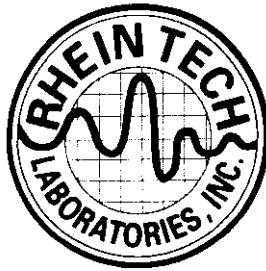

Dear Mr. Czumak:

I am writing to you in response to your letter, dated December 9, 1999, regarding the dismissal of the application for certification with the above reference.

We tried to upload to the FCC site on December 10, 1999 the required information to complete the application. However, we found that the application was dismissed. Per our client request, I sent an e-mail requesting your opinion on how to proceed with the aforementioned application with regards to SAR requirements. Specifically, our client wanted to know whether removing the microphone from the options/specifications list in the user's manual and providing a statement that the unit should not be carried next to the body, was acceptable by the Commission. Enclosed is a copy of the email, dated November 4, 1999. I did not receive a reply to this email and I know that you are very busy. Our client's objective was to minimize the uploading process to the FCC web site. He was willing to find a solution to meet the FCC regulations and he was trying to avoid additional costly SAR evaluation. He also understands the uncertainty budget and the problem in repeatability associated with such evaluation between the few test labs currently available.

I was wondering, in behalf of our client, if we could avoid to resubmit the application. Particularly, you specified that resubmitted applications are not given priority in processing.

You wrote:
 1. Body-worn operations is not approved unless SAR compliance can be demonstrated, therefore, the users manual and operator training instructions must be revised to indicate this device should not be carried next to the body when using certain accessories such as the proposed headset/microphone options. Please confirm."

Our client would like to know if you would accept the following (Note that we will upload the corrected user's manual +training material to the FCC website):

- remove the microphone from the options/specifications list in user's manual and training material.
- only the earpiece (listen) device will be provided as an option.
- provide statement that the unit should not be carried next to the body.
