.
- r□ Indicates when you have SMS messaged waiting.
- Shows the level of your battery charge. The more black you see, the greater the charge.

Important Information for the battery.

- Tuse only batteries and chargers approved by the phone manufacturer.
- The battery can be charged and discharged many of times but it will eventually wear out.
- When the operating time is noticeably shorter than normal, it is time to buy a new battery.

Signal Strength Indication

- The higher the bar, the stronger the signal is where you are operating your phone.
- If the signal is poor and you are using the phone in a building, you may get better Reception near a window.

The Basics

1. To Switch your phone On and Off

To Switch your phone On

- Press and hold down the "END" key for more than 1 second. (Your phone number will appear on the display briefly and you will hear a beep.)
 - Then, a greeting, the day of the week, month, date and time will appear on the display.
 - Your phone allows you to change the greeting that appears on the display.

(For changing the greeting, see "Banner" (MENU + 2 + 2) in the menu.)

- __ If **Lock Mode** is activated, your phone will ask you to enter your security code.
- After you enter your security code, your phone will be in standby state. (The factory default code is 0000, and that is what your phone will accept until it is changed.)






2. To make a call

- Enter the phone number. Include the area code if necessary.
- __ Press the "SEND" Key.
- __ Then you can speak.
- When you want to hang up, press "END" key.

(When you press "END" key, call timer will remain on the screen for about 2 seconds.)



• You can adjust volume of earpiece with the two buttons on the side of your phone, the [Side-down] Key. (This feature is only available while in a conversation.)





3. To make a call by using stored numbers. (Speed dialing)

- __ If you plan on using this feature, you will need to store your most frequently-dialed numbers in memory locations 0 through 99.
 - For stored numbers in memory location 0 to 9, press the digit for more than 1 second, and for stored numbers in memory location 10 to 99, press the first digit briefly and then press the second digit for more than 1 second.

4. To answer a call

- __ The ring sounds.
- When you receive a call, you can press any other key on your phone to answer an incoming call, with the exception of the "END" key.



• Call timer will remain on the screen for about 2 seconds, then connected time will be appeared.

5. To mute your phone's microphone (MUTE)

- ___ This feature allows you to mute your phone's microphone while in a conversation.
- While using mute, you can still hear the caller's voice.
- Press the "MENU + 7 + 4" Key while in a conversation.
- __ To unmute your phone's microphone.
